2014 CITY COUNCIL NOMINATION INFORMATION AVAILABLE

BELOIT'S HOLIDAY SEASON KICKS OFF WITH THE GRAND LIGHTED HOLIDAY PARADE

Don't forget to make your calendar now for Downtown Beloit's exciting holiday parade and Santa arrival, which is once again scheduled this year for the Friday after Thanksgiving, November 29, 2013 with activities beginning near the intersection of State and Grand at 5:00 p.m. The <u>attached</u> flyer provides more information, along with a schedule of planned events.

THANKSGIVING HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

During the upcoming Thanksgiving holiday, November 28—December 1, the following scheduling modifications may impact service delivery:

- 1) All City offices will be closed on Thursday, November 28 and Friday, November 29 in celebration of the Thanksgiving holiday.
- 2) All Public Safety related services will be available 24/7 as always.
- 3) Solid Waste collection will be delayed one day, with the normal Thursday pick-up being moved to Friday, and Friday's collection being moved to Saturday, November 30.
- 4) The Recycling Drop-Off Center at 2351 Springbrook Court will be closed on Saturday to accommodate the necessary Solid Waste and Recycling collection operation.
- 5) The Beloit Public Library will close at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, November 27 and reopen on Friday, November 29 at 9:30 a.m. The outside book drop located on the south side of the building is open 24 hours a day. COUNTY ROAD "BT" - INMAN PARKWAY EXTENSION

On Tuesday evening, November 19, 2013, a delegation from the City attended the public hearing regarding the proposed Inman Parkway Extension project, which has been officially labeled "County Road BT." That County route will connect County Road G, which is Prairie Avenue on the west, and County Road S, which is Shopiere Road on the East. The alignment and design profile for the road were as anticipated, and concerns earlier raised regarding how best to cross Turtle Creek have now been resolved.

Only two individuals spoke at the hearing. Greg Boysen, Public Works Director presented on behalf of the City and one resident who does not live along the project asked a question about the impact on Turtle Creek. There were several other residents in attendance and some of them had questions about their individual properties and potential impact, but did not speak at the Public Hearing. The process will now move into completion of the environmental

assessment and the final design, including right-of-way boundaries for the project. In 2014, the right-of-way will be acquired and plans and bidding documents will be completed. Current plans call for bidding the project in the winter of 2015, for construction beginning in the spring of 2015.

DESIGN FOR THE RECONSTRUCTED I-43 INTERCHANGE

We again want to remind the public to hold Tuesday, December 10, 2013 for a presentation and discussion regarding the I-43 Interchange reconstruction, which will be part of the I-39/90 widening and improvement project. The Wisconsin Department of Transportation has announced the date; however, additional information regarding times and locations will be released shortly.

BELOIT HEALTH SYSTEM CANCER CARE CENTER NEARS COMPLETION

We received communication this week from Beloit Memorial Hospital that the Cancer Care Center under construction at the intersection of Milwaukee Road and Lee Lane is on schedule and they anticipate completion and opening prior to the end of this calendar year. Information regarding a ribbon cutting/dedication ceremony has not yet been announced.

THE CASTLE AT 501 PROSPECT MOVES TOWARD COMPLETION

This week, I had the opportunity to tour The Castle at 501 Prospect, which is the remodeling and repurposing project underway by the Wittnebel family to convert the former 1st Presbyterian Church into a community based facility. The first phase of development at The Castle involves opening a café, which is anticipated prior to the end of the calendar year. Other spaces are being prepared to serve as a performing arts center, a meeting and banquet facility, and there will be education space for performing arts, as well as life style enrichment classes primarily focused on young residents. Stay tuned as this exciting project moves toward completion with various phases opening beginning this December and running throughout 2014.

2014 City Council Nomination Information

October 14, 2013 – Beloit, WI: Any City of Beloit resident interested in running for a two-year term on the Beloit City Council may pick up a packet of information including nomination papers beginning Monday, October 28, 2013. The packets are available in the office of the City Clerk on the second floor of City Hall during normal business hours: Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

- The Spring Election will be held on **Tuesday**, **April 1**, **2014**.
- There are seven members on the Council and four seats will be on the ballot.
- Candidates must file required forms with the City Clerk before forming a committee and/or raising funds.
- The first day to circulate nomination papers is **Sunday, December 1, 2013**.
- A minimum of 200 valid signatures of City of Beloit residents must be submitted. Staff recommends that between 200 and 400 signatures be submitted to ensure ballot access.
- Nomination papers and all forms must be completed and filed with the City Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on **Tuesday, January 7, 2014**.
- An informational session may be held in January for all candidates who have gained ballot access.
- Newly-elected Councilors will take office on Tuesday, April 15, 2014.




