HOLIDAY SCHEDULE FOR THE CITY OF BELOIT

All City offices and the Beloit Public Library will be closed on December 24 and 25 in celebration of the Christmas holiday, and closed again the following week on December 31 and January 1, 2016 in celebration of the New Year's holiday.

City of Beloit residents are advised that trash and recycling will not be collected on Friday, December 25 in observance of the Christmas holiday. Collection will be delayed by one day. The Recycling Drop Off Center at 2351 Springbrook Court will be closed on Saturday, December 26, 2015.

City of Beloit residents are advised that trash and recycling will not be collected on Friday, January 1 in observance of the New Year's holiday. Collection will be delayed by one day. The Recycling Drop Off Center at 2351 Springbrook Court will be closed on Saturday, January 2, 2016.

REMINDER

Many residents will have out of town guests visiting this holiday season. We want to remind you of our "Alternate Side Parking" regulations, in effect between the hours of 12:01 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. in the City of Beloit year 'round. Parking should take place only on the even numbered side of the street on even numbered days of the month, and on the odd numbered side of the street on odd numbered days of the month. This enables the City Street Sweeper to keep your street clean! (Municipal Ordinance 13.03)

CITY COUNCIL MEETING - MONDAY, DECEMBER 21, 2015

The City Council will hold a <u>Workshop</u> in the City Manager's Conference Room at 6:30 p.m. to review the agenda of the regular 7:00 p.m. City Council meeting.

The attached agenda is for the Monday, December 21, 2015 regular City Council meeting beginning at 7:00 p.m. in the Forum.

4. PUBLIC HEARINGS

- a. Proposed Ordinance amending the Future Land Use Map of the City of Beloit Comprehensive Plan to change the future land use designation for the property located at 1633 Keeler Avenue from Institutional and Community Services to Mixed Residential. The applicant proposed the adaptive reuse/redevelopment of the Kolak Education Center into a multifamily residential community with up to 33 dwelling units. After multiple meetings and hearing from staff and residents, Plan Commission recommends denial 5-0.
- b. Resolution authorizing a **Planned Unit Development (PUD)** Master Land Use Plan, for property located at 1633 Keeler Avenue (Kolak Education Center). The predominant surrounding land use is single-family residential. After multiple meetings with residents and staff, Plan Commission recommends denial 5-0.
- c. Proposed Ordinance amending the **Zoning District Map** to change the zoning district classification from PLI, Public Lands & Institutions District to PUD, Planned Unit Development District, for property located at 1633 Keeler Avenue (Kolak Education Center). The applicant submitted an application to recommend Mixed Residential uses for this subject property. A petition signed by 173 neighbors was submitted in opposition to the applicant's request. Plan Commission recommends denial 5-0.
- d. Resolution approving Vacation of an Alley between Johnson/Townline. Plan Commission recommends approval 5-0.

6. CONSENT AGENDA

- a. Approval of the **Minutes** of the Regular Meeting of December 7, 2015.
- b. Resolution approving **Change of Agent** for Pilot Travel Center #289, located at 3001 Milwaukee Road, from David Hauck to Brenda K. Boss. Ms. Boss is a resident of Wisconsin, meets the qualifications for the appointment as required by state law, and the Police Department has no objection. Alcohol Beverage License Control Committee reviewed and recommends approval 5-0.
- c. Resolution approving a **Remembrance Garden in Horace White Park**, 825 E. Grand Avenue. Family Services of Southern Wisconsin and Northern Illinois will pay for this project, which is a proposed garden memorial dedicated to individuals who have suffered interpersonal violence. Family Services will use volunteers to perform maintenance and upkeep on the memorial garden. Plan Commission recommends approval 6-0.
- d. Resolution approving Emergency Ambulance Service Agreement with the Town of Turtle. The City of Beloit Fire Department has provided ambulance service to the Town of Turtle for the last 40 years. This agreement will continue that service, with the Town of Turtle reimbursing the city the designated amount listed in the Ambulance Service Contract.
- e. Resolution Approving **Emergency Ambulance Service Agreement** with the Town of LaPrairie. This agreement establishes a fee for service to help cover the costs of ambulance service provided to the Town of LaPrairie by the City of Beloit Fire Department.
- f. Resolution Approving the **Appointment of Election Officials** for the 2016-2017 Election Cycle. State Statute requires that the City Council appoint election officials for the 2016-2017 election cycle. Election officials are paid an hourly or daily stipend for working before, during, and/or after Election Day and for any associated training.
- g. Resolution Declaring Official Intent to Reimburse Expenditures from Proceeds of 2016 Borrowing. There is no fiscal impact associated with this action. This resolution does not obligate the city to issue debt or proceed with the sale of any debt instruments.

- h. Application for a **Certified Survey Map** for the property located at 2001 Gateway Boulevard. The intent of the Certified Survey Map (CSM) is to divide the existing lots at 2001 and 3620 Gateway Blvd. in order to isolate an out-lot containing wetlands/floodway and create three buildable parcels that will be more desirable to future developers. Refer to Plan Commission for review and recommendation.
- i. Application for a **Relocation Order** for Easements related to the Fourth Street Bridge Project. The existing bridge structure was built in 1940 and has reached the end of its service life. This request from the Engineering Department is for the permanent and temporary easements to allow for the reconstruction of the Fourth Street Bridge over Lenigan Creek. Refer to Plan Commission for review and recommendation.
- j. Resolution Authorizing **Final Payment** of Public Works Contract C15-07, Street Resurfacing. This is final payment for work completed on asphalt surfacing for 34 blocks of city streets.
- k. Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to Apply for the Visit Beloit Grant. This \$7,500 grant request is to provide funding for educational and identification signs in the Bluff Street, Merrill Street, and College-Park Historic Districts. The Landmarks Commission researched signage options for the historic districts since 2012, but have been unable to move past the design stage due to funding limitations. If the grant is secured, bids will be requested and the City will contract with a professional sign design and production company.
- I. Resolution Cancelling the January 4, 2016 Regular Meeting of the City Council. No business items were submitted for Council consideration at the regularly scheduled meeting on January 4, 2016; therefore, staff is requesting that the meeting be cancelled. It is anticipated that a special meeting of the City Council will be called the following week to address consolidated polling places in compliance with timing guidelines set by State Statute and the Government Accountability Board.

7. ORDINANCES

- a. An Ordinance to Amend Section 1.14 of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit Pertaining to Polling Places. One of the polling places, McLenegan Elementary, has been sold, making it necessary to find a new polling place. The River of Life United Methodist Church agreed to host as a polling location. Addresses for Gaston and Hackett Schools also need to be updated in the General Ordinance.
- b. An Ordinance to Amend Section 1.28(3), to Repeal Sections 1.51(3)(g) and (i) and to Create Sections 1.59 and 1.60 of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit pertaining to the Human Resources and Information Services Departments. The Human Resources and Information Systems functions currently reside within the Office Finance and Administration. The City Manager recommends those two divisions be converted to "departments" under the supervision of the City Manager. There is no budgetary impact. Second Reading.
- c. An Ordinance to Amend the Future Land Use Map of the City of Beloit **Comprehensive Plan** to change the future land use designation for the property located at 20 Park Avenue from Community Commercial to General Industrial. The property at 20 Park Ave. was previously the site of Cub Foods and is being repurposed into light industrial. The Plan Commission reviewed and unanimously recommended approval of the requested amendment. Second Reading.
- d. An Ordinance to Amend the **Zoning District Map** to change the zoning district classification of the property located at 20 Park Avenue from C-3, Community Commercial District to M-1, Limited Manufacturing District. The Plan Commission reviewed and unanimously recommended approval of the requested amendment. Second Reading.
- e. An Ordinance to Create Section 15.06(1)(e) of the Code of General Ordinances for the City of Beloit relating to the Possession and Consumption of Alcohol Beverages in Big Hill Center. Current permits for beer and wine possession and consumption are allowed in various park shelters and the Rotary River Center. Parks and Recreation staff, as well as the Parks and Recreation Commission agree that users of the new Big Hill Center should be permitted to possess and consume alcohol beverages in a similar manner as allowed within the Rotary River Center in Riverside Park.
- **8. APPOINTMENTS**—There will be appointments for Council consideration.

a. Resolution approving 2016-2017 contract between the City of Beloit and the Humane Society of Southern Wisconsin, Inc. for Animal Care and Shelter Services. 




