



Beloit Police Department Recruiting Four New Officers

July 30, 2015— The Beloit Police Department is preparing to hire four new officers to fill existing vacancies and ensure our ability to provide quality law enforcement service to our community. The positions are not new but stem from attrition and retirement scenarios. According to Interim Police Chief David Zibolski, it is critical to maintain our personnel levels in to order to provide stability as the Department moves into a modern policing agency.

“We are fortunate to be able to add these officers to our department,” says Zibolski. “The additions will compliment a police force dedicated to serving and protecting the residents and business owners of our community.” As part of the recruiting effort, the Department has established a new Applicant Assessment and Recruitment Team. A key goal of the team will be the addition of a community component to the assessment process.
