HERITAGE DAYS THIS WEEKEND

The Greater Beloit community and numerous organizations have established a full schedule of special events recognizing Beloit's rich heritage. Events will be held from **September 6 through September 8, 2013** (this weekend). ROCK COUNTY RABIES CLINIC

The Rock County Public Health Department, in conjunction with the City's Parks and Leisure Services Division and the Friends of Noah, will co-sponsor a rabies inoculation clinic next Saturday, **September 14, 2013 from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.** The event will be held at the Edwards Pavilion at Telfer Park. The cost per animal for inoculation will be \$10 (cash only) and the City of Beloit will also have dog licenses and dog park passes available for sale at the event. Both Rock County and the City would also like to thank Merck Animal Health and the University of Wisconsin-Madison School of Veterinary Medicine, who also contributed generously of their time and resources to make this event possible.

In case you have missed these news items, rabid bats have recently been discovered in Rock County, adding to the normal imperative that household pets (both cats and dogs) receive the appropriate rabies inoculation, not only to protect your animal but also to protect you and your family members. If you have a pet that is not currently inoculated against the rabies virus, please consider taking advantage of this easy and affordable opportunity to protect you and your family.

PRELIMINARY PLAN REVIEW FOR WILLOWBROOK ROAD AND COLLEY ROAD RECONSTRUCTION—TIGER GRANT FOR CASINO

We had meetings with public officials on September 4, 2013 to review the plans for anticipated upgrades and widening for both Colley Road and Willowbrook Road to support the anticipated Ho-Chunk Nation casino project. At 5:00 p.m., there was a 2-hour open meeting for residents, property owners and other interested parties to attend and review plans for the project. The project includes widening to four lanes, the installation of traffic circles and signal improvements, along with multi-use paths, lighting and tree planting. Little right-of-way will be required from private property owners, and the response to the proposed plans was generally positive.

City and Nation Denied TIGER Grant Funds

The White House Office of Intergovernmental Affairs announced that the US Department of Transportation had approved over \$474 million in TIGER grants for the 2013 funding cycle. Unfortunately, the application filed by the City of Beloit and the Ho-Chunk Nation was not among the awards despite a good application that appeared to be strong on its technical merits. The City and the Nation will meet to continue planning for how we provide the infrastructure necessary to support the casino project.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

This week, we heard from the contractor selected by Piggly Wiggly for the remodeling of the old K-Mart store at Prairie and Shopiere. The permits are ready for pick-up and we understand work will begin in the very near future with the complete remodeling of this facility. The company does not have a firm opening date for the new store, but obviously would like to get into business as soon as the remodeling is complete.

Casey's has purchased their site at the intersection of Cranston and Shopiere but they have not yet begun construction.

We also received the initial set of conceptual plans for a new strip-style shopping center, including a new Arby's Restaurant to be built on the east side of Milwaukee Rd. at the site of the former McDonalds Restaurant. The developers are attempting to get through the plan review and contractor selection processes in time for a fall, 2013 project start. The City will be working with them in every possible way to achieve that rather aggressive timeline for beginning construction.

All other projects that have previously been discussed continue under construction this week.
