1. The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. in the Forum at Beloit City Hall.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

3. SPECIAL ORDERS OF THE DAY/ANNOUNCEMENTS

a. Beloit Public Library Director Kristi Howe provided her **Departing Comments** to the City Council. She indicated that she has accepted a job as the Library Director for Vigo County, Indiana. She thanked the City Council for their support of the Library during her tenure. She said that the Council appointed an outstanding Library Board and encouraged the Council to continue to support and appreciate the new and existing programs the Library has to offer. The Councilors thanked her for her approach to programming, professionalism, and leadership. They wished her the best in her new position.

6. CONSENT AGENDA

Councilor Luebke made a motion to adopt the Consent Agenda, which consists of items 6.a. through 6.c. Councilor De Forest seconded, and the motion carried that the Consent Agenda be accepted, approved, adopted, or referred and acted upon as required by state and local codes by a vote of 6-0.

- a. The **Minutes** of the Regular and Special Meetings of January 7, 2013 were approved.
- b. The resolution approving **Change of Agent** for Speedway, LLC, d/b/a Speedway #4087, 148 Liberty Avenue, from Catherine Winford to Megan M. Biggerstaff, was adopted. File 8542
- c. The resolution authorizing the City Manager to apply for the 2013 HUD **Lead Hazard Reduction Grant** was adopted. File 8542

7. ORDINANCES

a. Community Development Director Julie Christensen presented a proposed Ordinance Annexing the properties located at 1035 and 1041 Udell Drive from the Town of Beloit to the City of Beloit. It was noted that the Plan Commission recommended approval 5-0. Ms. Christensen indicated that the two properties have separate ownership and contain two single-family dwellings with failing septic systems. She said that both property owners have requested this annexation to hook into the City's sewer system. Councilor Spreitzer made a motion to suspend the rules and allow for a second reading. Councilor Van De Bogart seconded, and the motion carried 6-0. On the merits of the ordinance, Councilor Luebke made a motion to enact, and Councilor Kincaid seconded. The motion carried 6-0. 8. APPOINTMENTS

President Haynes announced openings and submitted the following appointment to the City Committees, Boards, and Commissions for approval. The appointment was approved on a motion by Councilor Van De Bogart and a second by Councilor De Forest. The motion carried 6-0.

- Councilor Van De Bogart made a motion to appoint Kevin D. Leavy to the **Downtown Beloit** Association Board of Directors. Councilor Spreitzer seconded, and the motion carried 6-0.

9. COUNCILOR ACTIVITIES AND UPCOMING EVENTS

- Councilor De Forest said that she enjoyed attending several local events to celebrate Martin Luther King, Jr. Day. She acknowledged three students who received scholarships and offered condolences to Kevin Leavy and his family regarding a recent loss.
- Councilor Van De Bogart said the he enjoyed MLK Day activities and reminded the public of the upcoming Roy Chapman Andrews presentation and the Beloit International Film Festival.
- Councilor Kincaid said the he attended the MLK Prayer Breakfast and that each year the event is more energized. He told the public of additional events throughout the week at Beloit College to celebrate MLK Day and the President's Inauguration.
- Councilor Luebke said that he will attend a lecture by Dr. Jeff Adams at Vision Beloit on January 24th regarding Beloit's history and future. He also congratulated Nate Tillis from Water Resources who was recently honored in a national publication and thanked Tony Farrell for his attendance, help, and security at Council meetings.
- Councilor Spreitzer said he attended the Prayer Breakfast, the City Center Seminars, and John Kalkirtz's retirement party and that he is looking forward to attending Beloit's Winterfest.
- Councilor Haynes said that he enjoyed attending the Prayer Breakfast and some of the other events mentioned by other Councilors.

10. CITY MANAGER'S PRESENTATION

a. Police Captain William Tyler presented information regarding recent changes to the City's Animal Control Policies and Procedures. He indicated that it is required that the City has a designated Humane Officer per state law. He said that the City continues to work with the Rock County Humane Society during their hours of operation and is now working with the Dane County Humane Society as well. He said that reports of abused or neglected animals will still be investigated through the Police Department.

11. REPORTS FROM BOARD AND CITY OFFICERS

- a. Fire Chief Brad Liggett presented a resolution approving a Contract with the State of Wisconsin for Statewide Structural Collapse Team Members. He said that the City entered into this agreement initially last spring, and this is a successor agreement. He indicated that this is a maintenance resolution that would allow the City Manager to approve the contract in the future provided that the contract does not change substantially. Councilor Luebke made a motion to adopt the resolution, and Councilor De Forest seconded. Councilor De Forest asked who pays for the training associated with team membership, and Chief Liggett indicated that the State pays while team members are deployed and also covers workers compensation and disability. Councilor Van De Bogart asked how many times the team has been deployed, and Chief Liggett said that the team has not had to respond. However, he indicated that the local team responded to the partial collapse of Robinson School last year. The motion carried 6-0. File 8534
- b. Finance and Administrative Services Directory Paul York presented a resolution approving an Amendment of the **Agreement** between the City of Beloit and VantageCare Retirement Health Savings (RHS) Plan. He indicated that this item was laid over at the last Council meeting to make sure the language in the resolution is correct. He said that the City has two RHS plans with VantageCare as a result of the Health Department's move to the County. Councilor Luebke made a motion to adopt the resolution, and Councilor Spreitzer seconded. The motion carried 6-0. File 8173
- c. Mr. York presented a resolution Authorizing the Issuance and Sale of Approximately \$7,330,000 General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2013A. Dawn Gunderson, Ehlers and Associates, presented the sales results of all three of the bonds. She indicated that Standard and Poor's maintained the City's A+ stable bond rating for the taxable and tax-exempt bonds and that it was reflected in the good interest rates. She explained that another key to favorable bond rates is maintaining the City's fund balance in accordance with the adopted policy. Councilor Van De Bogart made a motion to adopt the resolution, and Councilor Spreitzer seconded. The question was called by roll call vote, and the motion carried 6-0. File 8570

- d. Mr. York presented a resolution Supplementing Resolution Adopted October 20, 2003; Authorizing the Issuance and Sale of Approximately \$5,745,000 Water System Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2013B; and Providing the Payment of Said Bonds and Other Details and Covenants with Respect Thereto. Councilor Spreitzer made a motion to adopt the resolution, and Councilor Luebke seconded. The question was called by a roll call vote, and the motion carried 6-0. File 8570

Overview/Background Information:

Magarita Mora, the operator of Santa Rosa Grocery Store, has filed an application for a Conditional Use Permit to allow indoor alcohol sales in a C-2, Neighborhood Commercial District, for the property located at 1623 Park Avenue.

Key Issues (maximum of 5):

- The Santa Rosa Grocery Store is located at the intersection of Park Avenue and Washburn Street, and is in close proximity to the Merrill Neighborhood.
- The grocery store has operated at the Park Avenue location since 2008.
- The grocery store offers a variety of meats, food, and other household items to its customers.
- The applicant would like an opportunity to offer and sell beer to her customers; however, a Conditional Use Permit is required.
- An indoor alcohol sale use is a conditional use in the C-2 District.



Overview/Background Information:

The Planning & Building Services Division has initiated an application for a Zoning Map Amendment to change the zoning district classification from R-1A, Single-Family Residential District to PLI, Public Lands & Institutions District, for the property located at 2208 N. Lee Lane.

Key Issues (maximum of 5):

- The subject property is Lee Lane Park, an improved City park. While researching an unrelated matter, Planning staff discovered that the subject property was not rezoned to PLI when the park was developed.
- The R-1A district is intended to accommodate single-family detached dwellings on moderate to large-sized lots. The PLI district is a special purpose district that is intended to accommodate public and quasipublic uses (parks, cemeteries, fire stations, etc.). Although parks are a permitted use in residential zoning districts, the PLI zoning district classification is much more appropriate for an improved City park.
- Planning staff initiated this application in an effort to correct this discrepancy in accordance with the Zoning Map Amendment procedures contained in Section 2-300 of the Zoning Ordinance.

- This Vacation will return the entire land area to the adjacent property owners. In this case, all of the adjacent properties are owned by the School District of Beloit.



COMPLAINT

TO: THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELOIT ROCK COUNTY, WISCONSIN

COMES NOW Chief Norm Jacobs, being first duly sworn and upon oath respectfully makes the following allegations against the license holder listed above:

- 1. The Complainant is Chief Norm Jacobs of the City of Beloit Police Department, 100 State Street, Beloit, WI 53511 and a resident of the City of Beloit.
- 2. Speedway, LLC, d/b/a Speedway #4293, Nancy A. Bryant, Agent, 2781 Milwaukee Road, is the holder of the attached fermented malt beverage license issued for the period of July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013 and the license and application are attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and Exhibit 2.
- 3. The abridged minutes of the January 8, 2013 meeting of the City of Beloit Alcohol Beverage License Control Committee are attached hereto as Exhibit 3 and incorporated herein by reference. Said minutes document the appearance of the license holder before the committee to address the sale of alcohol to an underage person on December 12, 2012. Said minutes document the committee's recommendation of a consecutive 30-day suspension of said license.
- 4. The abridged minutes of the December 11, 2012 meeting of the City of Beloit Alcohol Beverage License Control Committee are attached hereto as Exhibit 4 and incorporated herein by reference. Said minutes document the appearance of the license holder before the committee to address the sale of alcohol to an underage person on November 13, 2012.
- 5. As grounds for the sanction, it is alleged that the licensed holder violated Chapter 125 or municipal regulations adopted under §125.10, Wis. Stats. Specifically, it is alleged that the license holder sold alcohol to an underage person on November 13, 2012 and again on December 12, 2012 contrary to §31.01 of the Code of General Ordinances for the City of Beloit, which adopts § 125.07(1)(a), Wis. Stats., and that said violations were committed within a 12 month period of time. ISR numbers 12-9008 and 12-9759 document the police department investigation into these incidents, and are attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 5 and Exhibit 6.

- 6. City of Beloit Municipal Court records indicate that Linda A. Alexander, was issued Citation N1249343 alleging sale of alcohol to an underage person for an incident occurring on the licensed premises on November 13, 2012. Said records further indicate that Alexander was convicted of said offense on December 13, 2012. A Certificate of Conviction in Beloit Municipal Court for citation number N1249343 is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit 7.
- 7. City of Beloit Municipal Court records indicate that James E. Isferding, was issued Citation 3670464 alleging sale of alcohol to an underage person for an incident occurring on the licensed premises on December 12, 2012. Said records further indicate that Alexander was convicted of said offense on January 10, 2013. A Certificate of Conviction in Beloit Municipal Court for citation number N1249343 is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit 8.
- 8. In addition to the incidents described above, the City reserves the right to rely on evidence, if any, arising out of any further violations at or about the premises complained of up to the time of any hearing held herein.
- 9. By reason of the foregoing acts and omissions of the license holder, Speedway, LLC, d/b/a Speedway #4293, the ABLCC recommends to the City Council that the license be <u>suspended for a period of 30 days</u> beginning forthwith and running for 30 consecutive days.

1. The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by Chairman Ralph Berkley with a quorum present.

4. Consideration of incidents occurring on November 13, 2012 and December 12, 2012, Police Reports 12-9008 and 12-9759, at Speedway #4293, 2781 Milwaukee Road, for a sale to an underage person during alcohol compliance checks. Agent Nancy A. Bryant and District Manager Jessica Wagner appeared.

Captain Sciame explained that the Police Department conducted an alcohol compliance check on December 12, 2012 and the underage operative was able to purchase a twelve pack of beer without having his identification checked. Captain Sciame explained to Ms. Bryant that because this is the second violation in a twelve-month period, the Police Department is recommending a sanction of suspending their beer license for thirty days.

Ms. Wagner stated Speedway takes this matter very seriously and all employees take a computer based training program twice every year called TAM, Tobacco/Alcohol/Management, and they have a third party company check them for underage sales on a regular basis. Ms. Wagner further explained that all employees recently took the TAM program again and were told if they sold to minors, they would be responsible to pay the fine and would be terminated immediately. Ms. Wagner explained the company

has gone one step further in running age verification reports from the cash register to check how many times an employee keys in "over 30", if they enter the same birthday multiple times, and how many times they scan in an ID. Ms. Wagner stated the company is preparing the paperwork to change Agents and will be submitting it within a week. Attorney Krueger suggested having two clerks check the identification for the sale of alcohol.

Councilor Leavy asked the committee to take this violation very seriously as the employees are not getting the message, and he recommended more than a thirty day suspension. Chairman Berkley stated that based on past practice, the Police Department recommendation and history of the store, he feels thirty days is a fair sanction.

Mr. Tilley moved to recommend to the City Council a thirty day suspension of the license of Speedway #4087, second by Mr. Vickerman. Motion carried 6-0.

Attorney Krueger explained that she would be preparing a Summons and Complaint which will be personally served on the store's Agent, and that a hearing date will be set with the City Council in no less than three days and no more than ten days from the date introduced by the Council.

4. Consideration of an incident on November 13, 2012, Police Report 12-9008, at Speedway #4293, 2781 Milwaukee Road for a sale to an underage person during an alcohol compliance check. Agent Nancy A. Bryant appeared.

Captain Sciame explained that the Police Department conducted an alcohol compliance check on November 13th and the underage operative was able to purchase a twelve pack of beer. Captain Sciame stated the clerk did ask for identification; however, she still sold the beer to the underage operative. Captain Sciame explained to Ms. Bryant that because this is their first violation in a twelve month period, they are being warned at this time but a second violation within twelve months could result in sanctions. He asked if Ms. Bryant understood, and she replied that she did.

Ms. Bryant stated Speedway takes this matter very seriously and all employees take a computer based training program twice a year called TAM – Tobacco/Alcohol/Management. She said they also take Alcohol

On Tuesday, 11/13/12, at approximately 1800 hours, I, Officer Mackey, with the Beloit Drug and Gang Unit, took part in an alcohol compliance check project. The goal of this project was to check for liquor law compliance checks of local vendors by attempting to purchase beer from local Class A and Class B vendors by using underage persons. If a Class A or Class B vendor sold alcohol to an underage person, the clerk would be issued the appropriate citation for furnishing alcohol to an underage person.

Three adult males, under the age of 21, assisted with this project. These three subjects were photographed by me and were positively identified from their Wisconsin driver's licenses. A photocopy of their driver's license was also completed. Sgt. Tilley was the supervisor of this project and conducted a briefing which Officer Miller and I, along with the three adult males under the age of 21, attended. The procedure for this project was that Officer Miller would transport the underage purchaser to the place of business and provide money to buy beer. Officer Miller would maintain surveillance on the purchaser during the controlled buy. If one of the local vendors did sell alcohol to the purchaser, the purchaser would exit the store and advise Officer Miller who sold them the beer and provide a description of the clerk. The second officer, in uniform, which was me, would then photograph the purchaser with the beer and make contact with the clerk who sold the beer. I would then return the beer and change from the purchase to the store in exchange for the original money tendered, if possible. I would then issue the appropriate citation to the clerk who sold the beer to the underage purchaser. I would also confirm that a license-holder was on the premise, and if not, I would cite the appropriate citation and close the store for alcohol sales until a license-holder could arrive and remain at the store.

At approximately 1904 hours, Officer Miller arrived at the Speedway gas station, located a 2781 Milwaukee Road. One of the three underage persons, positively identified from his Wisconsin driver's license as Keegan J. Kelly, M/W, DOB 1992, entered the store and successfully purchased a 12-pack of Miller Lite beer. I photographed Keegan Kelly holding the 12-pack of Miller Lite beer outside the Speedway gas station. Kelly informed me that he exchanged a \$20.00 bill with the older F/W clerk inside the store for the Miller Lite beer. Kelly said that the clerk looked at his Wisconsin driver's license and still sold the Miller Lite beer.

I proceeded inside the store with the beer and the change from the sale. I made contact with the clerk, identified as Linda A. Alexander, DOB positively identified from her Wisconsin driver's license. I informed Alexander that she had sold the 12-pack of Miller Lite beer to a male who was under the age of 21. Alexander informed me that she checked his ID and thought that he was 21 years old. I informed Alexander that this was not the case and that it had been observed by an undercover officer on scene. I informed Alexander I would be issuing her a citation for licensee furnishing to an underage person. I completed municipal citation number N1249343 for the violation of licensee furnishing to an underage person, adopting statute 125.07(1)(a)(2), ordinance number 31.01. I issued Linda Alexander her copy of this citation with a non-mandatory Municipal Court appearance of 12/13/12 at 8:30 AM.

I later proceeded to the Beloit Police Department and downloaded a photo CD showing the photograph of Keegan Kelly holding the 12-pack of Miller Lite beer. On 12/12/12, at approximately 1800 hours, Beloit Police Department Drug and Gang Unit conducted an alcohol sting operation. The goal of the operation was to attempt to purchase beer from local Class A and Class B vendors by use of underage individuals.

At approximately 1800 hours, we had four underage individuals arrive at the Beloit Police Department to participate in the alcohol sting operation. Each individual was identified with a Wisconsin driver's license. The driver's license itself was photographed. Each individual participating in the operation also was patted down to make sure they had no other identification with altering information on it.

Sgt. Tilley of the Beloit Police Department was able to conduct a briefing informing the individuals involved in the operation, the rules of the alcohol sting operation. The Beloit Police Department Drug and Gang Unit did provide the money to purchase alcohol to the individuals. One officer would maintain surveillance in plain clothes on the purchaser during the controlled buy. Upon exiting, the purchaser would advise the officer of who sold them the intoxicant and provide a description of the clerk. The uniformed officer would then arrive and photograph the purchaser with the beer and make contact with the seller. Sgt. Tilley had explained all the rules and regulations to the individuals regarding the alcohol sting operation, at which point they were divided into two groups. Officer Sayles of the Beloit Police Department handled two of the individuals. Officer Mackey handled the other two, and I was the uniformed officer that was going to be issuing citations if the individual was able to purchase alcohol.

On 12/12/12, at approximately 1850 hours, one of our individuals working under the sting operation entered into Speedway gas station, located at 2781 Milwaukee Road, located in the City of Beloit. The individual's name was Dylan H. Agnew, DOB 94. Dylan was able to obtain alcohol, go up to the register, and purchase it. Purchased was a 12-pack of Miller High Life 64. Dylan then exited the store with the intoxicants and made contact with Officer Sayles. I then arrived on scene and was able to photograph Dylan holding the 12-pack that he had just purchased. I then was able to obtain the change that Dylan had received back from the purchase and the 12-pack and went back into the store. Dylan advised me it was an older male clerk with a blue shirt that checked him out. Dylan had advised that he did not ask for ID during the purchase. I then was able to make contact with the employee of Speedway gas station, located at 2781 Milwaukee Road. The male subject fit the

Overview/Background Information: The department has had video units in fleet vehicles since 2004. The current models that are scheduled for replacement are not able to be repaired within acceptable maintenance cost limits. The department is replacing the remainder of its mobile video systems in the department fleet. Phase I replacement was completed in 2012. Phase II and III replacement were previously identified in Capital Improvement Requests for 2013 and 2014. Due to limited CIP funding availability for the city budget, the department suggests to use seized assets to purchase the remaining two phases of this project. The department intends to use these non-taxpayer confiscated funds in the amount of \$80,000.00 to fund the completion of this project.

- Resolution will allow for this necessary equipment to be purchased using non-taxpayer funds.
- All equipment will be raised up to a single standard making training and use easier for officers.

Topic: Authorization of the issuance of a Purchase Order for replacement of two Transit Buses in 2014

Date: February 4, 2013

Presenter: Michelle Gavin, Transit Director Department: Public Works

Overview/Background Information:

The transit buses have a 12 year usable life, and the City has been awarded an FTA State of Good Repair capital grant from the Federal Transit Administration for replacement of two buses. The grant pays up to 80% of the purchase cost, the remainder is to be paid for by the City, through GO bonds, as part of the Capital Improvement Program (CIP).

Key Issues (maximum of 5):

The City has been awarded a State of Good Repair capital grant from the Federal Transit Administration for replacement of two buses. The grant pays up to 80% of the purchase cost, the remainder is to be paid for by the City, through GO bonds, as part of the 2014 Capital Improvement Program (CIP).

The 2014 CIP includes the replacement of two (2) transit coaches to replace 2 1997 model year buses. It currently takes approximately 16-18 months from the date that a purchase order is issued until deliver is taken (and payment due). The Council is asked to authorize the issuance of a purchase order now given the significantly advanced age and condition of the buses.

Conformance to Strategic Plan (List key goals this action would support and briefly discuss its impact on the City's mission.):

1. As an eco-municipality, focus on the sustainable stewardship of City resources, services and infrastructure; to protect both our built and natural environment, enhance the quality of life for current and future generations.

Sustainability (Briefly comment on the sustainable long term impact of this policy or program related to how it will impact both the built and natural environment utilizing the four following eco-municipality guidelines.):

- Reduce dependence upon fossil fuels Yes, public transit uses between 1/5 and ½ of the amount of energy per passenger mile than automobiles use.
- Reduce dependence on chemicals and other manufacturing substances that accumulate in nature N/A
- Reduce dependence on activities that harm life sustaining eco-systems Yes
- Meet the hierarchy of present and future human needs fairly and efficiently Yes

Action required/Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Council adopt this resolution and authorize the issuance of the purchase order to allow delivery of the new vehicles in 2014.

Fiscal Note/Budget Impact:

There is a PPI factor built into the original contract with the bus manufacturer. As such the cost of the two buses will increase if the purchase order is not issued. Additionally, given the age of the two buses to be replaced (1997), they are already three years beyond their useful life of 12 years, and are experiencing costly repairs.
