CURRENT EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

CASINO PROJECT UPDATE

Representatives from the City and the Ho Chunk Nation attended the Rock County Board meeting this past Thursday evening, January 26, 2012. Council President Leavy introduced the delegation. Representatives from the Nation explained the Beloit Casino Project and the Tribe's role in acquiring the necessary approvals from the Bureau of Indian Affairs to take 32 acres of land into Trust for this project. The City Manager and City Attorney then made a presentation that was similar to an earlier discussion about the proposed Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA). The presentation was updated to articulate a number of changes in the IGA that come from continuing negotiations during the draft review process. County Board members asked a number of questions regarding the project, the IGA, and its possible impact on County government. No action was scheduled to be taken at the meeting and the County Board forwarded the matter to the appropriate committee for study and report.

As noted above, numerous changes have been made to the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) document over the last several weeks as negotiations have continued. Comments and questions raised by City Councilors and residents, as well as additional review by City officials and Tribal officials have resulted in several more modifications and clarifications of language. WATER RESOURCES CONDUCTS EMERGENCY EXERCISE

The Water Resources Division of Public Works, along with support from a number of other departments and agencies, conducted an emergency tabletop exercise this past week to continue preparedness planning for any potential emergency or disaster that might threaten the provision of quality utility services to the community. The scenario was interesting and relevant and resulted in many creative suggestions by relevant staff. Despite the positive input, problems were noted and additional training is anticipated.

SCHOOL DISTRICT FACILITY PLANS

The Beloit School District has informed City officials that facility planning efforts are underway as a prelude to the bond issue, which will be considered by voters at the April 3, 2012 local election. City officials have asked several questions about the site improvements and how those would impact adjacent streets and neighborhoods. There has also been substantial discussion with district officials about the alternate sites being considered to replace the current Morgan school location. This past week, we met with School District officials and representatives from Bray Architects and received yet another update on the planning status. An extensive discussion ensued regarding a number of the site plans, and input was provided not only by our planning staff, but also by our Transit Director, since bus service to each of these facilities will be an important component of the facility planning process. To date, City officials have been impressed with the level of detail and thought that has gone into the facility planning process, not only in terms of creating new, far more functional building footprints, but also providing the necessary parking and drop-off lanes to mitigate some of the congestion and on-street backups that currently plague many of the district's older school facilities.

CITY MANAGER TRAVEL AND VACATION PLANS

Because of the time required for travel, I opted to participate in the Urban Alliance meeting via conference call. The Urban Alliance is a fairly new organization that was created following the merger of the League of Wisconsin Municipalities and the old Wisconsin Alliance of Cities organization. The Urban Alliance represents larger urban places located within the State and often discusses public policy issues and legislative initiatives of significance to communities of our size.

Next week, I have my winter vacation scheduled and will be out of the City beginning on Saturday, January 28 and returning on Sunday, February 4. I will have both my Blackberry and laptop available throughout the week and will be available for phone calls and e-mails, should the need arise.
