# **RESOLUTION COMBINING POLLING PLACES FOR FEBRUARY 15, 2011 SPRING PRIMARY ELECTION**

Whereas, the City of Beloit uses ten polling places and 24 wards for all elections, and

**Whereas,** voter turnout for the February 15, 2011 Spring Primary is anticipated to be extremely low, possibly in the 2-4% range, for the Office of Justice of the Wisconsin State Supreme Court, and

**Whereas**, providing open and accessible polling places to the voters is extremely important, as well as considering the prudent use of City tax dollars.

**Now, Therefore Be It Resolved,** that for the February 15, 2011 Spring Primary Election only, the usual ten polling places will be reduced to two, Gaston School and Central Christian Church, and all efforts possible will be made to inform the voters of this temporary change.

**Topic:** Combining Polling Places for February 15, 2011 Spring Primary Election

#### Overview/Background Information:

A Spring Primary Election will take place on February 15, 2011. The only race on the ballot in the City of Beloit will be for the Office of the Justice of the Wisconsin State Supreme Court. Because of the anticipated extremely low turnout for this election (2-4 percent), the Clerk's office is requesting to combine the usual ten polling places into two: one on the west side at Gaston School and one on the east side at Central Christian Church. The City Council must approve the polling places at least 30 days before the election. The next regularly scheduled City Council meeting is January 18, 2011, which is not 30 days before this election.

## Key Issues (maximum of 5):

- Personnel costs for similar one-issue elections in 2008 and 2009 were in excess of \$11,000.
- The City Council authorized combining the ten polling places into two polling places in the Spring Primary Election in 2010 with much success and without negative impact on the voting process.
- The cost savings in 2010 were about \$8,000 including savings in the areas of personnel, computer programming costs, polling place rental, and copy and production costs of voting materials and notices.
- Voters will be notified of the combination of polling places by various means including postings on doors of all polling places; public notices, press releases, and articles in the Beloit Daily News and Shopping News; postings on the City's website, at City Hall, the Public Library, and Grinnell Senior Center, and through information provided to the Beloit School District.
- This model may continue to be used in the future for elections when turnout is anticipated to be extremely low.

Consideration of this request supports Strategic Goal #1, which focuses on the sustainable stewardship of City resources.

  Combining polling places will save money while establishing one polling place on each side of the City for the
  convenience of voters.

The reduction in the number of polling places will save several thousand dollars in personnel and material costs.
