Minutes Beloit Community Development Authority 100 State Street, Beloit WI 53511 May 22, 2013 4:30 P.M.

The regular meeting of the City of Beloit Community Development Authority was held on Wednesday, May 22, 2013, in the Forum of Beloit City Hall, 100 State Street.

1. Call to Order and Roll Call:

3. Review and Consideration of the Minutes of the Regular Meeting held on April 23 and the Special Meeting held on May 15, 2013.

Motion was made by Commissioner Luebke and seconded by Commissioner Jacobs to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on April 23 and the Special Meeting held on May 15, 2013.

4. **Housing Authority:**

a. Presentation of April Activity Report

Cathy Pollard, Beloit Housing Authority Director, gave a brief summary of the report.

Commissioner Evans asked for clarification on how vouchers work. Cathy explained the Housing Choice Voucher process along with our authority over the voucher.

b. Presentation of April Financial Report

Cathy Pollard gave a brief summary of the report.

c. Discussion of the Beloit Housing Authority Budget

Currently, our funding only supports 589 of our 598 vouchers. With our reserves at over \$400,000, we have decided to house all of our 598 vouchers.

Commissioner Van De Bogart asked how quickly we can adjust if our funding changes and what factors determine when to stop pulling names. Cathy stated that we lose three to four tenants per month through attrition (porting, death, evictions, violations, etc.). If needed, we would quickly reduce our voucher numbers by not pulling names to replace these tenants. We need to keep at least 1-1/2 months of reserves to operate our entire program. Therefore, if our reserves go below \$325,000 and nothing has changed, we will stop pulling names.

Cathy is also looking into other funding sources for Housing Authorities through social service agencies.

5. **Community Development:**

a. Review and Consideration of Resolution 2013-17, Authorizing the Sale of 510 West Grand Avenue

Scott Schneider presented the staff report and recommendation.

Commissioner Van De Bogart moved and Commissioner Evans seconded a motion to approve Resolution 2013-17. Motion carried unanimously.

TOPIC: Amendment of the 2013 Community Development Block Grant

(CDBG) Action Plan and Budget

ACTION: Approval of the attached resolution

PRESENTER: Julie Christensen

STAFF REPORT:

In November, the City Council approved the 2013 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) budget. At the time the budget was prepared, staff estimated a 2013 grant amount of \$485,000. We were recently notified by the Department of Housing and Urban Development that we will receive \$552,913. Therefore, the City must amend its 2013 CDBG budget and Annual Action Plan to account for this increase.

As a result, we are proposing to increase the amounts approved for public service activities by 18%. The Public Service Cap is calculated by adding together the 2013 grant and the 2012 program income and multiplying that by 15 percent. This gives us a cap of approximately \$130,000. City Council originally approved \$110,852 for public service activities.

Staff is proposing to allocate the remaining \$47,950 in grant funds to the City's Housing Rehab Revolving Loan Fund; as well as \$26,667.74 in CDBG funds from 2011 that the City was required to return to our CDBG line of credit as the result of a HUD monitoring. The Housing Rehab Loan Program underwriting guidelines were recently revised to allow more families to qualify for the program. In addition, the City has been awarded a Lead Hazard Control grant in partnership with Rock County and the City of Janesville. Oftentimes, families need additional rehabilitation work not covered by the Lead Grant funding. These additional CDBG funds will allow more families to be assisted.

Staff is proposing there to be no changes to the originally approved budget amounts for Fair Housing Activities, Program Administration, Code Enforcement, or Economic Development.

Due to the amount of the budget amendment, the Community Development Authority will be making a recommendation to the City Council and a Public Hearing will be held at the August 5, 2013 Council Meeting. A notice will be published in the Beloit Daily News on June 29 and the

Stateline News on June 30 giving notice of the hearing and a 30-day public review period which will be held from July 1 until August 1.

After Council approval, staff will update the Budget and Annual Action Plan with necessary changes for submittal to HUD.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the CDA approve the attached resolution, which amends the Annual Action Plan and Budget as indicated on the attached Exhibit A.

RESOLUTION 2013-20 RECOMMENDING APPROVAL OF AN AMENDMENT TO THE 2013 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) ACTION PLAN AND BUDGET

WHEREAS, the City of Beloit approved a CDBG budget with \$485,000 in new grant funds and \$195,100 in program income for a total budget of \$680,100 in 2013 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds, and

WHEREAS, the Department of Housing and Urban Development has notified the City of Beloit that the City's grant award will be \$552,913, which is an increase of \$94,581 from the budgeted amount.

WHEREAS, the City of Beloit was monitored by HUD and required to reimburse the 2011 CDBG line of credit in the amount of \$26,667.74, and these funds require allocation to eligible projects.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Community Development Authority of the City of Beloit, Rock County, Wisconsin hereby recommends that the City Council amend the 2013 CDBG Budget and Action Plan to increase the CDBG budget as indicated on the attached Exhibit A.
