### **BELOIT CELEBRATES HALLOWEEN**

### **Downtown Beloit Hosts Costume Party and Parade**

Don't forget this coming Saturday, October 25, 2014 from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., Downtown Beloit will host the annual costume party and parade in downtown Beloit. Each year, the Halloween celebration is done in conjunction with the final Saturday of Farmers' Market. The attached flyer includes more information about this event.

### TRICK-OR-TREAT HOURS ESTABLISHED

The City Manager and Police Chief have announced that Halloween trick-or-treating in the City of Beloit will be from 5:00—7:00 p.m. on Friday, October 31, 2014. We hope everyone has a safe and enjoyable Halloween this year. The Police Department makes the following recommendations:

- Wear light colored clothing, short enough to prevent tripping, and add reflectors
- Make sure costumes are flame retardant
- Make sure children can see well through face masks or head coverings
- · Accompany your children and go only to homes with outside lights on
- Carry a flashlight
- Stay within the neighborhood and only visit homes where you know the residents.
- Only give or accept wrapped or packaged candy and treats
- Watch for traffic
- Examine candy before allowing children to eat it

### **COUNCIL NOMINATION PROCESS TO BEGIN**

The City Clerk's office has notified the community that nomination papers for the office of Beloit City Councilor will be available beginning Monday, October 27, 2014. The <u>attached</u> press release contains more information for anyone interested in picking up nomination papers to serve on the Beloit City Council.

### TEEN DROP-IN CENTER TASK FORCE—UPDATE

The Task Force planning for the establishment of a Teen Drop-In Center here in the City met again this past week. The Task Force heard reports from a number of subcommittees and had additional in-depth discussion about a center, including what facilities would be needed and how programming should be facilitated. The subcommittees are continuing to meet and update valuable information needed for the planning effort. The group selected Monday, November 10, 2014 as a date to visit a prototype Teen Drop-In Center operated by the Boys and Girls Club in the City of Milwaukee. Task Force members will be traveling to the facility, meeting with key

staff and observing the program in operation. The next meeting for the full Task Force has been scheduled for Wednesday, November 12, 2014 at 4:30 p.m. in the Boys and Girls Club, 1851 Moore Street.

### **2015 BUDGET PREPARATION**

Most of the preliminary work and budget workshops on the 2015 Proposed Capital and Operating Budget has now been concluded. This past Monday evening, October 20, the Council held a formal public hearing on all aspects of the budget and then remained after the conclusion of the regular Council meeting for a budget workshop that lasted several more hours. A great deal of time and effort has been incorporated into the budget preparation process this year. Several changes to the budget were made by Councilors during the review process. Those modifications include:

- A Capital Improvements project for street construction on Willowbrook and Colley Roads was dropped
  from the Capital budget because a grant application for this project was not approved. Improvements
  on these streets will need to be done at some point if the Beloit Casino Project is approved and built.
  Engineering staff will continue to work with the Ho Chunk Nation planning for these anticipated
  improvements; however, there was no point in leaving the project in the Capital budget at this time. As
  a consequence, the total budget for 2015 was reduced by almost \$550,000 below the 2014 approved
  budget.
- Council also expressed concerns about extending the \$1.75 base fare rate for the City's Transit System to local intra-city routes. Last year the Beloit Janesville Express rate was increased to the \$1.75 rate in order to maintain consistency between the cities of Beloit and Janesville, which share bus service on the inter-city route. This year, staff proposed to increase the base fare for the Beloit routes by the same amount. Several Councilors expressed concern about raising the fare and the impact that may have on ridership. Consequently, we will retain the \$1.50 base fare for 2015.
- There is also a provision recommended by staff to implement a sticker system similar to that used for the yard waste program for overage containers, bulky items, and appliances set at the curb for collection by the City. Containers over five per residential unit, along with bulky items and appliances, require a separate charge for collection. Councilors expressed concern about the sticker system and how well it would work in the City. Staff had also been working on the details of implementation and encountered some questions we are not fully prepared to answer at this time. Consequently, the sticker system will not be expanded in 2015; only stickers for yard waste containers will continue to be sold. Other items may be set at the curb on your regular collection day. They will be collected by the City and a separate bill will be generated for that service.

At this time, a final set of adoption resolutions related to the budget and its various components are being prepared and will appear on Council's agenda for the regular meeting scheduled for Monday, November 3, 2014. It is anticipated the Council will take action on the budget at that meeting.

### FALL YARD WASTE PROGRAM TO BEGIN NOVEMBER 3, 2014

The City's free collection of yard waste containers for yard, garden and leaf waste will begin on Monday, November 3 and run through Friday, November 21, 2014. This is the same program the City runs each year to allow residents to clean out their gardens and/or rake their leaves and containerize them in the appropriate paper, biodegradable, or clean trash container for free collection by the City. As always, containerize your leaves and garden waste and set them at the curb on your regular collection date during any one of the three weeks noted above. Once again, there is no charge for this service; however, if residents do tree or brush

trimming and create brush or limb bundles to set at the curb for City collection, those must have the regular yard waste sticker attached. For more information, please click [here].

### PHOTO ID NOT REQUIRED TO CAST A BALLOT AT THE NOVEMBER 4TH GENERAL ELECTION

Just a reminder, on October 9, 2014, the U.S. Supreme Court ordered that the photo ID requirement will *not* be in effect for the November 4, 2014 General Election. Consequently, no photo identification will be required to obtain an absentee ballot or to vote through a regular ballot on Election Day at the polling places.

Absentee voting in person will be available starting Monday, October 20th through Friday, October 24th and Monday, October 27th through Friday, October 31st between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. in the City Clerk's office on the second floor of City Hall. Electors who would like an absentee ballot mailed to them must make the request in writing via email to <a href="mailto:lemirer@beloitwi.gov">lemirer@beloitwi.gov</a> via mail to 100 State Street, Beloit, WI 53511; or in person at the City Clerk's office.



### **2015 City Council Nomination Information**

October 21, 2014 – Beloit, WI: Any City of Beloit resident interested in running for a two-year term on the Beloit City Council may pick up a packet of information including nomination papers beginning Monday, October 27, 2014. The packets are available in the office of the City Clerk on the second floor of City Hall during normal business hours: Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

- The Spring Election will be held on **Tuesday, April 7, 2015**.
- There are seven members on the Council and three seats will be on the ballot.
- Candidates must file required forms with the City Clerk <u>before</u> forming a committee and/or raising funds.
- The first day to circulate nomination papers is **Monday, December 1, 2014**.
- A minimum of 200 valid signatures of City of Beloit residents must be submitted. Staff recommends that between 200 and 400 signatures be submitted to ensure ballot access.
- Nomination papers and all forms must be completed and filed with the City Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on **Tuesday**, **January 6**, **2015**.
- An informational session may be held in January for candidates who have gained ballot access.
- Newly-elected Councilors will take office on Tuesday, April 21, 2015.


