CLEAN SWEEP 2012 HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION THIS SATURDAY

The pickup in Beloit will be on **Saturday, April 28 from 8:00 a.m. to noon (RSVP required prior to event)**. On the preceding Friday, April 27, there will also be a drop off at the City of Evansville Public Works garage, should that prove to be a more convenient time or location. This is a great opportunity to get rid of household products that may contain mercury, solvents, or chemicals of any sort, along with pesticides, old fuel, and similar products.

The program was at Gaston School and we had a good turnout of City Councilors, local dignitaries, and school children. BUDGET PREPARATION

Budget preparation work has begun in earnest with the draft Strategic Plan for 2013. Although we just recently had the "official" announcement regarding the project, work has been underway for several months and preliminary designs are beginning to take shape. We will provide the community with additional information as the massive improvement project proceeds towards construction, which is currently scheduled to begin in 2015.

Absentee Voting for the Recall Primary Election Available in the City Clerk's Office Starting April 23, 2012

April 19, 2012 – Beloit, WI: Beginning Monday, April 23, 2012, City of Beloit electors may cast an absentee ballot in the City Clerk's office for the May 8, 2012 Recall Primary Election. Electors who are not registered to vote and those who need to change their names and/or addresses must bring <u>proof of residence</u> to register. Late registration and absentee voting will only be available in the City Clerk's office from **Monday, April 23 through Friday, May 4**. Please find the acceptable forms of proof of residence on the following page.

Photo identification or other proof of identity will **not** be required to obtain an absentee ballot or to obtain a regular ballot on Election Day at the polling place for the May 8, 2012 Election.

ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF PROOF OF RESIDENCE

One of the following is required to register to vote in the Clerk's office during the closed registration period or on Election Day at the Polling Place:

- A current and valid Wisconsin driver's license
- A current and valid Wisconsin identification card
- Any other Official ID Card or license issued by a Wisconsin Governmental body
- An ID card with your photo issued by an employer during the normal course of business (not including a business card)
- A real estate tax bill or receipt (for the current year or year before the election
- A residential lease which is effective for a period that includes Election Day
- A university, college, or technical college identification card (must include photo) together with a fee payment receipt issued to the cardholder by the university, college or technical college dated no earlier than 9 months before the date of the election at which the receipt is presented
- A utility bill for a period starting no earlier than 90 days before Election Day
- A bank statement or current pay check
- A government check or any other official document issued by a unit of government

NOTE: all of the above must contain a current and complete name, including both first and last name; and a current and complete residential address, including numbered street address, if any, and the name of the municipality. If the form has an expiration date, it must be valid on Election Day. **An individual may not register or vote without one of the above forms of proof of residence.**
