CANVASSERS CERTIFY MUNICIPAL ELECTION RESULTS

The Board of Canvassers met this past week and certified the municipal election results. Three incumbent City Councilors, Sheila De Forest, Chuck Kincaid and Charles Haynes along with newcomer Ana Kelly were the only four candidates slated for the four open seats on City Council. SPRING YARDWASTE COLLECTION—SPRING CLEAN UP CONTINUES

As the snow cover disappears from the City, crews have already been out and about in the community working on various spring cleanup activities, from street sweeping and pothole patching to litter cleanup and removal. Because of the extensive duration of the snow cover this winter season, an unusual amount of litter has accumulated on both public and private properties throughout the community. As the warm weather arrives, we urge property owners and residents to move about their property and pick up this unusual litter accumulation.

Spring yard waste collection began last Monday, April 7, 2014 and will run through next Friday, April 18, 2014 with daily collection in conjunction with your regular trash pickup day. Please see the <u>attached</u> media release for more information.

STRATEGIC PLANNING FOR 2015

Strategic planning began with a Council discussion at a special meeting held this Thursday, April 10, 2014. Department and division directors have already been instructed to begin compiling their proposed strategic objectives for 2015. Once that process is complete, all strategic planning submittals will be reviewed by the City's management team. Final adjustments will be made in preparation for an extended workshop on Monday, May 12, 2014. The workshop will be held in the Public Works Utilities and Engineering building located at 2400 Springbrook Court. Council will be in session most of the day discussing various elements of the City's strategic plan for next year. The workshop will be open to the public.

BELOIT UTILITIES NOW OFFERS E-STATEMENTS FOR CUSTOMER CONVENIENCE

We again want to remind customers that Beloit Utilities is now offering an option for E-statements. This option offers a new, more convenient way for you to manage your bills and maintain electronic files as well. This option will improve convenience for customers who utilize their computers for managing their personal business affairs and also save the City of Beloit Water Utility the cost of paper, printing and postage to send the traditional paper bill. If you are interested in signing up for E-statements, please click <u>here</u> for a link to the appropriate page. You will need your account number, and of course an e-mail address. Simply complete the form and transition your future bills to an electronic format.

The Utility will continue to send paper statements each month to customers that would prefer to receive a traditional paper document for processing their monthly payments. No action needs to be taken to maintain the paper bills that you currently receive.

CITY WEBSITE ADDRESS CHANGING

We want to again remind everyone that the City's website and e-mail addresses are changing.

At the request of our Information Technology office, the City has decided to update and simplify its website address. Also, the current website www.ci.beloit.wi.us does not belong to the city and the lease on this name ends on January 1, 2015. It is unknown at this time whether or not it will be affordable to renew use of that name. The city now has access to the "gov" suffix which will also be used in implementing the shorter, more simplified website address of http://www.beloitwi.gov.

This name is not only easier and shorter, but is more intuitive as well. Along with the change, all of the City's email addresses will also be transitioned. For example, the City Manager's former e-mail address was <u>arftl@ci.beloit.wi.us</u>. The new e-mail address is now <u>arftl@beloitwi.gov</u>.

As noted above, the current website and e-mail addresses will remain valid at least through the end of this calendar year until January 1, 2015. If the owner of that address provides the City with a reasonable renewal cost, it is likely that the City will retain that address as well. Both addresses will take the sender to either the appropriate website or City office. We would suggest, however, that you reprogram your favorites, bookmarks and contacts to reflect the new or abbreviated address for City electronic communications.

Spring Yard Waste Collection

March 28, 2014 – Curbside collection of yard waste will take place Monday, April 7, 2014 through Friday, April 18, 2014. Collection will take place on your trash day.

Yard waste must be properly contained in a clean container, paper, or Back to Nature bio-degradable yard waste bag. Containers can be no larger than 39 gallons and weigh no more than 60 pounds. Yard waste cannot be contained in plastic bags. A \$1.50 sticker must be affixed to each bag, container and or bundles.


