ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

Electronic waste is the fastest growing component of waste in the United States. Most electronics contain harmful substances such as lead, mercury, cadmium, chromium, heavy metals and chemical flame retardants that can enter groundwater, surface water or air when not properly recycled. As an eco-municipality, the City of Beloit and the Solid Waste work group feels it is important to accept electronics year-round in an effort to preserve our natural environment.

In addition to the recycling opportunities at 2351 Springbrook Court, the City of Beloit is **expanding** our service level and now invites the citizens of Beloit, Town of Beloit and Town of Turtle to drop off electronics at Public Works each Saturday between 9:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. Electronics often include valuable reusable materials such as steel, gold, silver, copper and glass that the City will be selling to our vender for recovery.


