- 1. The meeting was called to order at 7:08 p.m. in the Forum at Beloit City Hall.
- 2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE
- 3. SPECIAL ORDERS OF THE DAY/ANNOUNCEMENTS
 - a. Vice President Van De Bogart presented a Proclamation declaring March 21, 2012 as **Beloit March for Meals Day** to Jim Heidt, representing Beloit Meals on Wheels. File 7148
 - b. Police Chief Norm Jacobs presented the **Medal of Valor** to Beloit Police Officer Nathan Adams for his bravery in the line of duty for an officer-involved shooting incident on November 6, 2011.
- 4. PUBLIC HEARINGS none
- 5. CITIZENS' PARTICIPATION
 - a. City Manager Larry Arft indicated that the City Attorney's office is currently working on a proposed ordinance regarding backyard chickens, and that there is not a specific timeline for when the ordinance will be reviewed by the City Council.
 - b. Mary Hallock, 732 Hobart Avenue, spoke on behalf of an ordinance to allow Beloit city residents to have up to 4 backyard chickens.
 - c. Vivian Mitnick, Beloit College, said that she has had urban chickens since she was 8 years old living in California, and she is in favor of an ordinance to allow them in Beloit.
 - d. Mark Preuschl, 1266 McKinley Avenue, indicated that he is on the Parks, Recreation, and Conservation Advisory Commission, and he voted against the proposed signage to be located at the north end of Riverside Park. He is concerned that the sign is too large and is not open or inviting. He proposed an alternative and requested that the Council table the issue and re-examine the proposal.
 - e. Mike Zoril, 1756 Carlyle Road, said that the City Council should be neutral on the Beloit School District's referendum and allow the residents to decide. He also said the he supports an ordinance allowing backyard chickens because it would be a good learning opportunity for students.
 - f. Chuck Kincaid, 1611 Emerson Street, said that he believes a yes vote for the referendum is a yes vote for Beloit, and he urged the Council to show the public their support for the referendum.

6. CONSENT AGENDA

Councilor De Forest requested that items 6.f., 6.g., and 6.j. be removed from the Consent Agenda. Councilor Van De Bogart requested that item 6.b. be removed from the Consent Agenda. Councilor Haynes moved to adopt the Consent Agenda, which consists of items 6.a., 6.c., 6.d, 6.e., 6.h., 6.i., 6.k., 6.l., 6.m., and 6.n. Councilor Van De Bogart seconded, and the motion carried that the Consent Agenda, except items 6.b., 6.f., 6.g., and 6.j. be accepted, approved, adopted, or referred and acted upon as required by state and local codes by a vote of 7-0.

- a. The **Minutes** of the Special Meeting of March 1 and Regular Meeting of March 5, 2012 were approved.
- c. The resolution awarding **Public Works Contract C12-07**, Street Resurfacing, was adopted. File 8531

- d. The resolution authorizing Final Payment of **Public Works Contract C11-12**, Bushnell, College, Prospect Reconstruction, was adopted. File 8493
- e. The resolution authorizing Final Payment of **Public Works Contract C11-03**, State Street Reconstruction, was adopted. File 8406
- h. The resolution approving a Class "B" Beer and "Class C" Wine License for La Kebrada Restaurant Corp., located at 2648 Prairie Avenue, Eduardo Cobos, Agent, was adopted, File 8497
- i. The resolution approving a **Class "A" Beer License** for Tristar Beloit, LLC, d/b/a Star Quick Mart, located at 2158 Prairie Avenue, Narendra Patel, Agent, was adopted File 8497
- k. The resolution approving a **Change of Agent** for MF Oil, Inc., d/b/a Beloit Citgo, located at 1888 Shopiere Road, to Parvinder Singh, was adopted. File 8497
- I. The resolution approving a **Class "A" Beer License** for Profuel Seven, Inc., d/b/a Beloit Citgo, located at 1888 Shopiere Road, Parvinder Singh, Agent, was adopted. File 8497
- m. The resolution approving a **Retail License Transfer** of a Class "B" Beer and "Class C" Wine License for Nikki's Café of Beloit, LLC, Lloyd Smith, Agent, from 604 Pleasant Street, Suite 140 to 431 East Grand Avenue, was adopted. File 8497
- n. The resolution approving an Amendment to the Class "B" Beer and "Class B" Liquor License for Kline's Club 88, Inc., d/b/a Kline's Club 88 for an Outdoor Premises Extension, was adopted. File 8497
- b. City Engineer Mike Flesch presented a resolution awarding Public Works Contract C11-23, Riverbend Shoreline Stabilization and amending the 2012 Capital Improvement Budget. He said that the 2012 CIP needed to be amended because the project was not included in it. Councilor De Forest made a motion to adopt the resolution, and Councilor Luebke seconded. Councilor Van De Bogart said that this is a fully-funded project, and Mr. Flesch said the need for the project stems from the flood in 2008 and is funded through the Community Development Block Grant program. Councilor Spreitzer inquired about the aesthetics, and Mr. Flesch indicated that it would look similar to the seawall in the Mill Street parking lot. The motion carried 7-0. File 8514/8530
- f. Parks and Leisure Services Director Brian Ramsey presented a resolution awarding the Ground Maintenance Contract for the Cemeteries and the Milwaukee Road Business Corridor. Councilor Spreitzer moved to adopt the resolution, and Councilor Luebke seconded. Councilor De Forest asked if it is more cost-effective to contract this service instead of doing the work in-house, and Mr. Ramsey indicated that the City would have to hire additional full-time staff to perform the work so the contract will save money. The motion carried 7-0. File 8532
- g. Mr. Ramsey presented a resolution authorizing a Lease Agreement for Golf Carts at the Krueger Haskell Golf Course with Versatile Vehicles. He noted that this is a different low bidder than was outlined in the original resolution and staff report in the Council packet, and he provided the Council with a new resolution, staff report, and contract. Councilor Luebke made a motion to adopt the resolution authorizing the lease agreement with Versatile Vehicles, and Councilor Haynes seconded. Councilor De Forest asked about the savings associated with leasing the golf carts instead of buying them, and Mr. Ramsey indicated that the lease agreement includes maintenance on the carts. He said that the City does not have the staff or resources to provide this maintenance at this time. Councilor De Forest asked what would happen if we do not operate a golf course in the future, and Mr. Ramsey indicated that there is an opt-out clause in the contact in case that happens. Councilor De Forest asked if the City would be responsible for the carts of Versatile Vehicles went out of business, and City Attorney Tom Casper said that if Versatile went bankrupt, the City would take them to court. Attorney Casper also said that the company has been in business for 27 years. The motion carried 7-0. File 8533
- j. City Clerk Rebecca Houseman presented a resolution approving a Class "A" Beer License for Liberty Gas Inc., d/b/a Liberty Gas, located at 1407 Liberty Avenue, Gurcharan Singh, Agent. It was noted that the ABLCC recommended approval of the application by a vote of 7-0. Clerk Houseman noted that this is a new business, new agent, and new business owner in this location. She also noted that the City Council approved a Conditional Use Permit to allow alcohol sales in this location in October of 2011. Councilor Luebke made a motion to adopt the resolution, and Councilor Newnham seconded. Councilor Luebke said that the ABLCC voted to recommend approval unanimously and that the Police Department was satisfied with the application. Councilor Van De Bogart asked the property and business owner if he was aware of the problems at this property in the past, and Mr. Singh said that he previously leased the property to another individual but he is now in charge of the business and will be a better operator. Councilor De Forest asked if Mr. Singh is associated with the previous business owners, and he said that he is not. The motion carried 7-0. File 8497

8. APPOINTMENTS

President Leavy announced openings and submitted the following appointment to the City Committees, Boards, and Commissions for approval. The appointment was approved on a motion by Councilor Newnham and a second by Councilor Haynes. The motion carried 7-0.

a. **Community Development Authority:** Stephen F. Smith to a term expiring December 31, 2015. File 6054

9. COUNCILOR ACTIVITIES AND UPCOMING EVENTS

- a. Councilor De Forest said that she appreciates the resident input regarding several issues before the Council and encouraged people to continue to provide it.
- b. Councilor Van De Bogart said that he went to the Riverfront kickoff meeting and that it was nice to see all of the upcoming events. He also said that "Up" will be the movie played in Riverside Park.
- c. Councilor Luebke said that he saw the wonderful play at Beloit Memorial High School and congratulated everyone for a job well done. He said that the Chamber of Commerce dinner was wonderful and that he participated in a recent meeting with the Mexican Consulate. He also stated that the community is the school district, and the school district is the community.
- d. Councilor Newnham acknowledged the great turnout in the audience at the meeting and said that participation adds depth to the conversation.
- e. Councilor Spreitzer said that it is great to see so many people in the audience and that he attended the Riverfront and Chamber events.
- f. President Leavy congratulated and welcomed the students and superintendent of the school district in the audience.

10. CITY MANAGER'S PRESENTATION - none

11. REPORTS FROM BOARDS AND CITY OFFICERS

- a. Fire Chief Brad Liggett presented a resolution approving a **Contract** with the State of Wisconsin for Statewide Structural Collapse Team Members. He said that the City was part of the original collapse team and already has the trained personnel. He added that the City will be reimbursed for any additional training associated with membership. Councilor Luebke made a motion to adopt the resolution, and Councilor Haynes seconded. Councilor Van De Bogart asked if this was a way to subsidize some of the Fire Department's training expenses, and Chief Liggett agreed. Councilor De Forest asked who reimburses the City, and Chief Liggett said that the Department of Homeland Security reimburses through Wisconsin Emergency Management. File 8534
- b. City Manager Larry Arft presented a resolution approving improvements within Riverside Park located at 1160 Riverside Drive. It was noted that the Plan Commission recommended approval 6-0. He said the signage and improvements will identify the City Limits and the Park. Councilor Newnham made a motion to adopt the resolution, and Councilor Luebke seconded. Councilor Van De Bogart asked if they considered copying the entry feature on the south side of the park and about the cost and funding of the improvements. Mr. Arft said that the south side signage has similar elements. He said that the \$325,000 for the project was approved in the budget last year and it is being funded through TID #6 and private donations. Councilor De Forest said that she is glad to see the sign scaled down and that it is important that it be large enough to see from the road. She said that she does not like the new bike path going through this part of the park nor the landscaping around the entry feature. Councilor Haynes said that the aesthetics of the park are very important and it is difficult to disagree with someone he respects. Councilor Newnham said that Riverside Park is a source of pride for everyone in Beloit and that it is important to keep more green space in the park. Councilor Spreitzer said that there are several members of the community who are opposed to the entry feature and that he has difficulty understanding the diagrams showing the improvements. President Leavy said that the Council has seven different opinions because they are seven different people. He said that they may disagree, but they are not attacking people, they are just asking questions to get information and make the best decision possible. He said that people said that they disagreed with the Riverside Drive reconstruction project at first, but the public is really enjoying it now. He said that the public will enjoy the park when it is done as well. The motion carried 6-1, with Councilor De Forest voting in opposition. File 8067

- c. The Council deferred action on a resolution approving improvements within Wootton Park located at 1451 Fourth Street upon request of the City Manager until a date to be determined later. File 8067
- d. Manager Arft presented a resolution to support the 2012 School District of Beloit Referendum for Facility Improvements, which includes a \$70 million bond issue for infrastructure. He said that the Council does not normally take action on the business of another governing body, but this is an exception because the quality of the school system directly impacts the quality of life in the community. Councilor Luebke made a motion to adopt the resolution, and Councilor De Forest seconded. Councilor De Forest said she agreed that economic development is intertwined with the quality of the school district. She also pointed out that this is simply a resolution of support, and the Council supports other organizations' efforts often. Councilor Haynes said that an impediment to economic development has been the negative perception of the school district and that he is in favor of the referendum. Councilor Van De Bogart said that he supports the referendum as an individual and a City Council member. He said that the first two questions people ask when looking to locate in a community are about taxes and schools and that this is an investment in Beloit's future. Councilor Spreitzer said he will vote in favor of this and that the Council has an obligation to act on this item and lead the community. He said he will vote yes and encouraged residents to vote yes on April 3rd. Councilor Luebke said that we need to give the community's students every advantage possible and that the school district continues to make great strides. Councilor Newnham thanked the Beloit Daily News for its dedication to thoroughly covering the referendum for the public. He said, as separate governing jurisdictions, the Council should not be involved in the School District's business. President Leavy said that the Council is not interfering but lending support for a project of great magnitude. He said that parents always want things to be better for their children than it was for them and that some of the schools have not changed in 30 years. He said the Council and the City need to do all they can to support the school district because the students represent the City of Beloit. The motion passed 6-0, with Councilor Newnham abstaining. File 8535
- e. Manager Arft presented a resolution authorizing **Riverfest Relocation** from Riverside Park to the property owned by the City and known as Riverbend, located at 217 Shirland Avenue and 55 Water Street. Councilor Van De Bogart made a motion to adopt the resolution, and Councilor Luebke seconded. The motion carried 7-0. File 7779
- f. Manager Arft presented a resolution approving a Side Letter to the existing Collective Bargaining Agreement between the City of Beloit and American Federation of State, County, and Municipal employees (AFSCME) Local #643 Transit. Mr. Arft indicated that this is a follow-up to the fire union contract, which included compensation for the phased-in Wisconsin Retirement System (WRS) contribution. He said that there may be credibility issues in future transit negotiations if the proposed side letter, which provides the transit union workers with a three percent pay increase starting March 1, 2012, is not approved. Councilor Luebke made a motion to adopt the resolution, and Councilor Newnham seconded. Councilor Van De Bogart said that he does not think this is a good idea at this time because it creates a disparity among employees. He said that the Council should not attempt to undo all of the effects of Act 10 with their pocketbook because there is not enough to go around. He suggested that the item be laid over. Councilor De Forest said that credibility is important and that she appreciates how the transit union was the first union to negotiate. President Leavy questioned what would change if the Council laid this item over. Councilor Spreitzer said that he is in support of the idea, but that he does not see the point in approving this until the final union contract is approved. Councilor De Forest made a motion to lay this item over until the police union contract comes to the Council for action. Councilor Van De Bogart seconded. The motion carried 4-3 by a roll call vote with Councilors De Forest, Haynes, Van De Bogart, and Spreitzer voting in favor and Councilor Leavy, Luebke, and Newnham voting in opposition. File 6094
- 12. At 9:10 p.m., Councilor De Forest moved to adjourn the meeting, and Councilor Haynes seconded. The motion carried. 7-0.

Topic: Award of Construction Contract for C12-10, Mud Jacking

Date: April 2, 2012

Presenter(s): Mike Flesch, City Engineer

Department(s): Public Works/Engineering

Overview/Background Information:

This project will raise settled concrete curb and gutters, driveway aprons, and sidewalks in various locations citywide by mud jacking.

Key Issues (maximum of 5):

- 1. One (1) bid was received for this project. The low bid of \$ 40,700.00 was from Concrete Raising of Wisconsin and is 1.5% less than the engineer's estimate of \$ 41,300.00.
- 2. Concrete Raising of Wisconsin is considered a responsible bidder for this project.
- 3. The costs for this project are as follows: \$40,700.00 for construction, \$6,100.00 for Change Orders or extra work, for a total of \$46,800.00.
- 4. No properties will be special assessed for this project.

Conformance to Strategic Plan (List key goals this action would support and briefly discuss its impact on the City's mission.): 1. Develop a high quality community through the responsible stewardship and enhancement of City resources to further Relaid's accurate the Research Planet Plan

- to further Beloit's resurgence as a gem of the Rock River Valley.

Topic: Award of Farm Lease for Woodman Property

Date: April 2, 2012

Presenter(s): Mike Flesch, City Engineer

Department(s): Public Works/Engineering

Overview/Background Information:

This item is for the award of a farm lease for the Woodman property on the north side of Burton Street between Sun Valley Drive and Frederick Street. Leasing the property for farming will save approximately \$5,400 per year in mowing costs, and will generate rental income from the property of approximately \$3,185 to \$5,390 per year. The lease is set for a 5 year term to allow the Lessee to recover upfront costs such as tree clearing and soil modifications associated with initiating farming operations on land that has not been previously farmed.

An alternate proposal was received to maintain the land as grass, which would be bailed for the farmer's use. Please refer to the attached letter from Dan and Ashlea Hughes for details. The alternate proposal would not involve any monetary payments, so it can be handled administratively by the City Manager and would not need a Council Resolution. The benefit to the City is some cost savings in mowing expenses, and the benefit to the farmer is the use of the bailed grass. The City could still be responsible for mowing the terraces, depending on the details of the final agreement. This option would result in less potential for dust and debris during planting and harvest, while reducing the savings and income potential compared with the farming proposal.

Key Issues (maximum of 5):

- 1. Three (3) proposals were received for this farm lease. The high proposal of \$20,335.00 was from Joe Rebout of Janesville Wisconsin.
- 2. An alternate proposal was received from Dan and Ashlea Hughes of Janesville Wisconsin to mow the existing grass instead of farming the land.
- 3. The costs for the farm lease are as follows: \$20,335.00 in rental revenue over 5 years, approximately \$27,000.00 in savings to the mowing maintenance budget, for a total of \$47,335.00 net benefit to the City.
- 4. The costs for the alternate mowing proposal are as follows: approximately \$18,000.00 to \$27,000.00 in savings to the mowing maintenance budget net benefit to the City.

Conformance to Strategic Plan (List key goals this action would support and briefly discuss its impact on the City's mission.):

- As an eco-municipality, focus on the sustainable stewardship of City resources, services and infrastructure; to protect both our built and natural environment and enhance the quality of life for current and future generations.

Action required/Recommendation:

The Department of Public Works recommends awarding this Farm Lease to Joe Rebout for a total 5 year lease of \$20,335.00.

The alternate mowing proposal may be administratively negotiated by the City Manager by rejecting all farming proposals.

Fiscal Note/Budget Impact:

Awarding the Farm Lease will result in a net benefit to the City of Beloit of \$47,335.00. Rejecting all proposals and administratively negotiating an agreement to mow the property will result in a net benefit to the City of Beloit of approximately \$18,000.00 to \$27,000.00. Rejecting all proposals and continuing to maintain the property with City Forces will have no impact on the adopted budget.

WOODMAN PROPERTY

FARM LEASE

THIS LEASE is made this 2nd day of April, 2012, by and between the **City of Beloit**, a Wisconsin municipal corporation, with its principal place of business located at 100 State Street, Beloit, Wisconsin 53511 (hereinafter referred to as "**Lessor**"), and Joe Rebout and Erica Rebout, husband and wife, d/b/a Joe and Erica Rebout Farms, 6740 West Hanover Road, Janesville, Wisconsin 53548 (hereinafter referred to as "**Lessee**").

1. **Leased Premises:** Lessor hereby leases to Lessee the properties described on Exhibit A (map) which is attached hereto. The leased premises consist of approximately 24.5 tillable acres of farmland. There are no buildings on the leased premises as shown on Exhibit A. Lessee acknowledges that Lessee has had ample opportunity to inspect the leased premises and is satisfied with the amount of tillable acres and agrees that lease payments will be calculated based on a lease of 24.5 acres.

2. <u>Term</u>: This Lease shall commence upon the date of execution hereof and end on December 31, 2016.

3. <u>Rent</u>: The Lessee shall pay to the Lessor as rent for the leased premises described above the sum of \$20,335.00 payable at the Office of the City Treasurer, City Hall (Attn: Finance), 100 State Street, Beloit, Wisconsin, as follows:

\$3,185.00 on or before Friday, May 18, 2012; and \$3,185.00 on or before Friday, May 17, 2013; and \$3,920.00 on or before Friday, May 16, 2014; and \$2,327.50 on or before Friday, May 15, 2015; and \$2,327.50 on or before Friday, November 20, 2015; and \$2,695.00 on or before Friday, May 20, 2016; and \$2,695.00 on or before Friday, November 18, 2016. 4. **Rent Abatement:** Lessor shall have the right to sell any portion of the leased premises during the term of this Lease, and upon closing of such sale, this Lease shall automatically terminate with respect to that portion of the leased premises that is sold. Lessee hereby permits the Lessor and any prospective buyer or their agents or designees of the leased premises to enter upon the same for the purpose of conducting soil borings and/or surveying the leased premises; provided that buyer gives Lessee five days' notice of buyer's intent to enter thereon. Neither Lessor nor the prospective buyer shall be liable for any crop damage resulting from soil borings or surveying activities; provided that such damage is kept to the minimum amount necessary to accomplish the same. If Lessor sells any portion of the leased premises during the term of this Lease, Lessor shall require the buyer, as a condition of sale, to either:

- (a) Permit Lessee to harvest the crops during the term of this Lease; or
- (b) Pay Lessee for any crops damaged by buyer upon such terms and conditions the Lessee and buyer shall agree.

5. <u>Condition of Premises</u>: Lessee has examined the leased premises and knows the condition thereof. No representations have been made to Lessee by Lessor regarding the condition of the leased premises, and Lessor shall not make any improvements to the leased premises or perform any maintenance on the leased premises. Lessee shall perform maintenance as required to comply with local ordinances, including maintenance of sidewalks and terrace areas adjacent to the leased premises. Such maintenance will include, but is not limited to: mowing grass terrace areas, snow removal from any adjacent sidewalks, repair or replacement of sidewalks damaged by farming operations, and removal of litter and other debris from the property. Lessee may make limited improvements, at the Lessee's expense, to the suitability of the leased premises for the purposes of growing crops. Such improvements can be, but are not

limited to: removal of trees and weeds, application of commercial fertilizers, herbicides, insecticides, or any other product in the planting of all crops in a manner, quality and quantity consistent with all applicable laws, ordinances, regulations, and manufacturer's specifications.

6. **Permitted Uses:** The leased premises shall be used solely for the purpose of growing crops. **Lessee** agrees that it will not permit any hazardous substance or hazardous materials to be discharged upon the leased premises and will not commit waste upon the leased premises.

7. <u>Indemnification</u>: The Lessee shall indemnify and hold the City, its officers, agents and employees harmless from any and all claims, including claims for damages to property, personal injury, consequential and incidental damages, loss of income or revenue, costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of any acts or omissions of the Lessee, its employees, agents and subcontractors during the performance of this Lease.

8. <u>Sublease and Assignment Prohibited</u>: Lessee may not assign this Lease or sublet the leased premises without the written consent of the Lessor.

9. <u>Best Management Practices</u>: Lessee agrees to follow the Soil Conservation Plan for the land or otherwise engage in such soil conservation and soil improvement practices that shall comply with any and all government regulations, rules, and requirements.

10. <u>Insurance - Certificate of Insurance</u>: Lessee shall, at Lessee's expense, procure the following insurance policies from insurance companies licensed to do business in the State of Wisconsin, in amounts and coverages not less than hereinafter set forth:

(a) <u>General Liability Insurance</u>:

(1) Each Occurrence Limit \$1,000,000.00

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(b) <u>Automobile Liability Insurance</u>: The Lessee shall provide Automobile Liability insurance covering all vehicles used by Lessee in the amount of \$500,000.00.

Lessee shall provide Lessor with a certificate of insurance and shall name Lessor as an additional insured. The certificate shall name the Lessor as certificate holder and shall unequivocally provide that the policies of insurance shall not be canceled or altered without sixty (60) days prior written notice to Lessor. Said certificate shall be provided to Lessor at the time of execution hereof and further certificates shall be provided immediately upon expiration of any policy or policies subject to the initial certificate.

11. <u>**Removal of Crops:**</u> Lessee shall remove all crops from the leased premises prior to the expiration of this Lease. Any crops or equipment remaining on the leased premises at the time of expiration of this Lease shall be deemed abandoned and become the property of the Lessor.

12. <u>Storage of Farm Equipment</u>: Lessee shall not store farm equipment or other moveable property on the leased premises at any time. However, during the planting and harvesting seasons, farm equipment may be kept on the leased premises overnight, but only while the Lessee is actively engaged in planting or harvesting.

13. <u>Hunting Prohibited</u>: Neither party shall permit any person to enter the leased premises for the purpose of hunting, shooting or capturing any wild animals during the term of this Lease. Lessee may, as Lessor's agent, post "No Hunting" signs on the property.

14. **Default:** If **Lessee** commits waste, fails to repair damage to adjacent terraces or sidewalks, or stores any farm equipment or moveable property upon the leased premises in violation of this Lease, **Lessor** shall give **Lessee** five (5) days' notice to cure **Lessee's** default.

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If **Lessee** does not cure the default within five (5) days, **Lessee** shall pay to **Lessor** a penalty of \$100.00 per day for each day that **Lessee** continues to commit waste, fails to repair damage, or continues to store equipment or moveable property on the leased premises in violation of this Lease.

15. <u>Access To Property</u>: Lessee shall access the leased premises from the north end of Fir Drive adjacent to the leased premises on Burton Street. Any damage resulting from farming operations to terrace areas or sidewalks adjacent to the premises shall be restored by the Lessee within 15 calendar days.

16. <u>Affirmative Action</u>: Lessee agrees to adopt an affirmative action plan to increase in its partners, associates, and employees members of under-represented groups in all of its departments, job classifications, and salary categories. In the event that Lessee subcontracts any portion of this Lease, Lessee will include, in its subcontracts, a requirement that its subcontractors adopt an affirmative action plan. Lessee will also include a requirement that its subcontractors include a similar requirement in their contracts with their subcontractors. This provision is inserted herein in compliance with Section 1.09 of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit, and shall be interpreted so as to carry out the intent of that ordinance.

17. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>: Lessee will not discriminate against any qualified employee or qualified applicant for employment because of race, color, national origin, ancestry, religion, age, marital status, disability, sex, or sexual orientation. In the event any portion of this Lease is subcontracted by Lessee, Lessee shall include in such subcontract, a provision prohibiting the subcontractor from discriminating against any qualified employee or qualified applicant for employment because of race, color, national origin, ancestry, religion, age, marital status, disability, sex, or sexual orientation. This provision is inserted herein in compliance with Section 1.09 of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit, and shall be interpreted so as to carry out the intent of said ordinance.

18. <u>Amendments</u>: This Lease may be amended only by written mutual agreement of the Lessor and Lessee.

19. <u>Notices</u>: Notices to the parties to this Lease shall be as follows:
