Armed Robbery of Pizza Delivery Driver – 1000 block of Summit Ave.

On 04/24/15 at 1209am. City of Beloit officers were flagged down by a pizza delivery driver who reported being robbed by three black males at an address in the 1000 block of Summit Ave in the City of Beloit. The driver reported that as he was walking up to the residence to deliver pizza, three black male subjects came up on him from behind. The driver said one of the subjects had a handgun. The driver said that this subject struck him with the weapon once to the side of his head. The driver was slightly injured but did not need medical attention. The driver said that an undetermined amount of cash was removed from his pocket and then all three subjects ran away taking the pizza / soda as well. The pizza and soda were discarded and recovered at the scene.

The three suspects were described black males, reported to be in their late teens, and about six feet tall. The suspects had bandanas covering their faces.

Janesville PD K-9 was requested and assisted with a track that ended in the 1600 block of Dewey at no specific address.

This investigation will be assigned to the Detective Bureau and is ongoing.
