CURRENT EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

BELOIT UTILITIES NOW OFFERS E-STATEMENTS FOR CUSTOMER CONVENIENCE

Beloit Utilities is now offering an option for E-statements which will be distributed to your e-mail account. This option offers a new, more convenient way for you to manage your bills and maintain electronic files as well. Not only will it improve convenience for customers who utilize their computers for managing their personal business affairs, but will also save the utility the cost of paper, printing and postage to send the traditional paper bill. If you are interested in signing up for E-statements, please click here for a link to the appropriate page. You will need your account number, and of course an e-mail address. Simply complete the form and transition your future bills to an electronic format.

Obviously, the Utility will continue to send paper statements each month to customers that would prefer to receive a traditional paper document for processing their monthly payments. No action needs to be taken to maintain the paper bills that you currently receive..

PROTECT YOUR WATER PIPES

Below normal winter temperatures returned again this week. Beloit Utilities continues to receive a number of phone calls from both residential and commercial customers who have experienced a water line freeze due to the cold temperatures and the depth that frost has moved into the ground this winter. The Wisconsin Rural Water Association and the City of Beloit Water Utility have tips available related to protecting your water pipes during periods of extremely cold weather. Please see attached for this useful information. If you experience a water service interruption likely due to service line freezing, please call the Water Resources Division, 608-364-2888, to report the service interruption and request assistance.

NEIGHBORHOOD REVITALIZATION COMMITTEE

We received good news this week, having received a written offer to purchase one of the Neighborhood Stabilization Program homes that the City acquired and remodeled, and we learned a second pending offer has now received mortgage approval and that property will likely go to closing in the next few weeks. The City has one additional house in inventory that we will begin remodeling with the proceeds from the sales. As noted in last week's report, we have started marketing a number of additional properties that were completed this winter, and are already

getting some activities on those properties as well. Hopefully, the market will stay strong this year and we will be able to further reduce the inventory of remodeled properties acquired under the Stabilization Program.

PLANNING CONTINUES IN CONFLUENCE AREA

The City Attorney and I had a meeting this week with representatives from South Beloit to discuss continued planning for both environmental assessment and ultimately development of the Confluence Park complex. Most of the Park is located in South Beloit, Illinois and will be developed by that City. Some of the land along Shirland Avenue is in the City of Beloit and is available for access or use as green space or other purposes as planning proceeds for the Confluence project.

DOWNTOWNBELOIT ASSOCIATION (DBA) HOLDS ANNUAL MEETING AND AWARDS CEREMONY

I was pleased, along with City Councilor Mark Spreitzer, to represent the City of Beloit at the DBA annual meeting and awards ceremony held on February 27 at La Casa Grande banquet facility. It was interesting to hear an update on all of the accomplishments of the DBA from special events to continuing with façade renovation and the new rental assistance program. Congratulations to all the award winners.

RECRUITMENT BEGINS FOR NEW FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES DIRECTOR

On Tuesday, March 4, City management, Department Directors and Division Directors from the Department of Finance and Administrative Services will have an opportunity to meet with the executive recruiter handling the search to replace this important position. The recruiter wanted to speak to the position's peers, which includes all the other department directors who are also some of the primary customers of the Department of Finance and Administrative Services. The recruiter will also speak to all the Division Directors to determine their needs and expectations from this management position. During the sessions, we will discuss developing the recruitment profile, which has been prepared in draft form awaiting this session to put on the finishing touches. The recruitment profile describes the City, the job requirements and expectations, and articulates all of the qualifications needed in a successful candidate for this position. The job profile, along with a more brief job announcement, will provide the primary information to interested persons who may contemplate applying for the vacancy. It will still be some months before we get through all the various steps of the process and are ready to begin interviewing candidates for the position.

CITY COUNCIL MEETING - MONDAY, MARCH 3, 2014

The City Council will hold a Workshop at 6:30 p.m. to review the agenda of the regular City Council meeting.

The attached agenda is for the Monday, March 3, 2014 regular City Council meeting beginning at 7:00 p.m. in the Forum.

4. PUBLIC HEARINGS

- a. Proposed **Zoning Text Amendment** related to Designated Floodplain Maps. This change to the Zoning Ordinance pertains to the area where the new Kerry Ingredients facility is located. Springbrook Creek and the related floodway were altered during the construction of this complex under a Department of Natural Resources (DNR) permit. The modified floodplain maps recognize changes that were made at that time. The Plan Commission has reviewed this suggested modification and recommends for approval.
- b. Resolution approving a Conditional Use Permit to allow office uses in the Central Business District-Core, for the property at 430 E. Grand Ave. This the Phoenix building which will have one or more office uses on the first floor. Requirements in this Zoning District make office uses on the first floor a Conditional Use. Consequently, the owner has applied for the necessary Conditional Use Permit. The application has been reviewed by staff and by the Plan Commission, which recommends for approval.

6. CONSENT AGENDA

- a. Approval of the **Minutes** of the Regular Meeting of February 17, 2014 and the Special Joint City Council and School District of Beloit Board of Education Meeting of February 24, 2014.
- b. Application for Zoning Map Amendment to change a zoning district classification for properties located at 9817 and 9949 S. Turtle Townhall Road from Temporary M-1, Limited Manufacturing District, to Permanent M-1, Limited Manufacturing District. This is the property that will house the new CCI and Blackhawk headquarters. The property was recently attached to the City and, as is standard practice, a temporary zoning classification was assigned at the time of annexation. The permanent zoning request is now going through the review process and this matter is being referred to the Plan Commission for their review and recommendation
- c. Application for Zoning Map Amendment to change the zoning district classification for property located at 1000 Bluff St. from its current R-1B, Single-family Residential District zoning to PLI, Public Lands and Institutions District. This request was forwarded by St. John's Lutheran Church because a PLI zoning district classification would better meet their needs for uses planned for the church parcel. This matter is being referred to the Plan Commission for their review and recommendation.
- d. Application for review of a proposed building addition within Telfer Community Park located at 2301 Skyline Dr. This application was received from the Beloit Snappers to construct batting cages, which would be attached to the existing clubhouse building. Councilors will recall that this was one of the improvements required to the stadium in order to maintain their professional baseball affiliation. The City was able to assist the team with a number of other improvements that were made in time for last season. This item would not fit within the municipal budget capability. Consequently, the team has undertaken this project using both fundraising and in-kind service contribution to complete the project. Staff has reviewed the

proposed building plans and finds them architecturally compatible with the site. The parking lot that would be converted is not now used for parking because of its location in relationship to home plate and the number of foul balls that seem to consistently visit this area. The application is being referred to the Plan Commission for their review and recommendation.

- e. Application for an Amendment to the Premises Description for Class "B" Beer and Reserve "Class B" Liquor License for Hourglass Media. This is the former Presbyterian Church site. It is being remodeled into "The Castle" to be used as a performing arts venue, along with various restaurant and banquet operations. Because of the extensive amount of remodeling required to the interior premises, the new owners have been unable to complete that work and obtain an occupancy permit under the timelines required by both the statute and the City ordinance. Consequently, they have requested an extension of the time line which will be addressed later in the agenda. They're also concerned about their ability to complete the entire remodeling of the project within the extended timeframe. Consequently, they are requesting to amend the portion of the premises upon which liquor may be served to match the area that they anticipate having completed and ready to open to the public later this year. Other portions of the premises can be amended back into the liquor license application at a future date, if necessary, and of course, with City Council concurrence. This matter is being referred to the Alcohol Beverage License Control Committee for their review and recommendation.
- f. Resolution authorizing a **final payment** for the Public Works contract for Sixth Street resurfacing. This project was completed in 2013 and the contract is ready for final payment.

7. LICENSES

a. This resolution reaffirms the Class "B" Beer and Reserve "Class B" Liquor License for Hourglass Media for The Castle project located at 501 Prospect and establishing a new timeline for completion. This matter has already been referred to the Alcohol Beverage License Control Committee, who met with the applicant and recommended that the City Council grant a license extension through June 30, 2014. As noted above, the owners have completed a great deal of work inside the facility but are not yet ready to receive an occupancy permit so that the business can be open to the public and the license activated. The Alcohol Beverage License Control Committee recommended for approval by a vote of 7 to 0.

11. CITY MANAGER'S PRESENTATION

a. The City Manager will make a brief **Report to the Community**. This year's report will focus on economic development and infrastructure improvements which occurred within the city of Beloit over the past five years.

12. REPORTS FROM BOARD AND CITY OFFICERS

a. Resolution authorizing Blackhawk State Bank an Extension for Outstanding Special Assessments for properties located in the vicinity of 2231 Trevino Court in the City of Beloit. This is another piece of infrastructure installed by the City to the benefit of a private developer. Consequently, the work was done under special assessment and the property owners were given the normal five-year deferral to allow for the development to proceed. To date, no homes have been built in this proposed subdivision. Blackhawk State Bank currently owns a number of these lots which were taken back in a foreclosure related proceeding. The bank has approached the City and asked if the deferrals can be extended further, since there are no current plans for construction on these lots. The City does, in fact, have a provision in the assessment ordinance

allowing for three-year extensions with Council approval. As we did earlier for the Deerfield Estates subdivision, the City does not want these lots and is not interested in having them go through the property tax foreclosure process. Consequently, we are recommending the Council consider a three-year extension which would provide additional time for continued economic improvement and hopefully eventually a contractor willing to build homes on this particular site.

b. Resolution authorizing a Trans 75 Exception Request for the pavement replacement on Bayliss Avenue. The City has an active project in conjunction with the Town of Beloit to resurface portions of Bayliss Avenue, which are in need of replacement. Current Federal standards for work paid for from this funding source require dedicated bike paths be constructed along with the roadway resurfacing. Bayliss Avenue is a lightly traveled residential collector street and the City believes there is no need for separate dedicated bike paths along this roadway. Consequently, the Engineering Division will request that Council authorize the Division to apply for an exception request for this particular project.

IT'S COLD OUT THERE!

PROTECT YOUR PIPES!

With the recent and upcoming frigid weather, the Wisconsin Rural Water Association and the City of Beloit Water Utility are offering these winter maintenance tips:

- Check the temperature of your water. Normal groundwater temperatures are typically in the upper 40s and lower 50s, so check the water temperature in your homes. To do so, you can use a simple digital thermometer. If it's getting close to 32°, you should take action to prevent freezing.
- Prevent freezing of service laterals by keeping water moving. This can be done by letting a faucet run or by drilling a 1/8" hole in the overflow tube of a toilet in the building. If you live in an area that is susceptible to freezing such as a dead end street or cul-de-sac you may want to consider allowing your water to run continuously. A pencil-wide stream is typically sufficient to prevent freezing. You may also simply run the water on a frequent basis throughout the day and night to minimize risk of freezing. If you plan to be away for any length of time have a friend or neighbor run water for you.
- Check Heating Components. With the early and extended cold weather we've seen so far, heating components have been running far more than usual. Maintain furnaces to make sure they're operating correctly and replace filters more often. Also check heat tapes and space heaters used with control system elements. For less expensive items, consider purchasing back-ups should something fail. The cold weather is affecting everyone in the state, so space heaters and heat tapes are in short supply.
- Be careful when thawing frozen pipes. For exposed pipes in buildings you can use a simple hair dryer. For underground pipes the older method is using electrical current from welders or transformers. However it's best to do this with the help of an electrician so you can check to make sure the current is being confined to the section of piping you're wishing to thaw. Failure to do so can cause fires in nearby buildings. Newer methods of pipe thawing use recirculating hot water or steam. These are much safer than electrical current and they also have the additional benefit of being effective on non-metallic pipes such as plastic or PVC.
- Check empty and vacant buildings. Check vacant properties and ask neighbors or relatives to check homes of people on vacation. A great deal of frost or condensation on windows may indicate that a heating system has failed and water may be running due to frozen and broken pipes.
