FINAL STEPS FOR PROCESS IN FILLING COUNCIL VACANCY

The City Council met at the first of two meetings scheduled to fill the Council vacancy left by Councilor Leavy's resignation. At 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 5, 2014, Council met to review applications and determined that the following applicants will move forward to participate in an interview.

Council also selected the order of interview, which is reflected in the listing above and approved various procedures to be used during the interview process.

The interviews will actually be conducted at the second of those two meetings, scheduled and noticed for this coming **Monday, June 9, 2014 at 6:00 p.m.** in the City Hall Forum, 100 State Street. Following the interviews, Council will deliberate, vote and likely select a candidate to fill the Council vacancy. Ballots will be provided for Council's use and there is a process outlined in the ordinance to continue with the selection process, should the initial vote result in a tie.

Various artists have been around the City Center in Beloit, painting buildings and landscapes. The reception, awards, exhibit and sale are all scheduled for next Friday, June 13, 2014 at the Beloit College Hendricks Center for the Arts, 409 Pleasant Street in downtown Beloit.

2015 BUDGET PREPARATION

The Capital Projects Budget Committee met this week and took a first look at submittals for the 2015 Capital Budget. Although there are some questions on a few of the projects and scheduling yet to be worked out, the list is larger than available resources, but not by as much as originally anticipated. The committee will meet with Department and Division Directors that made submittals within the

next week to go through all the project information sheets and to at least produce a preliminary list of projects that will be proposed for 2015. It should also be noted that we will have to await the final equalized assessed valuation numbers from the State's Department of Revenue in mid-July before the process can be finalized.

The MUNIS software used for budget preparation has opened and Department and Division Heads have begun submitting initial operating budget requests.

The next public workshop related to the budget is scheduled for **Monday, June 16, 2014 at 5:30 p.m.** before the regular City Council meeting on that date. The pre-budget workshop will follow a similar format as recent years, providing Councilors with updates regarding the 2014 budget planning to date and initial thoughts or projections on changes, particularly in revenues, that may impact the 2015 budget preparation process.
