## 6. ORDINANCES

a. Proposed Ordinance amending the **Zoning District Map** to change the Zoning District Classification from C-1, Office District, to C-2, Neighborhood Commercial District, for the property located at 412 Liberty Avenue was given second reading. It was noted that Plan Commission recommended approval 3-2. Community Development Director Julie Christensen presented the staff report and recommendation from the Plan Commission. She said that the proposed change would make it consistent with the Comprehensive Plan and noted that two plan commissioners voted no because of concerns for alcohol use. Councilor Johns moved to enact, Councilor Densch seconded, and the motion carried 5-1 with Councilor De Forest voting in opposition. File 8489 Ordinance 3440

- a. Councilor De Forest said that she attended and enjoyed the Beloit/Janesville Chamber Orchestra. She attended the resident meeting at Parker Bluff discussing the Public Housing Rehab, and she said that the Public Housing Authority Director Cathy Pollard did an excellent presentation to the residents. She attended the School Board Candidates' Forum and reminded citizens that another Candidates' Forum would be held on March 22 at 6:30 p.m. She reminded the public that the Section 8 would be reopened on April 4, and she urged all those qualified to apply.
- b. Councilor Densch also announced that the League of Women's Voters Candidates' Forum would be held in the City Hall Forum on March 22 and encouraged all to attend.
- c. Councilor Haynes said that he attended the Rise and Shine at Rotary Riverfront which is a precursor to their Bloom Event in April.
- d. Councilor Johns congratulated the Beloit Memorial High School basketball team for an outstanding season, said that several great teams participated in Destination Imagination, congratulated the cast and crew of Beloit Memorial High School production of "Hairspray", attended the Rise and Shine breakfast and was looking forward to the great season. She said that she attended the open session with parks and leisure services and said it was great to hear feedback from area residents. She also attended the Vets Roll Casino night.

## Overview/Background Information:

This project reconstructed the 4th Street parking lot and added an entrance to the 3rd Street parking lot. It added new curbing and lighting, signage and landscaping. New payement and payement marking was also included.

1. The requirements of the contract have been completed to the satisfaction of the City.

2. The awarded contract amount was \$ 168,456.96 Quantity increases and change orders \$ 11,214.44

Net payment due contractor \$ 179,671.40

3. The City Engineer, City Attorney, and Director of Accounting recommend that a final payment be made to Rock Road Companies, Inc. in the amount of \$16,301.57

Conformance to Strategic Plan (List key goals this action would support and briefly discuss its impact on the City's mission.):

- Develop a high quality community through the responsible stewardship and enhancement of City resources
  to further Beloit's resurgence as a gem of the Rock River Valley.
  - This project repaired deteriorated pavement and added landscaping thereby improving the area.

The parking lot lights use LED technology, which is more energy efficient and has a longer life and lower maintenance cost than HPS technology.
