CURRENT EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

NATIONAL NIGHT OUT

This year, the Police Department, Fire Department and the Greater Beloit Area Crime Stoppers organization will celebrate our 30th Annual National Night Out. This year's events are scheduled for Tuesday, August 6 from 5:30—8:30 p.m. As always, there will be block parties, picnics and cookouts in various neighborhoods, churches and schools located throughout the Greater Beloit community. If you have held a neighborhood get-together in the past, we encourage you to participate again this year. If not, please consider coordinating a neighborhood cookout to be a part of this year's exciting National Night Out activities. As we do every year, the City Manager and various City Councilors will join the Police Chief, Fire Chief and other officials to travel throughout the community to visit as many neighborhood outings as possible.

BUDGET PREPARATION

The City's administrative budget review committee met virtually all week with various Department and Division Directors, doing a line item analysis of every budget submittal. While the State did not cut Municipal revenues as they did in the last two State budget cycles, there was also no additional revenue made available to municipalities in 2014. Although the initial budget submittals are closer to balance than experienced in prior years, we still need to make a number of budget reductions to try to fit our current expenditure needs into a revenue structure that has been either flat or decreasing for the past several budget cycles. Good progress was made this week and many of the special revenue and utility funds were either balanced or we concluded our session with a specific outline of how the Division Directors, working with our budget preparation staff, could complete that work over the next few weeks. The committee will continue its work, hoping to get a preliminary balance on the proposed budget, certainly by the middle of August.

As always, a great deal of work remains following the balancing process to get all of the budget documents, including the lengthy transmittal letter, prepared and ready for submittal. The proposed budget will go to Council to begin the formal review process at the regularly scheduled City Council meeting on Monday, October 7, 2013.
