### B.) Parks Report

- 1) Continued with routine park maintenance:
  - Picking up litter and debris in all parks & along the business corridor of Milwaukee Road.
  - Trimming trees and downed branches in parks, trails, and cemeteries.
  - Routine cleaning and maintenance of the Dog Park.
- 2) Began mowing parks and boulevards as needed.
- 3) The water is on-line in all rest rooms in park shelters.
- 4) Installed the fountains in the Lagoon in Riverside Park.
- 5) Repairs to the Summit Park rest rooms.
- 6) Prepping ball fields at Leeson Park, Krueger Park, and Telfer Park.
- 7) Hired a contractor to replace the roof on the rest room building next the ball fields in Leeson Park.
- 8) Sandbags were installed in front of the lower entrance doors to the Moore Pavilion to prevent potential flooding from the Lagoon.
- 9) Signage was posted at the Trail Heads along Turtle Creek warning of potential flooding along the trails.
- 10) The boat ramp in Wootton Park was temporarily closed as a precaution to potential flooding along the Rock River. It has been re-opened.
- 11) Repaired damage water line in East Lawn Cemetery
- 12) Completed Cemetery clean-up with the assistance from McNeel Middle School.
- 13) Installed gravel bed for off-road parking access in Turtle Creek Park in order to prevent further damage to the turf.
- 14) Began cleaning and preparing the pool.
- 15) Cleaned and prepped the diving well for painting.
- 16) Provided assistance to Friends of the Riverfront regarding preparations for their annual Bloom event in Riverside Park.
- 17) Hired a contractor to repair the outfield fence in Leeson Park. Damage was caused by a vehicle that hit it.
- 18) Removed felled tree in Hilliard Park.

### C.) Horticulture Report

- 1) Assist with trimming trees in parks and trails as previously listed.
- 2) Assist with preparations for opening the Golf Course & the Clubhouse.
- 3) Prepping equipment and ordering supplies in preparation of maintaining landscaping beds, and installing flower baskets over Portland Avenue Bridge.
- 4) Cleaning up landscaping beds in the Gantry, downtown parking lots, cemeteries, golf course, and in all park sites.
- 5) Roll and aerify the ball fields at Telfer Park, Krueger Park, and Leeson Park.
- 6) Over-seed Krueger ball field.
- 7) Turf restoration in Leeson Park

### D.) Grinnell Hall Senior Center

- 1) In the past several months, Paula has been engaged in countless small projects that have given Grinnell Hall a remarkable facelift and has made it more customer friendly:
  - The Supervisor's Office is now located in the outer office area.
  - All storage areas have been cleaned including the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor attic and the basement.
  - The piano in Dining Hall has been relocated to another area within the Dining Hall.
  - The gift display case that was previous located by the entrance door has been relocated to the spot where the Piano was previously located in the Dining Hall and downsized for a cleaner appearance.
  - The lobby area at the entrance door has been cleared of a lot of clutter, and appears more inviting to our members and guest visiting Grinnell Hall.
  - The Dining Hall has been painted, and we have received countless compliments regarding the new pleasant green sage color.

### F.) Special Projects/Miscellaneous:

### 1) Low Ropes Course at Big Hill Park

The weather finally cooperated and therefore the new Low Ropes equipment has been installed in Big Hill Park by Experimental Systems. Shawn Fredricks with the School District of Beloit will be scheduling a training program in either May or June.

### 2) Summit Park Playground

We received a total of eight (8) proposals from four (4) separate playground vendors. The Playground Review Committee completed their evaluation of these proposals and selected the top two (2) finalists with the highest scores. The proposals with the highest scores were both submitted by Lee Recreation, and therefore they will be award the project. As indicated in the RFP, a Neighborhood Playground Meeting is scheduled to be held at the Rotary River Center at 6:00pm on Tuesday, May 7<sup>th</sup> for residents that reside within the Summit Park area to attend and select which playground they would prefer.

The final selection will be presented at the Parks & Recreation Commission Meeting for your approval.

### 3) Bike Trail Planning at Big Hill Park

We met with the LDA group and Custom Manufacturing (Clinton, WI) regarding a proposal and specifications for building a bridge across Goose Creek in Big Hill Park.

Specifications for this bridge have been stipulated by the City Engineer as stated below:

- 36' Flat Bridge x 12' Wide
- 54" Horizontal Railings (needed for Bike Traffic)
- Using Existing Cement Abutments
   (Securing with angle iron and welding I beams in place)
- The height of the I Beams would be 14" which will require us to back fill an approach to the bridge.
- 1200# Load + 30# / SQ. FT.
- COST ESTIMATE = \$16,000

Currently, the LDA group have raised approximately 1/3 of the cost for purchasing this bridge.

### 4) Dog Park Dedication Ceremony

The Dog Park Dedication will be held in Leeson Park on Saturday, May 4, 2013.

TITLE

Review and consideration of selecting the new playground equipment for Summit Park.

### **BACKGROUND**

The playground unit in Summit Park has out lived its expectancy and is scheduled for replacement within the 2013 CIP Plan, as previously reviewed and determined by the Parks & Recreation Commission.

Therefore, an RFP was developed and marketed to our list of ten (10) qualified Playground Equipment Vendors to seek proposal for replacement and installation of new equipment and not to exceed \$40,000 in cost. Four separate vendors submitted a total of 8 proposals which have been reviewed and evaluated by our Playground Committee to determine the two (2) best proposals. The top two (2) proposals based upon their composite scoring, were both submitted by Lee Recreation, representing Playworld Systems; therefore Lee Recreation will be awarded the contract for the Summit Park playground.

Furthermore, as indicated in the RFP, a Neighborhood Playground Meeting is scheduled for Tuesday evening, May 7<sup>th</sup> at 6:00pm at the Rotary River Center where the generally public will be presented with each proposal and allowed the opportunity to vote for the one of their choice. If for some reason, no one attends this meeting, then it shall be the Parks & Recreation Commission obligation to select the new playground for Summit Park.

Each Playground vendor has met all requirements as specified within the RFP, including IPEMA and ASTM standards, and is qualified to complete and install playground equipment. As in the past, no variance to the proposed equipment and/or design will be permitted, with the exception of color choices if desired.

**BUDGET & FINANCIAL IMPACT** 

\$40,000 in designated funds within the 2013 Park Amenities & Enhancement Fund.
