#### SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

In order to complete the first round of interviews with candidates for the City Manager's position, Council will hold two special meetings next week. The <u>attached</u> notices provide more information about the interview sessions scheduled for this coming **Monday, March 30 and Tuesday, March 31, 2015, beginning at 4:00 p.m.** At this stage in the interview process, candidate identities will not be revealed and Council will be in closed session for the interview process. At the current time, finalists selected following the first round of interviews will return to the City on April 9 and 10 to participate in a second round of interviews and activities, including making a public presentation, affording an opportunity for residents to observe and ask questions of the candidates. More about the public presentations and other aspects of the second round of interviews will be announced early in April.

#### COMPREHENSIVE POLICE DEPARTMENT STUDY AND ANALYSIS RESUMES NEXT WEEK

An evaluation team from Hillard Heintze, the consultants selected to do a comprehensive Police Department study and analysis, will be in the City beginning on Monday, March 30 and will remain in the community as long as it takes to complete their work. The team will be going over documents, looking at policies and procedures, interviewing all Police Department employees, as well as a large number of community and business leaders and others in the law enforcement profession that interact with the Beloit Police Department.

#### **CASINO UPDATE**

Representatives of the Ho Chunk Nation, including Tribal President Jon Greendeer, were in the City this past Monday evening when City Council considered a three year extension to the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) between the City, Rock County and the Ho Chunk Nation. The IGA relates to the Beloit Casino Project, which is still pending before the Department of the Interior. President Greendeer did bring some good news when we learned that the application is now actively being processed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs and apparently comments shared with the Nation regarding its' Environmental Impact Statement were relatively minor in nature, indicating that the completed application meets the criteria of the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act. Obviously, there are still many months of processing left as the application goes through an extensive review procedure described by both the Statute and the Agency's regulations. While there's still no guarantee as to the outcome, however, the Nation has been receiving positive feedback.

The three-year extension was positively acted upon by the County Board at their meeting on Thursday, March 26, and the Tribal legislature already approved the extension.

#### PRATT INDUSTRIES UPDATE

I know the community is interested in the Pratt Industries project, which will create 140+ new jobs in the Beloit community. We closed on the real estate transaction this week so that the company now owns the 40 acre site in the Gateway Business Park where their new manufacturing facility will be built. There are a few remaining details related to the site itself, which will be resolved over the next 30 days. Plan review is continuing, and a conference call was held between the principals this week to work out details related to the site plan requirements. The City's structural engineer is completing review of the building plan submittal. The Plan reviews have progressed far enough so that Pratt will be able to obtain an early start grading and foundation permit in time for them to begin construction in early April, as originally scheduled. The City anticipates having full building and site plan reviews completed and a full building permit and architectural review certificate issued probably by mid-April, well before the company will be ready to begin actual building construction.

#### SPRING YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Residents are reminded that the 2015 spring yard waste collection will begin on Monday, April 6 and conclude on Friday, April 17, 2015. During this period of time, the City will be collecting yard waste all five days of the week on your regular collection day. Yard waste must still be containerized and the City's yard waste sticker must be attached to each container or bundle. #### Absentee Voting In Person for the April 7, 2015 Spring Election Available Starting March 23, 2015

**March 16, 2015 – Beloit, WI:** Beginning Monday, March 23, 2015, electors registered to vote in the City of Beloit may cast an absentee ballot in person for the April 7, 2015 Spring Election. Electors who are not registered to vote and those who need to change their names and/or addresses must bring proof of residence to register. Please find the acceptable forms of proof of residence on the following page.

Late registration and absentee voting in person will be available from **Monday, March 23<sup>rd</sup> through Thursday, April 2<sup>nd</sup>** from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. in the City Clerk's office on the second floor of City Hall. Late registration and absentee voting will be available on **Friday, April 3<sup>rd</sup> from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor of City Hall in the hallway outside the Forum.** Electors who would like an absentee ballot mailed to them must make the request in writing via email to <u>lemirer@beloitwi.gov</u>; via mail to 100 State Street, Beloit, WI 53511; or in person at the City Clerk's office.

Photo identification or other **proof of identity will not** be required to obtain an absentee ballot or to obtain a regular ballot on Election Day at the polling place for this Election. Sample ballots are available in the Document Center on the City's website <u>www.beloitwi.gov</u> in the Voting and Election Documents folder.

## ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF PROOF OF RESIDENCE

One of the following is required to register to vote in the Clerk's office during the closed registration period or on Election Day at the Polling Place:

- A current and valid Wisconsin driver's license
- A current and valid Wisconsin identification card
- Any other Official ID Card or license issued by a Wisconsin Governmental body
- An ID card with your photo issued by an employer during the normal course of business (not including a business card)
- A real estate tax bill or receipt (for the current year or year before the election
- A residential lease which is effective for a period that includes Election Day
- A university, college, or technical college identification card (must include photo) together with a fee payment receipt issued to the cardholder by the university, college or technical college dated no earlier than 9 months before the date of the election at which the receipt is presented
- A utility bill for a period starting no earlier than 90 days before Election Day
- A bank statement or current pay check
- A government check or any other official document issued by a unit of government

**NOTE:** all of the above must contain a current and complete name, including both first and last name; and a current and complete residential address, including numbered street address, if any, and the name of the municipality. If the form has an expiration date, it must be valid on Election Day. **An individual may not register or vote without one of the above forms of proof of residence.**

#### Yard Waste Collection

**March 23, 2015** – Curbside collection of yard waste will take place Monday, April 6, 2015 through Friday, April 17, 2015. Collection will take place on your trash day.

Yard waste must be properly contained in a clean container, paper, or Back to Nature bio-degradable yard waste bag. Containers can be no larger than 39 gallons and weigh no more than 60 pounds. Yard waste cannot be contained in plastic bags. A \$1.50 sticker must be affixed to each bag, container and or bundles.

Stickers may be purchased at any City of Beloit Treasury Department, City of Beloit Department of Public Works Operations Facility, Grinnell Hall, Leisure Services, ACE Hardware stores, all Walgreen's locations and Woodman's.
