#### BELOIT PARKS AND LEISURE SERVICES DIVISION TO CONDUCT ANNUAL PRESCRIBED BURN

#### **GREATER BELOIT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION HOLDS ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING**

The GBEDC held its annual membership meeting this past Wednesday morning. With a large membership in attendance, the group had an opportunity to meet the new CEO of Chicago Fittings, the latest company to select a Gateway site for their new business location. The company is relocating from the Belvidere area, will be constructing a 30,000 sq. ft. building, and initially employing about 15 individuals at the new Beloit location. The Executive Director's report went on to catalogue a significant number of industrial, institutional and commercial construction projects, either under construction or completed in the City during 2014, with additional projects anticipated in 2015.

### **ASSESSMENT APPEAL**

The City has appealed its 2013 commercial property equalized assessment and subsequently appealed the 2014 equalized assessment, since no settlement had been reached on the 2013 number. A meeting was held in Madison this past week between representatives of the City and Department of Revenue in an effort to settle the appeal. There was a good discussion between representatives of the City and the Department of Revenue, and an offer was extended by the City that would settle the difference in opinion regarding commercial assessments in the City over the last two years. The Department indicated they would take the matter under advisement and we anticipate hearing from them in the near future.

### 4. PUBLIC HEARINGS

a. Proposed ordinance amending the **Zoning District Map** to change the zoning district classification of the property located at 1524 Frederick Street from Single-family Residential District to Public Lands and Institutions District. This is an application made by the School District of Beloit in preparation for acquiring additional property for needed site improvements at McNeel Intermediate School.

### 6. CONSENT AGENDA

- a. Approval of the **Minutes** of the regular and special meetings of December 1, 2014.
- b. Application for a Conditional Use Permit to allow a day care use in a Low-density Multi-family Residential District, for the property located at 819 Clary Street. This application is being referred to the Plan Commission for their review and recommendation.
- c. Application for a bike path in **Stateline Prairie Restoration Park** located at 540 Colby Street. This bike path would connect the City of Beloit Turtle Creek Bike Trail to the Wheeler Avenue Bridge and continue south into the Illinois bikeway system. The City of South Beloit has obtained a grant and will be rebuilding the Wheeler Avenue Bridge and providing for a continuous bike path going south to connect into the existing northern Illinois bike trail system. That project is scheduled for construction in 2015 and the connector from the City's bike path will be constructed concurrently with the new Illinois system improvements. This project is being referred to the Plan Commission for their review and recommendation.
- d. Resolution approving a **Class "B" Beer and Reserve "Class B" Liquor License** for Eclipse Event Center. This is an existing license, which was held by a third party and has been relinquished and is being reissued to the Eclipse Event Center. The Alcohol Beverage License Control Committee has recommended for approval.
- e. Resolution approving a **Class "B" Beer and Reserve "Class B" Liquor License** for Lucy's #7 Burger Bar, 430 East Grand Ave. in the Phoenix building. This is the next main floor commercial occupancy planned for this building. The Alcohol Beverage License Control Committee recommends for approval.
- f. Resolution approving a 2-Lot **Certified Survey Map** for the properties located at 1400 and 1524 Frederick Street. This is a companion action to the earlier Zoning District Map amendment to support changes planned for the McNeel Intermediate School Plan Commission recommended for approval 7-0.

### 7. ORDINANCES

a. Substitute Amendment #1: Proposed Ordinance to add **No-Parking regulations** on Lovell Avenue. Traffic Review Committee voted to recommend approval of the ordinance restricting parking on Lovell Avenue. A resident appeared at Council's last meeting and asked that the no-parking restrictions be extended an

additional block. Staff has reviewed this recommendation with other adjacent property owners and is recommending approval of the substitute amendment, which includes the additional parking restrictions.

### 8. APPOINTMENTS

### 11. REPORTS FROM BOARD AND CITY OFFICERS

- a. Resolution authorizing the City Manager to accept an Offer to Purchase for the City-owned property located at 106 Bluff Street. This is a vacant lot that has been owned by the City for a number of years. It was included along with other properties in a resolution adopted by City Council in early 2003. There have been no offers to purchase over many years until the City received a recent offer to acquire the property for the purpose of building a new single-family residence. The City encourages not only new construction, but also owner-occupied residences in its' historic City Center neighborhoods.
- b. Resolution authorizing the City Manager to make an Offer to Purchase the Girl Scout Building in Big Hill Park. The Girl Scouts initially contacted the City Manager's office earlier this year, inquiring about the possibility of the City acquiring the existing Girl Scout building, which was built under a land lease and is located in Big Hill Park. The City and the Girl Scouts explored this option and the City does have an interest in acquiring the structure. The staff report provides details but basically the purchase price for the building would be \$75,000, which covers some transition and moving expenses that the Girl Scouts have in relocating their facility. There would also be some fixtures left on the site and the City would provide the Girl Scouts with 12 free programming dates in this or in another City facility each year, in recognition of the substantial donation. It should be noted that the original construction cost of the building was near \$1M. The closing is set to occur on or about May 1, 2015.
- c. Resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into a State/Municipal Agreement with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation for the Design and Construction of the Powerhouse Riverwalk. This project would relocate a portion of the riverfront bicycle/pedestrian path to the river side of the existing power plant, which is closed and is anticipated to be transferred to Beloit College to be repurposed as a health education facility. The City and the College applied for and received a grant to cover most of the costs for this project. This resolution authorizes the Intergovernmental Agreement with the State Department of Transportation required for this project to move forward.
- d. Resolution approving a **Development Agreement** between the City of Beloit and Chicago Fittings. Chicago Fittings is the latest company to select a site in the City's Gateway Business Park. The staff report attached to the agenda provides more details about this specific project. The company is relocating from a City in Illinois and will be building an approximately 30,000 sq. ft. structure and bringing 15 jobs to the community. Standard incentives have been offered by the City to secure this relocation and the company hopes to start construction as early in 2015 as the weather permits.
- e. Resolution authorizing the **Transfer of Funds** from the General Fund Contingency Reserve Account for 2014. Each year, the City includes in its' General Fund budget a contingency appropriation of \$200,000 to cover unanticipated or emergency expenditures which may occur during the year. In 2014, the unusually severe winter weather ended up costing considerably more than was originally appropriated in that account. The City staff is recommending that Council authorize the \$200,000 included in the contingency account, be transferred to the snow removal budget. In addition, staff is also recommending that an additional \$100,000 be appropriated from the available General Fund balance to ensure that there are adequate resources available to meet any weather situation which may arise prior to the conclusion of this fiscal year on December 31. While we do not anticipate needing the additional supplemental appropriation, we want to ensure that there are adequate funds available to close out the year.



### Annual Prescribed Burns in Beloit Parks

**December 10, 2014 – Beloit, WI:** The City of Beloit Parks & Leisure Services Division will conduct their annual Prescribed Burn program in designated park sites during the two (2) weeks of December 10-19, 2014, depending upon weather conditions.

Historically, natural wildfires played a very important role in shaping the natural prairie grassland that once covered over two million acres of Wisconsin. Today, less than 12,000 scattered acres still exist, and the use of Prescribed Burning Programs helps protect and maintain these natural prairie grassland areas.

The purpose of prescribed burns is multi-faceted and provides the following benefits:

- Reduces the amount of dead and dying plant material that hinders new plant growth in the spring.
- Recycles nutrients from old plant growth for use by growing plants.
- Promotes germination, growth, and flowering of native plants.
- Increases the diversity of native plant life.
- Controls encroachment of woody brush and trees into grasslands, including invasive species such as garlic mustard.

Prescribed Burn areas are generally conducted in the spring after snow melt and/or in the fall after leaf fall has concluded. These designated sites are typically burned on a 2-5 year interval, and in some cases annually to prevent overgrowth of a defined area.

This year, the Parks Division will only conduct prescribed burns in the following designated locations:

- Harper's Prairie (aka West Side Detention Pond), located at 2201 Whipple Street.
- Stateline Restoration Prairie, located at 540 Colby Street.
- Big Hill Park, located at 1101 Big Hill Road.

Consistent with practices as developed and conducted by the Wisconsin DNR and the US Fish and Wildlife Service, each park site is appropriately supervised and monitored by trained staff or volunteers from the City's Parks Division. These prescribed burns will only be conducted under the appropriate weather conditions, as safety is the top concern in implementation of this practiced program. If weather conditions are not appropriate for these prescribed burns, they will be postponed until a later date when the weather conditions are considered acceptable for this practice. 
