RESOLUTION

AUTHORIZING A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT TO ALLOW A DRIVE-UP AUTOMATED TELLER MACHINE (ATM) IN THE CBD-1, CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT – CORE, FOR THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 419 PLEASANT STREET

WHEREAS, the application of Hendricks Commercial Properties, LLC for a Conditional Use Permit to allow a Drive-Up Automated Teller Machine (ATM) in the CBD-1, Central Business District – Core, for the property located at 419 Pleasant Street, having been considered by the City Council of the City of Beloit, Wisconsin at a public hearing held for that purpose and due notice of said hearing having been given by publication as appears by the Proof of Publication filed in the City Clerk's office.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the City Council of the City of Beloit, Rock County, Wisconsin does hereby grant a Conditional Use Permit to allow a Drive-Up ATM in the CBD-1, Central Business District – Core, for the property located at 419 Pleasant Street (a/k/a 500 Public Avenue) in the City of Beloit, for the following described premises:

Lot 2 of a Certified Survey Map as recorded in Volume 33 on Pages 384-387 of the Certified Survey Maps of Rock County, located in the City of Beloit, County of Rock, State of Wisconsin. Said parcel contains 0.683 acre, more or less.

As a condition of granting the Conditional Use Permit, the City Council does hereby stipulate the following conditions and restrictions upon the Conditional Use, which are necessary for the public interest:

- 1. This Conditional Use Permit authorizes the installation and use of a freestanding Drive-Up ATM kiosk in an existing landscaping island in the rear parking lot, in the location shown on the site plan submitted by the applicant.
- 2. Prior to use of the ATM, the applicant shall sign & stripe the five affected parking stalls that will be blocked by the ATM's stacking spaces as "bank employee parking only." This parking restriction shall remain as long as the ATM.
- 3. Prior to use of the ATM, the applicant shall sign & stripe the drive aisle between the ATM and Public Avenue as one-way (southbound) only through the use of painted arrows, one-way signs, and do not enter signs.
- 4. The applicant shall keep all lights on in the rear parking lot and adjacent former drive-through exit driveway during all periods of darkness, and is encouraged to install surveillance cameras in the parking lot.
- 5. Prior to use of the ATM, the applicant shall plant at least one shade tree and low-growth shrubs in the parking lot island that hosts the ATM, along with at least one additional replacement shade tree in a nearby parking lot island.
- 6. Any major changes in the adopted conditions or use of the property shall be approved by the Plan Commission and City Council by amending this Conditional Use Permit. The Director of Planning & Building Services may approve minor changes administratively.

Topic: Conditional Use Permit Application for the property located at 419 Pleasant Street

Overview/Background Information:

Hendricks Commercial Properties has filed an application for a Conditional Use Permit to allow a Drive-Up Automated Teller Machine (ATM) in the CBD-1, Central Business District – Core, for the property located at 419 Pleasant Street. The applicant is in the process of building-out a first floor tenant suite for Blackhawk Community Credit Union in the Vision Beloit building on the corner of Pleasant Street and Public Avenue.

Key Issues (maximum of 5):

- The bank's proposed ATM will be a freestanding kiosk in the rear parking lot, as shown on the attached site plan. A photo of an identical kiosk at a different bank location is also attached to this report.
- The ATM will be accessible from an existing driveway on Public Avenue, which is currently a two-way driveway. According to Section 8-112 of the Zoning Ordinance, ATMs must have at least 3 stacking spaces that allow bypass exiting and do not impede movements in & out of off-street parking spaces. In order to address concerns about the stacking spaces blocking parked vehicles, the applicant has agreed to sign & stripe the five affected parking stalls as bank employee only stalls. This will ensure that sign-abiding members of the public are not impeded. The five affected parking stalls (along with the entire parking lot) are voluntary off-street parking, as there are no minimum off-street parking requirements in the Central Business District.
- The applicant removed one mature shade tree to accommodate the ATM pad, and Planning staff is recommending a condition of approval that will require the applicant to plant at least two replacement shade trees.
- The City Engineer has reviewed this application and is recommending denial, due to the fact that drivers using the ATM will be facing oncoming traffic when leaving the ATM. Planning staff and the applicant evaluated the subject property's parking lot, and while the selected location is not ideal, it is the least problematic when considering stacking spaces and disruption of turning movements. To address this concern, Planning staff is recommending a condition of approval that will require the drive aisle between the ATM and Public Avenue to be signed & striped as one-way (southbound) only through the use of painted arrows, one-way signs, and do not enter signs.
- The Plan Commission reviewed this item on November 19, 2014 and voted unanimously (6-0) to recommend approval of the requested Conditional Use Permit, subject to the six conditions recommended by Planning staff.

Request Overview/Background Information:

Hendricks Commercial Properties has filed an application for a Conditional Use Permit to allow a Drive-Up Automated Teller Machine (ATM) in the CBD-1, Central Business District – Core, for the property located at 419 Pleasant Street. The applicant is in the process of building-out a first floor tenant suite for Blackhawk Community Credit Union in the Vision Beloit building on the corner of Pleasant Street and Public Avenue.

Key Issues:

- The attached Location and Zoning Map shows the location of the parcel involved in this application. The adjacent zoning and land uses are as follows:
 - o North: R-4, Moderate-Density Multi-Family Residential District; Church & Multi-Family Residential
 - South: CBD-1, Central Business District Core; Institutional
 - East: CBD-1, Central Business District Core; Commercial (Vacant)
 - o West: CBD-1, Central Business District Core; Commercial & Surface Parking Lot
- The bank's proposed ATM will be a freestanding kiosk in the rear parking lot, as shown on the attached site plan. A photo of an identical kiosk at a different bank location is also attached to this report.
- The ATM will be accessible from an existing driveway on Public Avenue, which is currently a two-way driveway.
- According to Section 8-112 of the Zoning Ordinance, ATMs must have at least 3 stacking spaces that allow bail-out exiting and do not impede movements in & out of off-street parking spaces. In order to address concerns about the stacking spaces blocking parked vehicles, the applicant has agreed to sign & stripe the five affected parking stalls as bank employee only stalls. This will ensure that sign-abiding members of the public are not impeded.
- As an alternative, the Plan Commission could require the applicant to remove & replace the affected parking stalls with landscaping as a condition of approval. Planning staff is not recommending this course of action at this time.
- The five affected parking stalls (along with the entire parking lot) are voluntary off-street parking, as there are no minimum off-street parking requirements in the Central Business District.
- There are light poles in the subject property's parking lot, and two light poles in the former Associated Bank drive-through exit driveway, which is also owned by the applicant. Given recent criminal activity near other downtown ATM kiosks, Planning staff is recommending a condition of approval that will require the applicant to keep all of the nearby lights on during all periods of darkness.
- The applicant removed one mature shade tree to accommodate the ATM pad, and Planning staff is recommending a condition of approval that will require the applicant to plant at least two replacement shade trees.
- The City Engineer has reviewed this application and is recommending denial, due to the fact that drivers using the ATM will be facing oncoming traffic when leaving the ATM. Planning staff and the applicant evaluated the subject property's parking lot, and while the selected location is not ideal, it is the least problematic when considering stacking spaces and disruption of turning movements. To address this concern, Planning staff is recommending a condition of approval that will require the drive aisle between the ATM and Public Avenue to be signed & striped as one-way (southbound) only through the use of painted arrows, one-way signs, and do not enter signs.
- The freestanding kiosk ATM operated by First National Bank in the parking lot across from the Ironworks Hotel has a similar layout and vehicle movements.
- The City's other Review Agents have reviewed this application and do not have any comments or concerns.
- The attached Public Notice was sent to seven nearby property owners, which has not resulted in any comments.

Findings of Fact

Based on Section 2-504 of the Zoning Ordinance, the Plan Commission shall make a recommendation based on the following considerations:

- a. Whether the establishment, maintenance, or operation of the conditional use will be detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort, or general welfare;
 - Subject to certain conditions of approval, the proposed Drive-Up ATM will not be detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort, or general welfare.
- b. Whether the conditional use will be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate

vicinity for purposes already permitted;

- The affected area is an urban parking lot that will not be negatively impacted by additional glare, noise, and emissions resulting from the Drive-Up ATM.
- c. Whether the conditional use will substantially diminish or impair property values within the neighborhood of the subject property;
 - On the contrary, the opening of another bank in the downtown area is likely to enhance property
 values within the area.
- d. Whether the establishment of the conditional use will impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of the surrounding property:
 - This is an urbanized area and the surrounding properties are fully developed.
- e. Whether the exterior architectural design or site layout of the proposed conditional use is so dissimilar or otherwise incompatible with existing or proposed development in the immediate neighborhood that it will cause a depreciation in property values;
 - The design and appearance of the ATM is compatible with surrounding developments.
 - Planning staff is recommending conditions of approval that will require adequate lighting and landscaping in order to ensure compatibility.
- f. Whether adequate utilities, access roads, drainage or other necessary facilities will be available to serve the proposed use at the time of its occupancy or use;
 - Adequate facilities and infrastructure are available to serve the conditional use.
- g. Whether adequate measures will be taken to minimize traffic congestion; and
 - The proposed ATM includes adequate stacking spaces and the general public will not be impeded with respect to movements in and out of affected parking stalls.
 - Although drivers using the ATM will be temporarily facing the oncoming traffic lane, these vehicle
 movements will occur at slow speeds and are not uncommon in urban parking lots where vehicles
 must first yield and then veer to the left before turning tightly into parking stalls on their right. In
 addition, signing & striping the drive aisle as one-way only will alleviate many conflicts.
- h. Whether the conditional use will comply with all applicable regulations of the Zoning Ordinance.
 - The conditional use will comply with all other applicable regulations of the Zoning Ordinance.

Consistency with Comprehensive Plan and Strategic Plan:

The Comprehensive Plan refers to the Downtown Plan, which recommends Office uses for the Vision Beloit property. Consideration of this request supports City of Beloit Strategic Goal #5.







1. The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. in the Forum at Beloit City Hall.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

3. SPECIAL ORDERS OF THE DAY/ANNOUNCEMENTS

- a. Beloit Public Library Interim Co-Director Jennifer Laatz introduced **Beloit Public Library Director** Nick Dimassis to the Council and the public. On behalf of herself and Interim Co-Director Jeni Schomber, Ms. Laatz thanked the Council and the City Manager for their support during the transition. Mr. Dimassis thanked Ms. Laatz and Ms. Schomber, the Library Board of Directors, particularly John Watrous, the City Council, the City Manager, and the residents of Beloit for their support of the library and its services. Mr. Dimassis said that this is an exciting time for libraries and that he is looking forward to the library continuing to serve as a pillar of the educational community and an engine for economic development. Ms. Laatz said that there will be a welcome reception for Mr. Dimassis in the Library's Community Room on November 21st from 4:00-5:00 p.m. Councilor Spreitzer welcomed Mr. Dimassis and thanked Ms. Laatz and Ms. Schomber for their service as interim directors.
 - b. Councilor Luebke presented a proclamation recognizing the **Beloit Memorial High School Concert Choir** to Jacob Truby. Mr. Truby thanked the Council and said that he is grateful for the support of the School Board and Administration. He introduced members of the Concert Choir in the audience who sang a song.  - c. Monica Krysztopa, Executive Director of Visit Beloit, presented the **City and Vision Partner's Rebranding Program**. She indicated that the goal of this project was to create a cohesive brand among all of the vision partners.

4. PUBLIC HEARINGS

- a. Community Development Director Julie Christensen presented a resolution authorizing a Conditional Use Permit to allow a pick-up window in a CBD-2, Central Business District Fringe, zoning district, for the property located at 658 Fourth Street. It was noted that the Plan Commission recommended approval 7-0. Councilor Spreitzer opened and closed the public hearing without participation. She indicated that several definitions have been amended to provide more clarity and that the fees were all placed in one section. - Councilor De Forest said that she enjoyed volunteering at the Kids Against Hunger event; thanked Brett Herbert and Mark Edwards for the City Parks and Trails brochures; and announced that there will be a meeting on November 21st with the NAACP to discuss minorities in schools. She said that the choir was wonderful and that she is grateful to all Beloiters for making everyone feel welcome.
- Councilor Kincaid said that he attended the Community Foundation's Women's Fund luncheon and that they have a worthy mission of helping young girls and women become self-sufficient.

- Councilor Hendrix said that she visited a successful teen center in Milwaukee to gain insight; that she attended the Kids Against Hunger event; and that she volunteered at Challenge Day at Beloit Memorial High School.
- Councilor Kelly said that she attended the BMSH choir event in Madison and the Women's Fund luncheon. She said that working the election and volunteering at Challenge Day were very rewarding.
- Councilor Spreitzer said that the Women's Fund luncheon was a fantastic event. He said that he
 attended an Open House for Community Action and welcomed its new Executive Director. He

10. CITY MANAGER'S PRESENTATION

He said that he will provide whatever assistance is requested by the City Council in hiring a new City Manager.

Finance and Administrative Services Director Eric Miller presented a resolution authorizing reporting under the Securities and Exchange Commission's Municipalities Continuing Disclosure Cooperation Initiative. Mr. Miller stated that the City was notified by an underwriter that the City has filed financial disclosures past deadlines. He said that, upon further research regarding the filing deadlines, the City had only filed late twice and those are not considered material. Overview/Background Information:

Chambers IV, LLC has submitted an amended Planned Unit Development (PUD) - Master Land Use Plan for part of the Parkmeadow North Phase 4 property located at 2250 W. Hart Road. A copy of the amended PUD - Master Land Use Plan is attached to this report.

Key Issues (maximum of 5):

- The proposed (amended) PUD Master Land Use Plan includes a multi-phase assisted living facility that includes up to 100 units. The proposed facility includes a Residential Care Apartment Complex (RCAC) wing and a Community Based Residential Facility (CBRF) wing with a shared administration, commons, and kitchen area.
- The applicant will be commissioning a CSM to subdivide and purchase the land included in the PUD, leaving the remaining single-family portion of Parkmeadow North Phase 4 undeveloped.
- In 2004, the City Council approved a PUD that included fourteen 4-unit condo buildings on the land that is subject to this request, but the subdivision plat was never recorded and the development never materialized. The prior developer did construct water & sanitary sewer mains that will need to be relocated into a utility easement in order to accommodate the proposed assisted living facility.
- The subject property was rezoned to PUD when Parkmeadow North Phases 3 & 4 were approved a decade ago.





- 5. The PUD Final Plan shall include a looped water system, where necessary, with the number and location of fire hydrants provided and installed as approved by the City Zoning Officer.

- 7. The developer shall construct a 10-foot wide recreation path along the easterly edge of the property connecting the recreation path in Parkmeadow North Plat No. 2 with the public sidewalk located on the south side of Meadow Lane.
- 8. All public improvements to be located in the public rights-of-way, including any landscape islands and/or traffic circles, shall be constructed according to detailed construction drawings approved by the City Engineer prior to construction. These plans shall include a straight street segment for Claremont Drive between Meadow Lane and Kelly Lane.
- 9. The number of access drives on the public streets shall be the minimum number possible and shall be located as determined by the City Engineer.
- 10. Tuck-a-Way Lane shall extend easterly to Claremont Drive to provide a second means of access to the condominium units located in the northwestern portion of the development.
- 11. The Plan Commission and City Council shall approve any major changes in the adopted conditions or use of this property. The Community Development Director may approve minor changes administratively and allow accessory structures and uses that comply with and meet all of these standards.



The work on this project was completed on August 24, 2013. I have inspected the work and find it to be satisfactory and in compliance with the requirements of the contract. The contractor has asked for final payment and the final payment quantities have been approved by the contractor. The contractor did not supply the required maintenance bond, and so instead the retainage was held for one year.

Over the course of this year, a hairline crack has formed in one of the replaced slabs near the Cranston Bridge over Turtle Creek. The crack is positioned and oriented similar to the original flaw, which indicates, if not a coincidence, that forces external to the slab are at work. Replacement of this slab is not currently recommended given the required traffic disruption and insignificant size of the flaw.

The original contract amount was for \$70,935.50, and the final contract amount is \$79,266.24. The increase in cost was due to expanding the repair areas larger than the original estimate. A detail variance report is attached. Payments to date under this contract total \$77,284.58, and there were no subcontractors, so no lien waivers have been collected.

Therefore, I recommend a final payment in the amount of \$1,981.66 be made to CPR Inc.

Overview/Background Information:

A request was made first by John Carrol of 724 Hobart Place and subsequently, a petition was submitted by Mary Hallock of 732 Hobart Place requesting the removal of the No-Parking restrictions along Hobart.

Key Issues (maximum of 5):

- 1. The Traffic Review Committee discussed the issue during the September 22, 2014 meeting and a vote was delayed until the determination regarding the use of the sidewalk could be determined. At the October 27, 2014 meetings, the Committee voted (4-1) in favor of removing the No-Parking restrictions on Hobart Place.
- 2. The current street width is only 16' wide. A minimum of 10' of pavement is required by the standards to allow for safe travel on a local roadway. The typical parking lane is 8' wide, which does not allow enough room for a standard travel lane.
- 3. After discussions with the City Attorney, it was determined that Hobart Place does indeed have sidewalk and that it cannot be considered as part of the street. Even if vehicles were allowed to park on the street, vehicles would not be allowed to park over the sidewalk or the grass areas. This would leave less than the required 10' minimum width of pavement.
- 4. Before the September meeting, Police, Fire, and Operations (DPW) were all opposed to changing the parking restrictions.
- 5. The existing signs have been changed to read No-Parking At Anytime, which still allows for the temporary pick-up/drop-off of passengers near the front of the homes located on Hobart Place.

Date: December 1, 2014

Presenter(s) Greg Boysen, Public Works Director Department(s): Public Works/Engineering

Overview/Background Information:

The City of Beloit has been working with the School District of Beloit regarding traffic issues near Robinson School since the reconstruction of the building over a year ago. The issue of removing parking along Lovell was discussed during the September 22, 2014 Traffic Review Committee meeting and temporary No-Parking signs were installed while the residents along the street were contacted regarding the change.

Key Issues (maximum of 5):

- 1. The Traffic Review Committee reviewed the issue during the October 27, 2014 meeting and the Committee voted (5-0) in favor of removing the parking along both sides of Lovell Avenue between Cranston and Holmes.
- 2. Robinson School was re-built as part of the approved \$70 million referendum. As part of the reconstruction, a driveway was added to the west side of the building and the existing traffic signals were removed. Also, an expansion of the east side parking lot, including a pick-up/drop-off zone was added. The crossing guard was moved to the intersection of Cranston/Robinson and new sidewalk ramps, crosswalk markings, and flashing crosswalk signs have been installed.
- 3. The School District has expressed concern for the safety of the pedestrians crossing Cranston Road. City staff has observed parents parking along Lovell Avenue and crossing Cranston Road with their kids instead of utilizing the crossing guard location or the parking lot with the pick-up/drop-off lane.
- 4. The Police Department has increased enforcement in the area. Also, the Engineering Division, Police Department, and School District worked together to prepare a press release to inform the motoring public of the traffic laws/safety in school zones. The Engineering Division has asked the school to review their policies related to the location kids enter/exit the building and the use of the pick-up/drop-off lane in an effort to maximize the potential of these new features.
- 5. The removal of the parking along Lovell will encourage parents who are travelling to school to pick-up/drop-off children to either use the crosswalk (w/crossing guard) or the pick-up/drop-off lane in the parking lot.
- 6. It should be noted that after the Engineering Division was contacted by two property owners along Lovell that wish for the No-Parking to be extended another block to the south (to Carlyle Avenue). Letters were sent to the residents along Lovell between Cranston and Carlyle notifying them of the proposed change along with the date and time of the council meeting, in case they wished to present comments to the Council. The engineering Division does not have any reservations in extending the No-Parking restrictions along Lovell to Carlyle.





Topic: Amendment to the Mutual Cooperation Agreement Under the National Affordable Housing Act

Date: December 1, 2014

Presenter(s): Julie Christensen Department: Community Development

Overview/Background Information:

In July 2001, the City of Beloit, Rock County and City of Janesville formed the Rock County HOME Consortium and entered into a Mutual Cooperation Agreement Under the National Affordable Housing Act. This allows us to receive HOME funds directly from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). This agreement awards funds to a Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO) in Beloit and the cities of Beloit and Janesville and Rock County. It also sets aside funds for weatherization activities on a county-wide basis (see attached agreement signed in 2001).

Key Issues (maximum of 5):

- According to the Mutual Cooperation Agreement, 15 percent of the funds shall be reserved for weatherization
 activities on a county-wide basis. The understanding at the time was that Community Action would receive these
 funds since they were the agency performing these activities in Rock County. In practice, however, Janesville allowed
 some of this allocation to be used by Community Action, Inc. for other HOME-eligible activities, such as rehab
 activities. This agreement is being amended to allow this to continue into the future (see attached amended
 agreement).
- 2. The HOME program requires funding to be committed within two years of HUD awarding the annual grant agreement. In the past, HUD looked at the commitment of funds on a Consortium-wide basis, rather than an individual member basis. The Consortium believes that this practice is changing at HUD and is working towards making each entity responsible for its own commitment deadlines. Consequently on November 17, the City Council approved budget amendments to allow us to get Beloit's HOME funds committed to projects.
- 3. Rock County has funds left from 2010, 2011, and 2012 and have decided that their best course of action is to reallocate these funds to another entity in the Consortium. The City of Janesville has the most capacity to expend these funds. Rock County also has to pay back approximately \$40,000 in HOME funding that was used on ineligible projects which were discovered during a monitoring. These funds are also being recommended for allocation to the City of Janesville.
- 4. If we do not amend this agreement, these funds could be lost to Rock County. This amendment is being proposed to keep these funds in Rock County. Rock County has now hired an agency that will ensure that the remaining Rock County HOME funds are expended in a timely manner and on eligible projects. These funds are required to be used outside the cities of Beloit and Janesville.

MUTUAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT UNDER THE NATIONAL AFFORDABLE HOUSING ACT



Federal Fiscal Years 2002-2004

This agreement entered into among the City of Beloit, a Wisconsin Municipal Corporation, the City of Janesville, a Wisconsin Municipal Corporation, and the County of Rock, a political subdivision of the State of Wisconsin.

WHEREAS, the National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, as amended, allows units of general local government to enter into a mutual cooperation agreement to form a Consortium to obtain federal funds as a participating jurisdiction under the HOME Investment Partnerships Program (hereinafter called HOME Program); and

WHEREAS, Section 66.0301 of the Wisconsin State Statutes provides for intergovernmental agreements; and

WHEREAS, the parties are mutually developing a Consolidated Housing and Community Development Plan; and

WHEREAS, the parties have determined that obtaining funds under the HOME Program will increase their ability to provide affordable housing;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties do agree and covenant as follows:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS

- a. "Member" An incorporated unit of local government that signs this Agreement or a substantially similar Agreement, and therefore is a member of the Consortium organized to carry out eligible activities under the HOME Program. This includes the governments for Rock County Cities and Villages and for the County of Rock.
- b. "Administrative Member" A local unit of government that administers the HOME program within its jurisdictional boundaries. This includes the governments for the Cities of Beloit and Janesville and the government for the County of Rock.
- c. "Representative Member" The unit of local government that, with the approval of all administrative members, shall assume the responsibility for ensuring that the Consortium's HOME Program is carried out in compliance with the requirements of 24 CFR Part 92 and 91, the requirements of 24 CFR 92.350(a)(5), and for the requirements of the Consolidated Housing and Community Development Plan.

SECTION 2. FUNDING

Funds for the Consortium will be distributed as follows:

- a. Fifteen percent (15%) of the funds shall be reserved for Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO) activities within the City of Beloit.
- b. Nineteen percent (19%) of the funds shall be reserved for specific activities or projects administered by the City of Beloit.
- c. Thirty-four percent (34%) of the funds shall be reserved for specific activities or projects administered by the City of Janesville.
- d. Seventeen percent (17%) of the funds shall be reserved for specific activities or projects administered by the County of Rock. This 17% allocation includes the funding for projects located in the other participating municipalities within Rock County, excluding the Cities of Janesville and Beloit.
- e. Fifteen percent (15%) of the funds shall be reserved for weatherization activities on a county-wide basis.
- f. The above allocation of funds will be reexamined for 2003 after additional population, housing, and economic data from the 2000 U.S. Census have been obtained, and may be adjusted as necessary upon mutual written consent of the administrative members, from time to time and at any time.
- g. Each administrative member shall be responsible for providing required match funds or credit based upon the amount of its allocation and its use of funds. If an administrative member cannot provide a match, it shall be the responsibility of the administrative members as a whole to provide the required match funds.

SECTION 3. ACTIVITIES

- a. Each member shall cooperate in undertaking, or assist in undertaking, eligible HOME Program activities in compliance with the regulations at 24 CFR Part 92.
- b. Members shall take affirmative action to further fair housing in their jurisdictions. Such actions may include planning, education and outreach and enforcement components.

SECTION 4. ADMINISTRATION

a. The City of Janesville shall be the representative member and shall carry out necessary overall responsibilities for the Consortium, with the cooperation of all members and administrative members, consistent with the HOME Program regulations. The City of Janesville will administer the HOME Program within the municipal boundaries of the City of Janesville.

- b. The City of Beloit will administer the HOME Program within the municipal boundaries of the City of Beloit.
- c. The County of Rock will administer the HOME Program on behalf of all members excluding the Cities of Janesville and Beloit. The County of Rock will administer the HOME program within the municipal boundaries of all members excluding the Cities of Beloit and Janesville, and within the boundaries of all unincorporated areas in Rock County.
- d. Each Administrative member shall submit in a timely manner to the Representative member all information necessary for participation in the Consortium. This includes, but is not limited to, all information necessary for the Consolidated Plan, the program description and certifications (24 CFR 92.150), written agreements executed with subrecipients, and performance reports.
- e. Each Administrative Member of the Consortium shall start its Community Development Block Grant and HOME Program years on January 1.

SECTION 5. AMENDMENT, WAIVER

No amendment or waiver of any provisions of this Agreement shall be effective unless the same shall be in writing, approved and signed by the legal authority of the Administrative Members.

Any amendments to the agreement incorporating changes necessary to meet the requirements set forth in the Consortia Qualification Notice for subsequent three-year qualification periods shall be adopted by the Consortium. Failure to comply will void the automatic renewal provisions of this Agreement.

SECTION 6. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement embodies the entire agreement and understanding of the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter herein and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings of the parties hereto relating to the subject matter herein.

SECTION 7. CONFLICTING AGREEMENT

In case of any conflict between this Agreement and any other document, this Agreement shall control.

SECTION 8. ARBITRATION

In the event that the parties are unable to agree with respect to any action to be taken pursuant to this Agreement, or any matter or issue arising under this Agreement, then any of the parties may elect to submit the issue to arbitration in accordance with Chapter 788, Wisconsin Statutes. Each party will be responsible for their own costs for legal

representation. Any costs for the arbitrator involved in said arbitration will be borne equally by the parties involved.

SECTION 9. DURATION OF THIS AGREEMENT

This Agreement, approved this $\underline{2nd}$ day of \underline{July} , 2001, is in force for the time necessary to complete HOME Program activities funded from federal fiscal years 2002, 2003, and 2004. It shall terminate when all HOME Program funds are expended or are permanently withdrawn by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The members shall remain in the Consortium and not end their participation in it until the time of termination.

This Agreement shall automatically be renewed for successive three-year qualification periods. The Representative Member shall notify each participating unit of general local government in writing of its right not to participate for the successive three-year qualification period by the date specified by HUD. The Representative Member shall send copies of such notices to the HUD field office.

The respective parties as members of a HOME Consortium partnership execute this Agreement. Attached hereto and made a part of this Agreement are Agreements executed by other HOME participating municipalities and governing bodies. In so doing, all existing municipalities and governing bodies are agreeing to participate under the terms of the HOME Consortium partnership with any other municipality or governing body that has joined or subsequently joins the partnership.

I hereby find that the terms and provisions of this Agreement are fully authorized under State and local law and that the Agreement provides full legal authority for the signatory parties to undertake or assist in undertaking HOME Consortium activities.

FIRST AMENDMENT

TO

MUTUAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT UNDER THE NATIONAL AFFORDABLE HOUSING ACT BETWEEN AND AMONG THE CITY OF JANESVILLE, A WISCONSIN MUNICIPAL CORPORATION, THE CITY OF BELOIT, A WISCONSIN MUNICIPAL CORPORATION AND THE COUNTY OF ROCK, A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN

Whereas, the City of Janesville (hereinafter "Janesville"), City of Beloit (hereinafter "Beloit") and County of Rock (hereinafter "Rock County") entered into a Mutual Cooperation Agreement dated July 13, 2001 to form a Federal HOME Program Consortium to provide local decision-making and annual funding under the provisions of the HOME Investment Partnership Act; and

Whereas, the Consortium provides annual funding to the Consortium members for programs such as: housing rehabilitation, down payment and closing cost assistance, new construction of owner-occupied and rental housing units, purchase/rehabilitation/resale of owner-occupied units, and other eligible programs under the HOME Investment Partnership Act; and

Whereas, Section 2 of the Mutual Cooperation Agreement outlines how funds for the Consortium will be distributed and provides that the allocations may be adjusted as necessary upon mutual written consent of the administrative members, from time to time and at any time; and

Whereas, Janesville, Beloit, and Rock County are the administrative members of the Mutual Cooperation Agreement; and

Whereas, HOME regulations require grant funds to be committed to HOME eligible projects within two years of executing the HOME Agreement with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban development; and

Whereas, it is desirable to reallocate funding amongst members to meet the HOME program commitment deadline and ensure funding benefits residents of Rock County; and

Whereas, the administrative members desire to amend the agreement to reflect the one-time transfer of unallocated 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2012 HOME funds in the amount of \$267,440.67 from Rock County to Janesville; and

Whereas, the administrative members desire to amend the agreement to reallocate the fifteen percent (15%) of funds reserved for weatherization activities on a county-wide basis provided for under Section 2 (e) to be used for HOME eligible activities or projects administered by Community Action of Rock and Walworth County, Inc. on a county-wide basis and approved by the administrative members.

NOW THEREFORE, JANESVILLE, BELOIT AND ROCK COUNTY HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 2(e) of the Agreement is amended to read as follows:
 "(e) Fifteen percent (15%) of the funds shall be used for HOME-eligible activities or projects administered by Community Action of Rock and Walworth County, Inc. on a county-wide basis and approved by the administrative members."
- 2. The sum of \$267,440.67 shall be transferred from a Rock County to Janesville.
- 3. All other terms, provisions, obligations, and promises set forth in the Agreement not specifically amended in this First Amendment shall remain in full force and effect.

Topic: Beloit Police Supervisory Association (BPSA) (Sergeants) Agreement for 2014-2017

Date: December 1, 2014

Presenter(s): Joe Simpson Department: Human Resources

Overview/Background Information:

The Agreement between the City of Beloit and the Beloit Police Supervisory Association (BPSA) expired on 12/31/13. The City and representatives from BPSA have reached a tentative agreement. The matter is now before the Council for approval.

Key Issues (maximum of 5):

- 1. Wages are increased by 2% for 2014, 0% for 2015, 1% for 2016 and 2017. These are slightly below average increases of comparable Wisconsin cities due to the economic state of the City.
- 2. Medical Insurance for those hired before 1/1/95 is unchanged. For those hired after 1/1/95; substantial changes in language to clarify vagueness of current contract language. Those retirees who are eligible for other group health insurance shall be required to enroll in that other group plan. The City will reimburse all costs to the retiree for the "other" group health insurance up to \$12,700 family / \$6,350 single, which follows the current ACA (Affordable Care Act) maximum out-of-pocket amounts set for CY 2014. The City will continue to use the ACA as the benchmark for reimbursement but has set a cap not to exceed \$20,000 family / \$10,000 single. A Health Reimbursement Account (HRA) will be established and funded via the Health Fund.
- 3. Post 1/1/95 retirees will be allowed to remain on the COB health plan if no other group coverage available, until Medicare eligible age.
- 4. Annual VEBA (Voluntary Employee's Beneficiary Association) contributions will be \$675 in 2014 and 2015; \$750 in 2016; \$825 in 2017.
- 5. The gratuity pay increased from 4 to 6 weeks for employees retiring that were hired after 1/1/95. Increased additional gratuity pay from 2 to 4 weeks if a post 1/1/95 retiree has 120 days of sick leave balance at the time of retirement.

Conformance to Strategic Plan (List key goals this action would support and briefly discuss its impact on the City's mission.): Goal 3. Continued promotion of a safe and healthy community.

Sustainability (Briefly comment on the sustainable long term impact of this policy or program related to how it will impact both the built and natural environment utilizing the four following eco-municipality guidelines.):

- Reduce dependence upon fossil fuels –
- Reduce dependence on chemicals and other manufacturing substances that accumulate in nature –
- Reduce dependence on activities that harm life sustaining eco-systems –
- Meet the hierarchy of present and future human needs fairly and efficiently –

Action required/Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Council adopt the proposed resolution for the BPSA Agreement (2014 – 2017)

Fiscal Note/Budget Impact:

Wages have been budgeted appropriately for 2014 and will be for 2015 and throughout the terms of the Agreement.

1). Amend Article III – DURATION; as follows:

ARTICLE III - DURATION

This agreement shall be effective January 1, 2014 and shall remain in effect until December 31, 2017, and shall be automatically renewed from year to year thereafter unless either party shall notify the other in writing 120 days prior to the anniversary date that it desires to modify or terminate the agreement. In the event notice is given the parties shall meet and confer not later than 90 days before the anniversary date. This agreement shall remain in full force and effect during the entire period that the parties meet and confer for a successor agreement, and shall automatically be extended until such time as the successor agreement is approved by both parties, effective date of termination not withstanding.

3). Amend Article XXX – WAGES; as follows:

Wage Increase

2014 - 2%

2015 - 0%

(Add reopener language for mutual discussion to take place by 8/15/15) ("me too" clause in reference to all other compensation agreed upon with IAFF)

2016 - 1%

2017 - 1%

5). Amend Article XIII – SICK LEAVE; as follows:

Employees hired on or after January 1, 1995, retiring from active duty, and receiving annuities from the Wisconsin Retirement Fund, shall receive a maximum of six (6) weeks gratuity pay paid to the employee's paid to the employee at the time of retirement. Employees hired prior to January 1, 1995, shall receive a maximum of two (2) weeks gratuity pay, from their sick leave bank, paid to the employee at the time of retirement. Upon retirement, any employee retiring with the maximum of one hundred twenty (120) days total in their bank will also receive four (4) weeks gratuity pay paid to the employee at the time of retirement.

6). Amend Article XXI – MEDICAL INSURANCE; as follows:

For the term of this Agreement, the Employer shall contribute to the Plan for each Eligible Employee the amount of \$390 per year in 2002 and 2003 and \$510 per year in 2004. Beginning January 1, 2008 the City's contribution will be \$675 per year. For the term of this agreement, the Employer shall contribute for each eligible employee the amount of \$675 in 2014 and 2015; \$750 in 2016; \$825 in 2017. Additionally, upon termination, up to two (2) weeks or four (4) weeks of the Eligible Employee's accumulated sick leave balance that would otherwise have been paid to the Eligible Employee (see Article XIII) had the Employer not participated in the Plan. In order to minimize the risk of this Plan being found discriminatory under Section 105 (h) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (Code), the Administrator may request that a contribution amount to a highly compensated eligible employee's account be reduced to the maximum amount contributed on behalf of a non-highly compensated eligible employee. If such a request is made, the reduction amount shall be paid to the employee in the form of wages.

ARTICLE XXI - MEDICAL INSURANCE

The City shall pay the premium costs for medical, dental and hospital insurance coverage provided by the City for each member of the Association and his/her dependents, including eligible retired employees and their dependents, for the duration of the agreement. After the employee is eligible for and receives Medicare, coordination of benefits will be as described in the health plan document.

The Drug Program will include drug utilization review and a drug formulary for retail and mail order as determined at the sole discretion of the City.

Members of the Association retiring under the Wisconsin Retirement Fund as a result of an injury incurred within the scope of employment shall remain in the medical, dental and hospital insurance plan (including widow and dependent children) with the full cost paid by the City. To maintain medical insurance, employees and eligible dependents must enroll, at the employee's expense, in Medicare Part B at the time of eligibility.

For employees hired on or after January 1, 1995, eligibility for medical, dental and hospital insurance shall cease when a retiree becomes eligible for other paid health insurance, becomes eligible for Medicare, or attains age 65, whichever occurs first.

For employees hired before January 1, 1995

Employees hired before January 1, 1995, retiring under honorable conditions or duty incurred injury or disease, from active employment and receiving an annuity from the Wisconsin Retirement Fund as Beloit Police Officers and their dependents (including widow/er and dependent children) shall be retained by the City as members of the eligible medical, hospital, and dental insurance group, under the plan document in effect at the time of retirement and the City shall pay the full premium cost.

For employees hired after January 1, 1995

For employees hired on or after January 1, 1995, retiring under honorable conditions or duty incurred injury or disease, from active employment and receiving an annuity from the Wisconsin Retirement Fund as Beloit Police Officers and their dependents (including widow/er and dependent children)

shall be eligible to remain in the group health and dental plan, however, eligibility shall cease when the retiree becomes eligible for Medicare or another group health insurance plan (other than the City of Beloit), then the retiree and their dependents are required to enroll in that other group plan. The City agrees to reimburse on a monthly basis the premium cost, in addition to deductibles, copays, and coinsurance expenses, paid for that period, subject to the maximum contributions set forth herein. The maximum annual City reimbursement for premium, deductibles, copays, and coinsurance will be based upon PHS Act Section 1302(c)(1), per the Affordable Care Act, which is \$6,350 single/\$12,700 family annually for calendar year 2014. For future years, the City agrees to reimburse on a monthly basis the premium cost, in addition to deductibles, copays, and coinsurance expenses, paid for that period up to the applicable single and/or family maximums set by the Affordable Care Act for that calendar year; however, annual reimbursements, during any year of retirement, shall not exceed \$10,000 single/\$20,000 family.

The retiree will be reimbursed payment of premiums and any deductibles, coinsurance and copayments from a Retiree Health Reimbursement Account (HRA) established by the City. The HRA accounts will be set up to reimburse retirees on a monthly basis after a request for reimbursement of the appropriate amount is made by the Retiree with the appropriate documentation. Appropriate documentation for reimbursement can include an Explanation Of Benefits (EOB) with regard to the deductible,

coinsurance and copayment and/or a pay statement reflecting the premium contribution amount.

The retiree and any dependents receiving reimbursements under this program shall not participate in City's Group Health Plan and shall not be eligible to re-enroll or participate in the City's Group Health Plan. In the event the other group insurance is no longer available and the retiree acquires health insurance elsewhere, the retiree and dependent spouse/domestic partner shall continue to be reimbursed under the Health Reimbursement Account (HRA). Upon eligibility for Medicare of retiree, all reimbursements under the Retiree Health Reimbursement Account (HRA) will end.

Upon retirement, in the event a retiree is not eligible for coverage with another group health insurance plan, then the retiree and eligible dependents may remain in the City's group health and dental plan. Retirees shall be subject to any modifications of benefits, plan design, or carrier that the City may implement in the future and apply uniformly to the active employee's insurance plan. At the age of Medicare eligibility, retirees and their dependents that remain eligible for health care continuation, shall enroll in Medicare and will be responsible to pay the entire Medicare premium.

The City may, at its sole discretion, offer a supplemental or a fully insured policy to retirees after they reach Medicare eligibility. If such a program is offered, retirees may participate in any plan offered by the City with the retiree paying the full cost of the plan. The City reserves the right to stop offering a Medicare supplement plan at any time for any reason.

The City agrees to establish a Section 125 Plan in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Service Code at no cost to the City.

The City agrees to establish a Voluntary Employee's Beneficiary Association (VEBA) in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Service Code at no cost to the City For the term of this agreement, the Employer shall contribute for each eligible employee the amount of \$675 in 2014 and 2015; \$750 in 2016; \$825 in 2017.—except in 2005 the City will contribute \$510 per year to a VEBA account for each employee. Beginning January 1, 2006, the City's contribution will be \$560 per year and beginning January 1, 2007, the City's contribution will be \$610 per year. Beginning January 1, 2008, the City's contribution will be \$675 per year.

Article XI – Page 10 – Bereavement

Immediate Family: In the event of the death of a member of an employee's immediate family, as that term is hereinafter defined, such employee shall be granted leave of absence without loss of pay for a period not to exceed three (3) working days, where absence from work is necessitated.

The term "immediate family" as used herein includes spouse, parents, stepparents, and grandparents of employee and spouse, children, stepchildren, brothers, sisters, grandchildren, half-brothers and sisters, foster parents, guardians and children of guardians.

Non-immediate Family: In the event of the death of a member of an employee's non-immediate family, as that term is hereinafter defined, such employee shall be granted a leave of absence without loss of pay for a period not to exceed two (2) working days, where absence from work is necessitated.

The term "non-immediate" family as used herein includes sister-in-law, brother-in-law, aunts, uncles, and cousins of the employee.

IMMEDIATE FAMILY:

In the event of the death of a member of an officer's immediate family, as that term is hereinafter defined, such officer shall be granted leave of absence without loss of pay for a period not to exceed three (3) working days, where absence from work is necessitated.

The term "immediate" family as used herein includes spouse, domestic partner as defined in Wis. Stats. 40.02(21c) and 770.01(1), parents, foster parents, step-parents and grandparents of employee and spouse, children, step-children, current son-in-law, current daughter-in-law, brothers, sisters, grandchildren, half-brothers and sisters, guardians and children of guardians.

NON-IMMEDIATE FAMILY

In the event of the death of a member of an officer's non-immediate family, as that term is hereinafter defined, such officer shall be granted a leave of absence without loss of pay for a period not to exceed two (2) working days, where absence from work is necessitated.

The term "non-immediate" family as used herein includes, sister-in-law, brother-in-law, step-brother, step-sister, foster siblings, aunts and uncle, niece and nephew of the employee and the employee's spouse.

In the event an employee is requested to act as pallbearer, he shall be granted leave for a period of not more than four (4) hours for such purpose without loss of pay.

Time may be granted when extended travel is necessary or when an employee's emotional condition warrants additional time off, with pay, by approval of the Chief of Police.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

CITY OF BELOIT

AND THE

BELOIT POLICE SUPERVISORY ASSOCIATION

As a result of the negotiation for the 2014 - 2017 labor agreement between the City of Beloit and the Beloit Police Supervisory Association, the following items have been agreed to by the parties:

The parties agree to a meeting which will be scheduled by August 15, 2015 to discuss reopening Article XX Wages and Salary Schedule only for the years of 2016 – 2017. Information will be exchanged on positions of the parties for wages. The information will be limited to, All General Fund Revenue Fund increase, shared revenue, net new construction, and other pertinent data as it relates to the General Fund Revenue. After these discussions, either party may then seek to reopen the contract for purposes of renegotiating a change from the 1% wage increase scheduled for 2016 and 2017. The burden of proof showing an increase in General Fund Revenue will rest on the party requesting a change in the percentage.

If an impasse develops, either party may use the impasse procedure as outlined in Wisconsin Statutes 111.77.

- 1. Wages are increased by 2% for 2014, 1% for 2015, 1% for 2016, 1% on January 1, 2017 and also 1% the last pay date of 2017. These are slightly below average increases of comparable Wisconsin cities due to the economic state of the City.
- 2. Very limited operational issues. Seniority date for PT Bus Drivers will be the actual start date and not pro-rated. This pro-ration was due to previous #643 Public Works and Transit Unions being one.

1. **Article VI – Vacations**

- ocation from the date of employees will receive ten-twelfths of one workday per month paid vacation from the date of employment until the 31st of December of the same year. Newly hired part-time employees will receive 4 hours per month of paid vacation from the date of employment until the 31st of December of the same year. and All employees will be eligible for this vacation after January 1, of in the year following employment. If an employee leaves prior to the completion of one year of service, all pay for vacation will be withheld from the employee's final pay.
 - All full-time employees will receive two (2) weeks regular eighty (80) hours paid vacation pay on January 1 of each calendar year thereafter. All part-time employees will receive 60 hours paid vacation on January 1 each calendar year thereafter.
 - 6.3 Employees All full-time employees will be granted three (3) weeks receive 120 hours paid vacation with pay during on January 1 of the calendar year following the year in which they complete seven (7) five (5) years continuous full-time service. All part-time employees will receive 90 hours paid vacation on January 1 of the calendar year following the year in which they complete five (5) years continuous service.
 - Full-time employees will <u>receive 160 hours paid</u> be granted four (4) weeks vacation—with pay during the calendar year in which they complete fourteen (14) years of continuous full-time service. <u>All part-time employees will receive 120 hours paid vacation on January 1 of the calendar year following the year in which they complete twelve (12) years continuous service.</u>
 - Full-time employees will <u>receive 200 hours paid</u> be granted five (5) weeks vacation with pay during the calendar year in which they complete twenty-one (21) years of continuous full-time service. <u>All part-time employees will receive 150 hours paid vacation on January 1 of the calendar year following the year in which they complete twenty-one (21) years continuous service.</u>

Vacation shall be calculated on an hourly basis, not on a day basis, and shall be based on the employee's work day. (Example: Employees receiving three (3) weeks of vacation are entitled to one hundred twenty (120) hours of vacation. Employees approved for one-week (7 consecutive day off) of paid vacation will be charged have 40 hours deducted from their accrued leave for full-time employees, and 30 hours deducted from their accrued leave for part-time employees.

Revise Sections 6.10 as follows:

6.10 Employees will be given an opportunity to signify their choice of vacation dates within these work groups:

Additional personnel may be permitted on vacation with the approval of the immediate supervisor.

Employees within the specified divisions will be given the opportunity and may indicate their choice from November 1 to December 30 January 1 to February 28 for the following year in each year in increments of not less than one (1) week nor more than three (3) weeks of vacation time, which may include holidays. Employees indicating their choice of vacation dates of one (1) week increments or individual days or combination thereof after February 28 January 1, will not be entitled to seniority preference.

2. Article X – Leave of Absence

Revise Section 10.08 as follows to include:

10.08 Employees who are members of the National Guard or Military Reserves shall be granted temporary military leave for annual summer training sessions for a period not to exceed two (2) weeks. Employees will be paid the difference of their straight time wage and the military pay allowance, upon presentation of their pay voucher to the Personnel Office. The employee shall if possible give the department supervisor three (3) weeks' notice.

Employees who enter military service must give advance notice to the City of the impending service, unless notice is prevented by military necessity. Both the City

and the employee shall comply with the requirements of state and federal laws on military leave.

The City of Beloit will comply with the Uniformed Services and Reemployment Rights Act of 1994, as amended, to provide employment rights protections for person(s) who voluntarily or involuntarily leave employment to undertake military service.

3. Article XII – Suspension-Dismissal

Revise Article XII as follows:

- Suspension is defined as the temporary removal, without pay, of an employee from his/her designated position **for just cause**.
- Suspension for any just cause. The City may, for disciplinary reasons, suspend an employee at any time for just cause. An employee who is suspended, except probationary and seasonal employees, shall be given three (3) days written notice prior to the suspension; and a copy of the notice shall be provided to the Union. An immediate emergency suspension without pay may be made without notice in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public, the employee, or the workforce. The Employer shall meet with the employee and the Union Steward or designated Union officer prior to the suspension. Written reprimands and suspensions will remain in effect for a period of time not to exceed twelve (12) months, at which time they become null and void. Personnel files shall be open to employees, upon request to the Director of Human Resources or his/her designee, and examined in his/her presence.
- 12.3 No suspension for **Just** eCause shall exceed thirty (30) calendar days.
- 12.4 No change
- An employee may be dismissed or disciplined for <u>Just eC</u>ause at any time by the City. An employee who is dismissed or disciplined, except probationary or seasonal employees, shall be given written notice of the reasons for the action and a copy of the notice shall be sent to the Union President.
- Any employee who has been suspended or dismissed for <u>Just eCause</u> may use the grievance procedure by written notice to his/her division head. Such grievance shall be handled as provided in Article XIII of this Agreement.

4. Article XV - Year Round Part-Time Bus Drivers

Revise Article XV as follows:

15.01 The City will employ up to six (6) year round part-time bus drivers at Beloit

- Transit System under the following conditions:
- (a) No change.
- (b) No change.
- (c) When #643 positions are posted, full-time #643 employees will have preference over #643 year round part time bus drivers for the open positions. If the open position is a bus driver position, a full-time #643 employee who qualifies with the exception of a "P" endorsement on the employee's commercial driver's license (CDL) will be given two (2) weeks and training provided by the City to obtain the "P" endorsement and retain the bus driver position. If no full-time employees are interested in and qualified for the open position, the year round part time bus drivers shall be given pro-rated seniority preference for the position provided they have the required qualifications.
- (d) The seniority date for year round part-time bus drivers shall commence with the date of hire. and shall be pro-rated, e.g., 173.3 hours equals one (1) month seniority.
- (e) Year round part-time drivers shall have 60% of premium contribution paid for family health insurance coverage and 100% of single health insurance coverage.
- (f) Year round part-time bus drivers will receive vacation and holiday pay prorated according to the number of hours worked. Pro-ration shall be based on the number of hours worked in the previous calendar year. Until a year round-part-time bus driver has worked an entire calendar year, pro-ration shall be at 50%.
- This section is applicable only to employees hired on or before February 6, 2001: Year round part-time bus drivers will receive sick leave only for a non-work related injury or illness which makes it impossible for the employee to carry out his or her duties during an assignment of hours which has been posted in advance. Payment of sick leave shall be limited to the number of hours the employee was scheduled to work. Year round part-time bus drivers will not be paid when unable to respond due to illness to a call for fill-in driving on short notice. Year round part-time bus drivers will be limited to three (3) sick leave occurrences per year. Sections 8.05 through 8.09 shall also apply to year round part-time bus drivers.

No changes to 15.02 through 15.05.

15.06 This article applies only to year round part time bus drivers. The City agrees that the creation of this provision shall not be utilized in any future litigation, including interest arbitration, as a precedent for the creation of other part-time positions in Local #643.

5. Article XXI – Duration

Agreement effective January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2017.

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2014 – Effective 1/1/2014, an across the board increase of 2%; 2015 – Effective 1/1/2015, an across the board increase of 1%; 2016 – Effective 1/1/2016, an across the board increase of 1%; 2017 – Effective 1/1/2017, an across the board increase of 1%; Effective last payroll date of December, 2017, an across the board increase of 1%.
