#### CURRENT EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

#### INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION

All City offices and the Beloit Public Library will be closed tomorrow, July 4th in observance of Independence Day.

Trash and recycling will not be collected on Friday, July 4th in observance of Independence Day. Trash and recycling collection will be delayed by one day, Friday July 4 and Saturday, July 5. The Recycling Drop Off Center at 2351 Springbrook Court will be closed on Saturday, July 5 to accommodate equipment and staffing needs for collection on Saturday.

#### SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING ON MONDAY, JUNE 30, 2014 RELATED TO FORFEITURES AND OTHER SANCTIONS FOR JUVENILE OFFENDERS COMING BEFORE THE MUNICIPAL COURT

As anticipated, we had a good turnout of about two dozen people attending the Council Workshop this past Monday to discuss various activities of the Municipal Court related to juvenile offenders. Deputy City Attorney Beth Krueger made a detailed presentation outlining court procedures and included a number of statistics about juvenile offenses. Most of the offenses pertain to truancy and daytime curfew violations, but also include other violations of various sections of the Municipal Code, as well. Diversion programs that provide for alternative sentence options were also discussed, including numerous community service options, including a program operated by the Rock County Sheriff's Department that is available to juvenile offenders, even after a warrant has been issued, which normally follows repeated violations and failure to appear in court.

The presentation also included a number of different options and alternatives that Councilors could consider to minimize sanctions for juvenile offenders as requested by most workshop participants. Residents also made a number of comments and asked a lot of questions. Some also suggested "solutions" that would be more to their liking.

Council President Spreitzer indicated that the Council would consider options and would continue a dialogue on the topic.

#### **NEW COUNCILOR ORIENTATION**

On Monday, July 7, 2014, the City Manager will coordinate an orientation session for newly appointed City Councilor Regina Hendrix. The session will be identical to the program recently held for Ana Kelly and it is not anticipated that additional City Councilors will be in attendance.

#### 3. SPECIAL ORDERS OF THE DAY/ANNOUNCEMENTS

a. Proclamation recognizing July as **Park and Recreation Month**. Brian Ramsey, Director of Parks and Leisure Services, will be in attendance to accept the proclamation.

#### 4. PUBLIC HEARINGS

 Public Hearing to Solicit Input on the Community Development, Housing, and Homeless needs in the City for inclusion in the 2015 Annual Action Plan. This plan is part of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) application for funding.

#### 6. CONSENT AGENDA

- a. Approval of the **Special Minutes** of June 5, and June 9, 2014 special Meetings and the **Minutes** of the Regular Meeting of June 16, 2014.
- b. Resolution authorizing **Final Payment** of Public Works Contract C13-16, Post and Emerson Storm Sewer. This project was completed last summer and is now ready for close-out and authorization of final payment.
- c. Application for a **Zoning Map Amendment** to change a zoning district classification from R-2, Two-family Residential District, to R-3, Low Density Multi-family Residential District for property located at 1715 Elmwood Avenue, which is undeveloped. A developer purchased the property some years ago and attempted to build a single-family subdivision; however, market conditions were obviously not suitable for that type of development. He has now approached the City and requested to change the zoning district classification. The application is being referred to the Plan Commission for their review and recommendation.

#### 7. ORDINANCES

a. Proposed Ordinance to amend Section 13.02 of the Code of General Ordinances related to Parking Restrictions in Downtown Beloit in support of the Farmer's Market. Police have been issuing temporary "No Parking" orders in downtown Beloit each weekend to ensure that space is available for the Beloit Farmer's Market, which operates from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. each Saturday beginning with the pre-sale in May and a full market from June through October. A recent check of the Municipal Code noted that there was some general expression of authority for the Police to impose temporary parking but no specific Ordinance to cover this event. The City Attorney's office, therefore, has recommended that specific Ordinance authority be approved by City Council in order for the Police to enforce the temporary noparking restrictions. The Traffic Review Committee has reviewed and is recommending the Ordinance for approval. This item was on the agenda to suspend the rules, to go to second reading, and consider approval at this meeting.






