ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTIONS 30.17(2)(b)2, (b)3, (b)6 AND (b)7a OF THE CODE OF GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BELOIT PERTAINING TO ELECTRONICALLY VARIABLE-MESSAGE SIGNS

The City Council of the City of Beloit, Rock County, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 30.17(2)(b)2 of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit is hereby amended to read as follows:

"2. Be permitted in C-2, C-3, and CBD and PLI zoning districts as secondary, onpremises signs."

Section 2. Section 30.17(2)(b)3 of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit is hereby amended to read as follows:

"3. Not exceed maximum allowable sign area as follows:

Zoning District	Maximum EVM Sign Area
C-2 <u>, &amp;</u> C-3 <u>, &amp; PLI</u>	75 sq. ft.
CBD	150 sq. ft.

An "on-premises, sign area bonus" may be permitted by §30.13(3) of this chapter."

Section 3. Section 30.17(2)(b)6 of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit is hereby amended to read as follows:

"6. Not be located in the vision triangle as defined in section 8-400 of the Zoning 
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<u>Code.Be set back as required by the Zoning Code.</u>"

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Section 4. Section 30.17(2)(b)7a of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit is hereby amended to read as follows:

"а.	Operate only between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. if the commercial
	establishment at which they are located abuts or is directly across the street
	from a residential zoning district."

<u>Section 5</u>. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect upon passage and publication.

#### **Overview/Background Information:**

City of Beloit staff has drafted an Ordinance to amend four sections of the City's Outdoor Sign Regulations, hereafter referred to as the "Sign Ordinance." The purpose of the proposed amendments is to allow the Central Christian Church on Milwaukee Road to use an Electronically Variable-Message (EVM) Sign to notify the public of programs at the church. The proposed Ordinance is attached.

#### Key Issues:

- The most substantive changes are listed below.
- Section 1 of the proposed Ordinance adds the PLI zoning district to the list of zoning districts permitted to have EVM signs as secondary, on-premise signs.
- Section 2 establishes maximum sign areas for EVM signs in the PLI zoning districts.
- Section 3 changes where EVM signs are allowed to be located with regards to the vision triangle.
- The Plan Commission reviewed this item on July 8, 2015, and voted unanimously (6-0) to recommend approval of the Sign Ordinance with two modifications.
  - Location: The original version of the Sign Ordinance proposed permitting EVM signs in PLI and C-1 zoning districts. The Plan Commission recommended only allowing EVM signs in the PLI zoning district.
  - Operating Time: The original version of the Sign Ordinance proposed establishments with EVM signs only have time restrictions if they abut a residential district. The Plan Commission recommended adding time restrictions on EVM signs for establishments that either abut a residential district OR are located directly across from a residential district.

The proposed Ordinance is attached.

#### PROCEEDINGS OF THE BELOIT CITY COUNCIL 100 State Street, Beloit WI 53511 City Hall Forum – 7:00 p.m. Monday, July 6, 2015

- 1. President Haynes called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Forum at Beloit City Hall.
- 2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE
- 3. SPECIAL ORDERS OF THE DAY/ANNOUNCEMENTS none.
- 4. PUBLIC HEARING
  - a. Community Development Director Julie Christensen presented an amended resolution authorizing a Conditional Use Permit to allow expanded Contractor Office & Storage Yard uses in a DH, Development Holding District, for property located at 2100 Newark Road. It was noted that Plan Commission recommended approval 7-0. As a condition of granting the amended Conditional Use Permit, the City Council does hereby stipulate the following conditions and restrictions upon the Conditional Use.
    - The conditions imposed on the applicant's 2014 CUP remain in full force and effect.
    - This amended CUP allows a 3,000 square-foot addition to an existing storage/shop building, along with temporary use of a converted manufactured home that will be used as office space during the construction process.
    - The temporary office use shall be discontinued when the building addition has been completed or in three years following approval, whichever occurs first. Gravel areas shall be paved at the conclusion of this project.
    - The applicant may continue to rent the existing single-family dwelling, but must maintain a Rental Dwelling Permit.
    - The applicant shall obtain an Architectural Review Certificate, a Certificate of Zoning Compliance, and a Building Permit prior to beginning construction of the building addition.
    - Any major changes in the adopted conditions or use of the property shall be approved by the Plan Commission and City Council by amending this Conditional Use Permit. The Director of Planning & Building Services may approve minor changes administratively.

President Haynes opened the public hearing. No one spoke. President Haynes closed the public hearing. Councilor's Luebke and De Forest made a motion to adopt the resolution. Motion carried on a vote of 7-0. File 8634.

- b. Community Development Director Julie Christensen presented a resolution authorizing a Conditional Use Permit to allow a Rooming House in a C-1, Office District, for the property located at 1105 East Grand Avenue. It was noted that Plan Commission recommended approval 6-0-1. As a condition of granting the CUP, the City Council does hereby stipulate the following restrictions upon the Conditional Use.
  - The property owner must obtain an annual rental permit from the Community and Housing Services Division
  - The rental term lengths for sleeping room tenants will be monthly in order to help maintain stability in the neighborhood and to prevent common problems associated with renting by the week or day.
  - The applicant will provide at least three parking spaces designated by signs for residents and guests of the rooming house, regardless of future tenant car ownership rates.

- The owner may rent a maximum of four sleeping rooms and one efficiency.
- The rooming house will house a maximum of five persons, including the supervisor.
- The applicant shall adhere to all regulations, including but not limited to those found in Section 7.32 of the Property Maintenance Code and Section 8.16 of the Plumbing Maintenance Code.
- No signs of any type may be displayed on the property.
- A transfer in property ownership will result in the immediate expiration of the CUP.
- If the required parking spaces for tenants are provided on a property adjacent to 1105 East Grand Avenue, the applicant needs to provide Staff with a shared parking agreement
- If City staff receives complaints stemming from the lack of on-site management from tenants, neighboring property owners, or elected or appointed City officials, staff reserves the right to re-review the conditions of this Conditional Use Permit with the Plan Commission and City Council.
- Any major changed in the adopted conditions or use of the property shall be approved by the Plan Commission and City Council by amending this Conditional Use Permit. The Planning and Building Services Director may approve minor changes administratively.

President Haynes opened the public hearing.

- Richard Mc Grath, Beloit, addressed the Council with concerns about this proposal. He presented a list of 12 names of people who also carry concerns. Mr. McGrath questioned whether or not this sets a precedent for Beloit for more houses like this and feels this Rooming House may not meet his definition of a basic neighborhood principle, in that it may not benefit the neighborhood. He also raised concerns about foot traffic, mainly school children who pass by this address often and said not knowing who will live there creates a perceived sense of concern.
- Matthew Finnegan, Beloit, addressed the Council as the owner of this building. He assured the council that having an on-site manager will allow more surety in selecting residents and given that it's her home too, there will be expectations of the residents to be good neighbors. Mr. Finnegan explained that there is a market for this time of housing and he is proud of the design of this rooming house. There will be on-site housekeeping, TV, cable and Wi-Fi, all for monthly rent of \$400-500. His marketing target will begin with Beloit College but he also mentioned a lack of sponsor families for foreign students attending Rock County Christian School. He said doesn't like the sunset clause as his intention was to eventually sell the building to an owner-occupied person like the on-site manager. He is supportive of all other conditions set forth in the CUP. The on-site manager, Perry Bale, explained that she is excited for this Rooming House plan and believes that it will attract quality tenants. She said she has been a caretaker for 15 years and assured that if this Rooming House does set a precedent for Beloit, it will be a good one that is run well.

President Haynes closed the public hearing. Councilor's Luebke and De Forest made a motion to adopt the resolution. Councilors Kelly and Luebke made a motion to amend the Resolution to add a condition to the resolution that the property owner work with the Community Development staff to establish a landscaping plan on the property that would be acceptable for staff approval. Motion to amend carried 6-1 with Councilor Sloniker voting in opposition. Motion as amended carried on a vote of 7-0. File 8692.

- c. Community Development Director Julie Christensen led a public hearing to solicit input on the Community Development, Housing, and Homeless needs in the City for Inclusion in the 2016 Annual Action Plan and Resolution approving **2016 Community Development Block Grant** (CDBG) Local Funding Priorities. The proposed priorities are:
  - Public Service Programs which focus on comprehensive case management strategies, with priority given to neighborhood stabilization activities, education in budgeting and life skills, and employment training that corresponds with local employment opportunities.
  - Code Enforcement
  - Housing Rehabilitation
  - Economic Development Activities, with priority given to Technical Job Training
  - Program Administration
  - Fair Housing

President Haynes opened the Public Hearing.

• Marc Perry and Lynn Volburn spoke on behalf of the Community Action Center at 20 Eclipse Center. Mr. Perry explained that he was pleased and supportive of the priorities and seeks to address what he feels is a gap that exists with youth and adults in a population that is hardest to serve. He further explained that this population includes those who are at the center of medium-high risk where existing prevention and corrections strategies don't currently serve. He stated that 37% of the youth living in the City of Beloit live at or below the poverty level and strategies to break that cycle should be a priority for this community. He said that these youths seek to live in safe environments and receive training in order to seek gainful employment. These job training funds will be a great asset.

President Haynes closed the public hearing. Discussion followed. Councilor's Luebke and Sloniker made a motion to adopt the resolution. Motion carried on a vote of 7-0. File 8693.

#### 5. CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

a. Rick Brunton, 751 Euclid Avenue, Beloit addressed the Council in favor of item 6.c. Mr. Brunton welcomed the new City Manager to Beloit and gave a comprehensive background of the Move to Amend organization and the values they represent. He explained that they have been successful in more than 600 communities in 17 states; 59 of those communities passing resolutions or referendums here in Wisconsin. Mr. Brunton and the Move to Amend Organization is calling for an amendment to the US Constitution to state that inalienable rights belong to human beings only, and that money is not a form of protected free speech under the First Amendment and can be regulated in political campaigns. He hopes the City Council will unanimously place the proposed referendum question on the April 5, 2016 ballot for the citizens of Beloit.

Councilor De Forest asked Ms. Stottler what her office intends to do to promote this referendum. Clerk Stottler explained that she has a legal responsibility to publish a Type A notice the 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday in November to announce that there will be a referendum, and a Type C notice of referendum, as well as an explanatory statement which describes the effect of a 'yes' or 'no' vote. Councilor De Forest asked where those would be published and asked for these notices to also be sent to the Stateline News in addition to our official newspaper since it is free. Ms. Stottler agreed. Councilors Luebke and Kincaid made a motion to adopt the Resolution. Motion carried 7-0. File 8182

- Councilor Hendrix said that she attended the Back to Beloit event; Summer Gospel Jam; BIF Lego Movie on the lawn and the Fireworks.
- Councilor Sloniker said that she attended committee meetings of Golf Committee, Equal Opportunities Commission, Police & Fire Commission, Strategic Planning Workshop and Porter Avenue Watch group. She also attended BIF Lego Movie on the lawn and a picnic in Vernon Park. She is looking forward to the Parks tour.
- Councilor Kelly said that he attended the Summer Gospel Jam and Snappers game with fireworks.
- Councilor Luebke said that he attended the OV Schaeffer event with the City Manager; Music at Harry's Place on Friday nights and an event at the Beloit Fine Arts Incubator.
- Councilor De Forest said that she attended the Sun Valley Strawberry Fest; Summer Gospel Jam; June 25 Rock County Board; committee meetings of the PFC and Planning Commission. She also attended a Municipal Leader's breakfast and the Farmer's Market.
- Councilor Kincaid said that he attended the Golf Committee meeting. Encouraged people to get to the Farmer's market as it's getting better each week.

#### 10. CITY MANAGER'S PRESENTATIONS

- a. Beloit Public Library Director, Nick Dimassis presented information about the "Hearing Loops Program." Mr. Dimassis introduced his co-presenters as Steve Platteter, Director of the Arrowhead Library System; and Dr. Lisa Kosmicki, an audiologist with the Beloit Health System. Hearing Loops are a wire that circles a meeting room or service desk and is connected to a sound system. The loop transmits sound electromagnetically to a wireless receiver called a T-coil in the user's hearing aid or cochlear implant. With the loop, the microphone from the sound system becomes the microphone to the person's hearing instrument. Hearing loops help overcome the listening challenges of distance from the speaker and back-ground noise. Many Libraries in Rock County have Loops at the Service Desk including Beloit, Clinton, Edgerton, Evansville, Janesville, Milton and Orfordville. Mr. Platteter explained that these were made possible through LSTA (Library Services and Technology Act) funds under a project through the Wisconsin DPI. Partners in the project include the ADRC of Rock County and the Wisconsin School for the Deaf. The first grant of \$5,000 added loop boxes at the 7 library service desks. The second phase grant of \$25,000 added the room size systems at Beloit, Edgerton and Janesville. Mr. Dimasses invited interested parties to attend a kick-off event on Wednesday, July 15<sup>th</sup> at the Beloit Public Library beginning at 5:30pm, where Audiologist, Dr. Juilette Sterkens will present and people can hear for themselves about the Hearing Loops Program.
- b. Finance and Administrative Services Director Eric Miller presented the 2014 Audit Report. Mr. Miller thanked staff in the City Manager's Office, the Treasury, the Accounting Division, and the Finance Division for their assistance with the Audit. He explained that the full audit has been placed online for Councilors and the public under the Finance Department tab. Mr. Miller introduced Carla Gogin, Baker Tilly Virchow Krause, LLP, who presented the City's 2014 Audit of the general fund and utility accounts, respectively.

#### **Overview/Background Information:**

Michelle Crossby has filed an application for a Conditional Use Permit to allow a single-family attached dwelling in C-2, Neighborhood Commercial District, for the property located at 911 East Grand Avenue in the City of Beloit. The applicant is seeking permission to convert the upstairs of the building at the subject property into a residence.

#### Key Issues:

- The applicant has proposed allowing a residence on the second floor of the building on the subject property.
- The applicant owns the building and the animal grooming business located on the first floor.



**Topic**: An Ordinance to Repeal and Recreate Section 1.10 of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit Pertaining to Emergency Management

Date: July 20, 2015

#### Overview/Background Information:

The City of Beloit has reorganized the Emergency Management Function and reassigned these duties to operate under the auspices of the Fire Department. This ordinance repeals and recreates Chapter 1.10 of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit.

The goal of this ordinance change was to mirror state statute for terminology and to be compliant with the National Incident Management System and the National Response Framework. The Emergency Management Function should be performed as a critical supporting role in accordance with the national response model. Our previous ordinance created a model where the Emergency Management Function was actually performing a command function instead of a support function.

#### Key Issues (maximum of 5):

- Previously the ordinance was also void of interim successors for the Director of Emergency Management Services this ordinance creates a line of succession.
- This ordinance also reflects changes in the continuity of government line of succession for the City Manager. It is extremely
  important to make sure we reflect the line of authority based on our current operating capacity.
- This ordinance expands involvement of all the city management team in emergency management.
- This ordinance adopts minimum training standards for all employees in compliance with the National Incident Management System.
- Finally, emergency operations will adopt the National Incident Management System as our common operating platform for incident management.

## AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AND RECREATE SECTION 1.10 OF THE CODE OF GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BELOIT PERTAINING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

The City Council of the City of Beloit, Rock County, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 1.10 of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows:

### **"1.10 EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT.**

- (1) AUTHORITY. This section is enacted pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 323 of the Wisconsin Statutes.
- (2) POLICY AND PURPOSE.
  - (a) Emergency Management requires the preparation for and the carrying out of all emergency functions, other than functions for which the military forces are primarily responsible, to minimize and repair injury and damage resulting from disasters of all kinds, including enemy action and natural and unforeseen disasters. It is, therefore, necessary to:
    - 1. Establish a local comprehensive Emergency Management Plan.
    - 2. Provide for the exercise of necessary powers during emergencies resulting from disaster; and
    - 3. Provide for cooperation and mutual assistance between the City of Beloit and other political subdivisions.
    - 4. Collaborate with private individuals and entities for the purpose of preparing for, responding to, and recovering from such disasters and emergencies.
  - (b) It is further declared to be the purpose of this section and the policy of the City that all emergency management functions of the City shall be carried out pursuant to this section and the comprehensive Emergency Management Plan developed hereunder, as part of a countywide emergency management program to the maximum extent practicable. Existing services and resources of this City shall be used as needed. All of this shall be carried out within the framework of Chapter 323 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

- (3) DEFINITIONS. Except as otherwise specifically provided in this section, the definitions outlined in Chapter 323 of the Wisconsin Statutes are hereby adopted and, by reference, made a part of this section as if fully set forth herein, including any subsequent amendments or revisions thereto.
- (4) DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT SERVICES.
  - (a) <u>Appointment</u>. The Fire Chief, or his/her designee, shall be the Director of Emergency Management for the City of Beloit. For the purposes of this section, any reference to the Director of Emergency Management shall mean the Director or his/her designee.
  - (b) <u>Duties and Authority</u>.
    - 1. The Director of Emergency Management shall have direct responsibility for the organization, administration, and operation of emergency management within the framework of the City's Emergency Management Plan, subject to the direction of the City Manager and the City Council.
    - 2. The Director of Emergency Management shall serve as chairperson for the Emergency Management Committee. The Director of Emergency Management may establish subcommittees and/or task forces at any time to enhance training, planning, or to prepare various prevention and response strategies to individual risks. Subcommittees and task forces may contain members of the Emergency Management Committee as well as other selected individuals having specialized knowledge, skills, or training that can assist the City in assessing risk and preparing appropriate responses.
    - 3. The Director of Emergency Management shall coordinate all activities for emergency management within the City and shall maintain liaison and cooperate with emergency management in local, state and federal governments.
    - 4. The Director of Emergency Management shall prepare a comprehensive plan for the emergency management of the City.
    - 5. The Director of Emergency Management shall participate in county and state emergency management activities when requested, and shall have such additional responsibilities as may from time to time be required by the City Manager or the City Council.
    - 6. In preparing and executing the Emergency Management Plan, the Director of Emergency Management Services shall utilize the services, equipment, supplies, and facilities of the City to the maximum extent practicable. All city personnel are directed to cooperate with and

extend such services and facilities to the Director of Emergency Management Services.

- (5) EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE.
  - (a) <u>Membership</u>. There is hereby created a City of Beloit Emergency Management Committee. The Emergency Management Committee shall consist of the City Manager, the City Council President, all City department heads, the Director of Emergency Management, the Deputy Director of Emergency Management Services for Planning, and the Deputy Director of Emergency Management Services for Operations.
  - (b) <u>Powers and Duties</u>. The Emergency Management Committee shall be responsible for advising the City Council and shall have the authority to conduct all matters of business regarding hazard mitigation, emergency planning, response support, and disaster recovery of natural and man-made disasters.
  - (c) <u>Meetings</u>. The Emergency Management Committee shall meet periodically to coordinate emergency preparedness and shall convene as soon as possible upon the declaration of an emergency. Special meetings may be called at the direction of the committee chairperson.
  - (d) <u>*Response*</u>. Upon notice of a declaration of emergency, each committee member shall respond immediately to the Emergency Operations Center to await further instructions.
- (6) DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT SERVICES.
  - (a) <u>Appointment</u>. The Director of Emergency Management Services may appoint one or more individuals to serve as Deputy Director(s) of Emergency Management Services to assist with performing emergency management activities.
  - (b) <u>Powers and Duties</u>. A Deputy Director of Emergency Management Services appointed in this section shall be under the supervision of the Director of Emergency Management Services and shall perform such day to day duties as are necessary to support planning, training and coordination of emergency management activities.
- (7) EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAN. The Director of Emergency Management Services shall prepare a comprehensive plan for the emergency management of the City of Beloit. Each department of the City shall collaborate with the Director of Emergency Management Services for the purpose of creating an Emergency Management Plan. The Emergency Management Plan created hereunder is hereby approved and adopted by the City Council. The plan shall be filed with the City Clerk and shall be reviewed, updated and submitted to the City Council for approval at least once every three (3) years.

### (8) DECLARATION OF EMERGENCIES.

### (a) <u>Declaration of Emergency by the City</u>.

- 1. The City Council is empowered by §323.11, Wis. Stats., to declare, by ordinance or resolution, an emergency existing within the City of Beloit whenever conditions arise by reason of a riot or civil commotion, a disaster, or an imminent threat of a disaster, that impairs transportation, food or fuel supplies, medical care, fire, health or police protection, or other critical systems of the City of Beloit.
- 2. The City Council may, by ordinance or resolution, promulgate any orders, rules, and regulations relating to the conduct of persons and the use of property as shall be necessary and expedient to protect the public peace, health, safety, protection and welfare of persons or property, including prohibiting, restricting, and removing all unnecessary traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian, from highways within the City, and to insure the cooperation necessary in emergency management activities.
- 3. The period of the emergency shall be limited by the ordinance or resolution to the time during which the emergency conditions exist or are likely to exist.
- (b) <u>Declaration by the Governor</u>. The Governor for the State of Wisconsin is empowered by §323.10, Wis. Stats., to issue an executive order declaring a state of emergency for the State of Wisconsin, or any portion thereof, if the Governor determines that an emergency resulting from a disaster or the imminent threat of a disaster exists. The state of emergency shall not exceed 60 days, unless the state of emergency is extended by joint resolution of the Wisconsin State Legislature. The executive order may be revoked at the discretion of either the Governor by executive order or the Wisconsin State Legislature by joint resolution.

### (9) EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT OPERATIONS AND ORGANIZATION.

- (a) <u>City Manager</u>.
  - 1. The City Manager shall oversee all operations at the Emergency Operations Center and shall have final decision-making authority throughout the state of emergency.
  - 2. Whenever necessary to respond to an emergency for which adequate ordinances or resolutions have not been adopted by the City Council, the City Manager, or in his/her absence, the person in charge as determined by the order of succession established in subsection (11), below, may, by proclamation, promulgate and enforce such orders,

rules, and regulations that appear necessary and expedient. Any proclamation issued hereunder shall be subject to ratification, alteration, modification or repeal by the City Council as soon as the Council can meet. Subsequent action taken by the City Council shall not affect the validity of the proclamation issued by the City Manager.

- 3. The City Manager shall issue all necessary proclamations, warnings, and alerts as required by the Emergency Management Plan.
- (b) <u>Emergency Operations Center Manager</u>. The Emergency Operations Center Manager will be the member of the Emergency Management Committee and will be appointed by the City Manager and generally determined by whose response discipline would be the primary responder to the emergency (i.e. SWAT incident—Police Chief, snow emergency—Public Works Director).

### (c) <u>Operations</u>.

- 1. Upon declaration of a state of emergency affecting the City of Beloit, members of the Emergency Management Committee shall serve as the Emergency Operations Center Command Staff under the general direction of the Emergency Management Coordinator. Additional staff may be appointed or designated to serve on the Committee depending upon the emergency type, length or duration.
- 2. Normal City operations shall continue unless suspended by order or directive of the City Manager. The City Manager may require City personnel to perform services performed in the normal and general course of employment to address the state of emergency.
- 3. The Emergency Operations Center Command Staff shall plan, direct, coordinate, and control all facets of emergency management operations from the moment an emergency has been formally declared and until the state of emergency is formally lifted.
- 4. During a state of emergency, the City Manager may contract with any person to provide equipment or services to be used to respond to a disaster, or the imminent threat of a disaster.
- (10) LOCATION OF EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER. The Emergency Operations Center shall be located the Beloit Police Department Briefing Room at 100 State Street in the City of Beloit unless that site becomes unsuitable or unusable. In the event that the primary Emergency Operations Center becomes unsuitable or unusable, the Emergency Operations Center shall be located at the Fire Department Headquarters at 1111 Church Street in the City of Beloit. The Emergency Operations Center shall serve as the primary location and control facility from which members of the Emergency Management Committee and their designees shall direct emergency management activities within the City.

- (11) SUCCESSION TO OFFICE. During an emergency, and in the absence of the City Manager, interim successors to the Office of the City Manager shall be in the order listed below:
  - (a) City Attorney
  - (b) Police Chief
  - (c) Fire Chief
  - (d) Finance and Administrative Services Director
- (12) MUTUAL AID AGREEMENTS. The City Manager may, subject to the approval of the City Council, enter into mutual aid agreements with other political subdivisions, agencies, and federally recognized American Indian tribes and bands of this state, and, upon prior approval of the Adjutant General, with such entities in bordering states. A copy of each agreement shall be filed with the Office of the Adjutant General of the Department of Military Affairs within 10 days after execution of the agreement.
- (13) PROHIBITED CONDUCT. No person shall willfully obstruct, hinder, or delay any member of the emergency management organization in the enforcement of any order, rule, regulation, or plan issued pursuant to this section, or violate any order, rule, regulation, or plan issued pursuant to the authority contained in this section. Any person who shall violate any provision of the section shall upon conviction thereof be subject to a penalty as provided in 25.04 of this code."

<u>Section 2</u>. Section 25.04(4)(c) of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit is hereby amended to add in numerical order to the Schedule of Cash Deposits the following penalty provision for violations of the Emergency Management Ordinance:

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect upon passage and publication.
