CITY MANAGER ATTENDING LEAGUE OF WISCONSIN MUNICIPALITIES SUMMER BOARD MEETING AND WORKSHOP

The City Manager left Wednesday afternoon for the League of Wisconsin Municipalities summer board meeting and workshop. Sessions began early on Thursday morning and ran through mid-day on Friday, as the Board completes a business meeting and then participates in a Strategic Planning session.

CITY MANAGER ATTENDS INTERSTATE 39/90 REVIEW MEETING

The City Manager and Director of Public Works attended the monthly interjurisdictional review meeting for planned improvements to Interstates 39/90, including the I-43 interchange here in Beloit. Additional design details were presented for the group's review and discussion. Of particular note were several comments made by the Federal Highway Administration, which has ultimate responsibility for final design review and approval for all Interstate highway reconstruction projects. Just a reminder that the next Public Information Meeting related to the project will be held on **Tuesday, August 5, 2014** beginning at 5:00 p.m. in the Community Room at the Beloit Public Library, 605 Eclipse Blvd. Additional notices will be forthcoming in the media as the meeting date approaches.

WIS-DOT HOLDS PUBLIC INFORMATION MEETING RELATED TO THE HART ROAD RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT

Another improvement related to the pending interstate reconstruction project is the reconstruction of Hart Road, from the I-43 interchange running north and west all the way to Shopiere Road. As with other local roads that by-pass the I-43 interchange, this is anticipated to be one of the alternate routes, particularly for local traffic during the upcoming construction process. A public meeting will take place on July 16, 2014 at 5:00 p.m. in the Town of Turtle Hall, 6916 S. County Rd. J, Beloit, Wisconsin. Interested residents are invited to attend.

FIRE HYDRANT FLUSHING



FIRE HYDRANT FLUSHING

The City of Beloit Water Resources Division will be performing their annual fire hydrant flushing program from July 21, 2014 through November 26, 2014.

This flushing program ensures that the fire hydrants are in good working condition in case of emergencies and to help flush sediment out of the distribution system.

You may experience discolored water, low water pressure or a disruption of service during this time period. Residents are urged to reduce water use and consumption during this time period and wait to do laundry until **AFTER** 6:00 p.m. during the flushing program.

During evening hours residents should open their cold water faucets until the water runs clear before using it.

31th ANNUAL NATIONAL NIGHT OUT

The Beloit Fire Department, the Beloit Police Department, and the Beloit Crime Stoppers will once again partner in celebration of the 31TH National Night Out on Tuesday, August 5, 2014.

On August 5TH from 5:30-8:30pm residents in neighborhoods throughout Beloit are asked to lock their doors, turn on and display outside lights and spend the evening outside with their neighbors. Last year over 30 neighborhood blocks registered to participate in Beloit's National Night Out celebration.

Last years' National Night out campaign involved citizens, law enforcement agencies, civic groups, businesses, neighborhood organizations and local officials from over 15,000 communities from all 50 states, U.S. territories, Canadian Cites, and military bases worldwide. In all, 37 million people participated in National Night out 2013.

As in the past, Beloit Police, Firefighters, City Officials, Crime Stoppers, and elected representatives will visit many of block parties and cookouts. Each neighborhood block will be responsible for planning special activities. Barricades will be available.

National Night Out is designed to:

- Heighten drug and crime awareness
- General support for, and participation in, local anticrime programs
- Strengthen neighborhood spirit, and police-community partnerships
- Send a message to criminals letting them know that neighborhoods are organized and are fighting back

All neighborhood blocks participating in this year's National Night Out activities should register with the Beloit Police Department. Applications are available at the Beloit Fire Station Headquarters, 1111 Church St., Beloit Police Department, 100 State St., and the City of Beloit website, <u>www.beloitwi.gov</u>.

The deadline for registration is 5:00pm on July 25th.
