BUDGET PREPARATION

The proposal by Chief Liggett to add some services to the Fire Department's fee schedule will be reviewed at a <u>Special Council Meeting</u> scheduled for this coming **Monday, October 29, 2012 at 5:30 p.m. in the City Hall Forum.** Depending on the outcome of those discussions, an ordinance may be prepared for the November 5, 2012 agenda.

The series of resolutions needed to adopt all aspects of the 2013 Operating and Capital Budget, along with setting the tax levy and updating various schedules of fees for the coming year, will be included on the November 5, 2012 regular City Council agenda.

FALL TREE PLANTING REQUESTS DUE BY NEXT WEDNESDAY

The City of Beloit's Department of Public Works is now accepting requests from residents for terrace trees to be planted this fall. The terrace tree species selection will be determined by the City forestry Supervisor while taking into account the size of the terrace, presence of utilities and exotic invasive insects. Trees will be planted on a first-come, first-served basis. Public Works will accept requests through Wednesday, October 31, 2012. BOUNDARY LINE NEGOTIATIONS WITH TOWN OF TURTLE

The City Council had adopted a resolution paralleling language in a resolution adopted by the Town of Turtle Board, committing to enter into negotiations that will, hopefully, lead to a new long-term Boundary Agreement that will serve as a basis for the relationship between the City of Beloit and the Town of Turtle for many years into

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the future. Staff has been working on reviewing the existing agreement and various documents from an earlier renegotiation initiative, and preparing some proposed negotiating parameters for review with the City Council. We have scheduled a <u>Special Meeting</u> with a Closed Session for this coming Tuesday, October 30, 2012 at 6:30 p.m. for the purpose of discussing the upcoming negotiations with Council and reviewing those proposed negotiating positions and parameters that could be used during the negotiating process. The City and Town have already discussed a joint meeting of the governing boards to serve as a "get to know you" session and to also talk about shared service delivery opportunities as we have with other local governing boards and, of course, to serve as an introduction to the negotiating process. It is envisioned that the parties will have their respective negotiating team begin meetings soon thereafter to determine how a long term modification to the existing Boundary Agreement might be structured.

SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETINGS

This coming **Monday**, **October 29**, **2012 at 5:30 p.m**., the City has a <u>Special Meeting</u> scheduled in the City Hall Forum. Included on the agenda:

- 2. A report and discussion of proposal to expand Fire Department user fees for 2013. Fire Chief Liggett raised the issue of expanding fees for various types of departmental services at our budget workshop earlier this year. As noted above, there has been a good deal of research completed with regard to this issue and the Chief will be making a second presentation to the City Council at this meeting. If Council reacts favorably to the discussions, the necessary ordinance to implement the fees, along with adjustments to the fee resolution needed to authorize the exact charges, will be included on a subsequent Council agenda.
- 3. Discussion of a proposed ordinance to amend Section 1.04 of the Municipal Code related to residency requirements for certain city employees. This item was included on an earlier Council agenda following a workshop and was held over until the November 5, 2012 meeting for further study and consideration. The purpose for including this item on the Special Meeting is to provide an opportunity to give Councilors additional information and also get questions and comments from City Councilors regarding the proposed amendment. As noted previously, the purpose for the amendment was to provide some flexibility by being able to grant hardship waivers for certain office and administrative personnel that fall under the residency requirement. The city's management team, including all department directors and the division heads for the larger operations in the public safety and public works departments would not be eligible for a waiver and would be required to meet the occupancy requirements without exception.
- 4. The City Council will adjourn into closed session to review information related to various real estate negotiations. The City Manager has been involved in negotiations for an extended period of time and will soon be opening negotiations with another party. Both of these matters relate to various real estate negotiations and, once again, the City Manager will be briefing Councilors and receiving input and comments related to the negotiating process. If the negotiations are ultimately successful, the matter will appear on a regular Council agenda for Council consideration.
- This coming **Tuesday**, **October 30 at 6:30 p.m.** in the City Manager's Conference Room on the 4th Floor of City Hall, there will be a <u>Special City Council Meeting</u> as noted previously in the Beloit Report. As noted, this Special Meeting will be devoted to discussing various terms and parameters for the upcoming

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negotiations regarding the Town of Turtle **Boundary Agreement**. Council will not reconvene and there will be no other announcements following this session.

YARD WASTE REMINDER

Residents are reminded that raking leaves into the street is prohibited in the City of Beloit. Raking leaves into the street can cause the storm sewer to plug and cause flooding. Moving yard waste into the street is a violation of City of Beloit Ordinance 15.20, "Littering Prohibited: No person shall place yard waste on the streets, alleys, highway, public parks or other property of the City." Violators of this Ordinance are subject to tickets and fines.

October 16, 2012 – Beloit, WI: Any City of Beloit resident interested in running for a two-year term on the Beloit City Council may pick up a packet of information including nomination papers beginning **Monday, October 29, 2012.** The packets are available in the office of the City Clerk on the second floor of City Hall during normal business hours: Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

- There are seven members on the Council and three seats will be on the ballot.
- Candidates must file required forms with the City Clerk before forming a committee and raising funds.
- The first day to circulate nomination papers is **Saturday, December 1, 2012**.
- Between 200 and 400 valid signatures of City of Beloit residents must be submitted.
- Nomination papers and all forms must be completed and filed with the City Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 2, 2013.
- An informational session will be held in January for all candidates who have gained ballot access.
- The Spring Election will be held on **Tuesday, April 2, 2013**.
- Newly-elected Councilors will take office on Tuesday, April 16, 2013.
