CITY MANAGER ANNOUNCES HIS PENDING RETIREMENT

At the Council meeting held on November 17, 2014, I announced to Council and the community my pending retirement. My last day in the office will be June 3, 2015 and my actual retirement date (following the use of accrued vacation leave) will be July 3, 2015. My announcement was made now to be sure that Council has adequate time to go through a full recruitment and screening process to select a replacement City Manager by early June of next year. I have <u>attached</u> a copy of my retirement letter, which articulates our affection and respect for the City of Beloit. I have a great many people to thank who have been supportive, not only of me but of the City over the past 11(+) years. Obviously, as we get closer to the actual retirement date, there will be opportunities to make sure those expressions of gratitude are made at the proper time and in the proper venue. My wife, Karen, and I will be remaining in the community and anticipate remaining active in various civic affairs.

I do want to take this opportunity to publicly thank all of the residents, officials, and even many City employees that responded in such a gracious manner to my retirement announcement. It was gratifying to receive so many congratulatory notices and expressions of regrets over my pending retirement from the City Manager's position.

BELOIT MEMORIAL HIGH SCHOOL TOUR WITH THE GREATER BELOIT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

This past Thursday morning I took an opportunity presented by the Greater Beloit Economic Development Corporation (GBEDC) to tour the high school facility with the primary focus on the technical education facilities. Once again, I was extremely impressed by the quality and cleanliness of the high school building. I actually learned, for the first time, that Beloit Memorial High School is the largest high school facility in the entire State of Wisconsin. Residents may recall that we were the first, and are still considered the benchmark school, when it comes to career and technical education. That portion of the school is incredibly impressive, with much of it having been designed by industry leaders from the respective manufacturing and production sectors of our economy to make sure that the equipment and the training match the needs of the employers. We also toured some of the other extraordinary facilities and talked a bit about the advanced placement courses, since there are a huge number of Beloit Memorial students taking advanced placement courses, many of which result in college credit. The school building itself is as clean as a hospital, and we should all be very grateful that we have a facility of this quality available for our children and grandchildren to help them prepare for a full and productive life.

Please accept this communication as my official notice of pending retirement. My last day in the office will be Wednesday, June 3, 2015. Accrued leave benefits will take me through Friday, July 3, 2015, which will be my date of retirement. I will likely have some accrued leave remaining, which I will receive in a lump sum payment as provided for under existing city personnel policy.

Obviously, I very much enjoyed my tenure as City Manager during a very exciting time in the city's history and feel that I contributed in a substantive way to the cities progress during these last eleven plus years. In fact, I have pushed back my retirement by several years beyond my normal retirement age precisely for this reason.

I will miss the opportunity to serve in this capacity but feel that my age combined with the desire to complete some "bucket list" trips and activities while still possible has led to the decision to retire in mid-2015. Karen and I plan to remain in and continue to be active in the community.

I am providing this notice six plus months ahead of my final departure to provide adequate time for Council to find a suitable replacement for this very important position. I will be happy to provide Council with the requested level of assistance to achieve that goal in time for a smooth transition in June of 2015.

I have many people to thank for their assistance and cooperation during what will be slightly more than twelve years of service by mid-2015, and plan to do that at the appropriate opportunity. In the interim, I have several projects to complete and will remain fully engaged in the management of city affairs, plus plan for a smooth transition by June of next year.


