- 1. President Haynes called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Forum at Beloit City Hall.
- 2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE
- 3. SPECIAL ORDERS OF THE DAY/ANNOUNCEMENTS
 - a. Vice President De Forest presented to BIFF President, Marty Densch a proclamation in recognition of Beloit International Film Festival. BIFF is entering its 11th year and runs from February 19-28, 2016. File 7148
- 4. PUBLIC HEARINGS
 - a. Community Development Director, Julie Christensen, presented a Proposed Ordinance amending the City of Beloit's **Zoning District Map** to change the zoning district classification of the property located at 736 Oak Street from R-1B, Single-Family Residential District to R-2, Two-Family Residential District for a first reading. The Plan Commission recommendation was for denial 6-0. President Haynes opened the hearing. Katherine Swain, 737 Elm, spoke in objection to this classification change. She requested it remain zoned single family and said they have lived next to the property for 43 years. She stated that the number of rental units in this area has reached a tipping point and believes allowing more will move the neighborhood in the wrong direction. No other citizens spoke. President Haynes closed the public hearing. Councilors De Forest and Luebke made a motion to lay over to the March 7 council meeting. Motion failed on a vote of 0-7. File 8709
- 5. CITIZEN PARTICIPATION
 - Executive Director Celestino Ruffini spoke on behalf of Visit Beloit. He explained that he will
 return to provide his annual report in a couple of months but wanted to share that to date, more
 than \$35,000 in community improvement grant dollars have been awarded through Stateline
 Community Foundation which includes monies for historic neighborhood signage. A new website
 www.visitbeloit.com has been launched and new Visit Beloit tourism guides. He said that new
 literature racks were recently delivered to local lodging properties and the lobby at 500 Public
 Avenue is refreshed. Two new videos for winter activities are out, one including the BIFF
 program. He said that they are working on strategic goals and feasibility studies. He said that
 2015 did end in record growth and that announcement will come in the near future.

6. CONSENT AGENDA

Councilor Luebke and Kincaid made a motion to adopt the consent Agenda as presented. Motion carried.

7. ORDINANCES

a. Interim Police Chief David Zibolski presented a proposed Ordinance to Amend Sections 25.04(4)(d) and 13.18 of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit pertaining to **Parking Enforcement**. In an effort to maximize city resources, staff is requesting the attached ordinance amendment which allows civilian city staff to assist law enforcement during times of snow emergencies. The proposed ordinance allows civilian staff in the Community Development Department and Fire Department to assist police operations during times of snow emergencies by issuing parking tickets. The current ordinance limits this authority to police officers.

The proposed ordinance also codifies the ability for community service officers to issue parking tickets. This is a second reading. Councilors Luebke and De Forest made a motion to approve as presented. Motion carried. File 7906 Ordinance 3566

- b. Community Development Director, Julie Christensen, presented an Ordinance to Amend Section 25.04(4)(d) of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit pertaining to Officials authorized to Issue Citations related to Annual Rental Dwelling Permits. Section 14.06 of the City's Code of General Ordinances requires property owners to obtain a rental permit before leasing any dwelling unit to another person. Chapter 25 of the City's Municipal Code identifies who can issue municipal citations for different sections of the code. For Section 14.06 (Annual Rental Permits) of the Code of General Ordinances, the employees currently authorized to issue municipal citations are the Director of Community and Housing Services. Inspection Official, and the Secretary to the Director of Community and Housing Services. We are proposing to amend this ordinance to allow the Administrative Assistant in the Planning and Building Services to also issue municipal citations under this code. This will allow the Community Development Department to more efficiently manage this program. This is second reading. Councilors Kincaid and Kelly made a motion to approve as presented. Motion carried. File 5130
- c. Community Development Director, Julie Christensen, presented a proposed Ordinance amending the City of Beloit's **Zoning District Map** to change the zoning classification of the property located at 2345 Prairie Avenue (River of Life UMC) from R-1A, Single-Family Residential District to PLI, Public Lands and Institutions District. Kevin Cook of JNB Signs, on behalf of River of Life United Methodist Church (RLUMC), has submitted an application for a Zoning Map Amendment to change the zoning district classification from R-1A, Single-Family Residential District to PLI, Public Lands and Institutions District, for the property located at 2345 Prairie Avenue. This is second reading. Councilors De Forest and Sloniker made a motion to approve as presented. Motion carried. File 8706

9. COUNCILOR ACTIVITIES AND UPCOMING EVENTS

- Councilor Hendrix thanked the community for their support of the Soulfood luncheon on behalf of the minority excellence organization. She announced the election on Tuesday, February 16th and reminded voters of the two polling locations and hours of voting.
- Councilor Sloniker announced an upcoming EOC meeting this Wednesday.
- Councilor Kelly has been very busy with BIFF planning and looks forward to seeing the community come out this week and next. She attended the Downtown Beloit annual dinner.
- Councilor Luebke welcomed council candidates present in the audience. He was happy to see the BPD officer highlighted in the Channel 27 news assisting an elderly citizen with her walkway.
- Councilor De Forest welcomed newly sworn firefighters. She's excited for BIFF and invited the public to attend a fundraiser for Project 16:49 where she will be lip syncing in a battle to raise funds for homeless youth.
- Councilors Kincaid and Haynes had nothing to add.

10. CITY MANAGER'S PRESENTATION

a. Chairperson Alex Blazer presented the annual Landmarks Commission Report for 2015. This annual report is provided in accordance with Section 32.05(10) of the Historic Preservation Ordinance. This report documents the activities and accomplishments of the Landmarks Commission during 2015. The Commission currently consists of Chair Alex Blazer, Vice-Chair Ruth Vater, Donna Johnson, Ellen Joyce, Terri Kaye, Steve Truesdale, Steve Vollmer, and City Councilor Ana Kelly. The city staff representative is Alex Morganroth. The Commission currently monitors 115 properties in the Bluff Street Historic District, 156 properties in the College Park Historic District, 4 properties in the Merrill Street Historic District, and 46 individually listed Landmarks and Landmark Sites.

The Landmarks Commission met twelve times in 2015 to review Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) applications. Many of these applications included more than one item concerning repairs, replacements, additions, or demolitions. Planning Division staff also reviewed and approved COA applications. Of the **55** COA applications processed in 2015, **23** (42%) were approved by staff. The number and types of requests considered by the Commission and staff are as follows:

General Repair Projects:

Gutters/Fascia/Soffit - 6 Fence Installation - 9 Handrails and Porch Repair - 5 Ramps/Sidewalks/Pavement - 5 Roof Repair/Replacement - 12 Siding - 4 Signs - 3 Structural Repair - 6 Windows and Doors - 8 <u>Special Projects:</u> 422 Bluff St Demolition 251 Roosevelt Ave Demolition Horace White Park Memorial Garden

The Landmarks Commission engaged in a number of projects in 2015 including an update to the Historic Intensive Survey, the creation of a Facebook page, and the revival of the process to install identification signage in Beloit's three historic districts. The Intensive Survey, funded by the Wisconsin State Historical Society and conducted by Legacy Architecture, is half-way completed and will be finished in August of 2016. The final document presented to the City and Commission will include analysis and recommendations for new historic districts. The Landmarks Commission Facebook page provides a new way for the Commission and Staff to engage with the community on preservation activities and issues. Lastly, a \$1000.00 donation from Fairbanks Morse and \$3,476.00 grant from Visit Beloit will allow the Commission to move forward with the design and production of various identification signs for the Bluff Street, Merrill Street, and College-Park Historic Districts. The goal is to have the first signs installed by fall of 2016. File 5860

11. REPORTS FROM BOARDS AND CITY OFFICERS

a. Senior Center Coordinator Paula Schutt presented a resolution Authorizing **Application and Acceptance of a Community Grant** from the National Council on Aging for "The Aging Mastery Program" and amending the 2016 Grinnell Senior Center Operating Budget for this Grant Program.

She explained that in November, 2015 the City of Beloit completed an application to the National Council on Aging (NCOA) to consider Grinnell Hall as a site for implementing their Aging Mastery Program (AMP). Shortly after the first of the year, the City of Beloit was notified that they would receive one of only 13 Grants that will be awarded within the State of Wisconsin. The grant is for a maximum of \$12,000 to cover the cost of implementing the AMP. There are no matching funds required and funds will be distributed over the 2016-2017 time period.

Grantees will be required to:

- Provide at least three (3), 10-week courses (the AMP core program) involving a total of 80-90 people over 24 months; one or more courses in the spring of 2016, one or more courses in the fall of 2016, and one or more in the spring of 2017. NCOA will provide all of the materials as an in-kind contribution for each participant in each offered course.
- Offer ongoing AMP engagement activities for the period of the grant.
- Assuming the program is successful, work with state leads and NCOS to develop and implement sustainability strategies.

AMP is a comprehensive and fun approach to aging well that encourages people to take actions to enhance their health, financial well-being, social connectedness, and overall quality of life. Participants in AMP will go through a 10 week core program followed by optional elective classes and activities that will be offered at Grinnell Hall.

Councilors De Forest and Sloniker made a motion to approve the resolution as presented. Motion carried 7-0. File 8711

b. Councilors Luebke and Sloniker moved that the City Council convene into closed session at 7:37 p.m. pursuant to section 19.85(1) (g), Wis. Stats., for the purpose of conferring with legal counsel for the governmental body who is rendering oral or written advice concerning strategy to be adopted by the body with respect to litigation in which it is or is likely to become involved, specifically to consider the possible **settlement of Mark Johnson v. City of Beloit**, 13-CV-863. Motion carried 7-0.

Councilors Luebke and De Forest moved that the City Council reconvene into open session at 7:41 p.m. pursuant to section 19.85(2), Wis. Stats., for possible action on the matter discussed in closed session. Motion carried 7-0.

Councilors Luebke and Hendrix made a motion to approve a resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into litigation settlement agreement. Motion carried 7-0. File 8712

Request Overview/Background Information:

The City of Beloit Engineering Division has requested permission to construct a parking lot at Turtle Creek Park, located at 1312 E Grand Avenue in the City of Beloit. The location of parking lots on public lands must be reviewed by the Plan Commission and approved by the City Council to comply with State Statutes.

Key Issues:

- The "Capital Improvement Recommendations" section of the *Beloit 2012-2016 Parks, Open Space and Recreation Plan* recommends the construction of a paved parking lot at Turtle Creek Park.
- Project Description
 - A new asphalt lot will be constructed at Turtle Creek Park and will provide visitors with 10 off-street parking spaces, including one handicap space. Visitors currently park on a dirt/grassy area in the same location as the proposed paved lot.

Department(s):

- See the attached Location and Zoning Map and aerial rendering.
- The proposed lot would be paved with three inches of asphalt and have 18-inch curb and gutter to direct storm water runoff.
- The Parks, Recreation, and Conservation Advisory Commission reviewed this item on January 13, 2016 and voted unanimously (6-0) to approve the design of the parking lot.
- The Landmarks Commission reviewed this item on February 16, 2016 and voted unanimously (5-0) to approve the Certificate of Appropriateness for the parking lot construction.
- The Plan Commission reviewed this item on February 17, 2016 and voted unanimously (6-0) to recommend approval of the parking lot construction.

Request Overview/Background Information:

The City of Beloit Engineering Division has requested that the Plan Commission review the proposed plans for the construction of a new parking lot at Turtle Creek Park located at 1312 E Grand Avenue in the City of Beloit. The location of parking lots on public lands must be reviewed by the Plan Commission and approved by the City Council to comply with State Statutes.

Key Issues:

- In the "Site Inventory and Analysis" section of the Beloit 2012-2016 Parks, Open Space and Recreation Plan, the
 parking lot condition at Turtle Creek Park was rated as "poor".
- The "Capital Improvement Recommendations" section of the 2012-2016 Beloit Parks, Open Space and Recreation Plan recommends the construction of a paved parking lot at Turtle Creek Park.
- Project Description
 - A new asphalt lot will be constructed at Turtle Creek Park and provide visitors with 10 off-street parking spaces. Visitors currently park on a dirt/grassy area in the same location as the proposed paved lot.
 - See the attached *Location and Zoning Map* and design rendering.
- The proposed lot would be paved with three inches of asphalt and have 18-inch curb and gutter to direct storm water runoff.
- The Engineering Division will work with Planning Staff to add landscaping as necessary to comply with Section 34.21 of the Architectural Review and Landscape Code.
- Turtle Creek Park is a landmark site and any construction, reconstruction, or alterations are regulated by the Landmarks Commission in accordance with Section 32.06 of the Historic Preservation Ordinance (Chapter 32).
 - The Commission reviewed the parking lot proposal at the February 16, 2016 meeting.
- The City Council will review the proposal on March 7, 2016.

- The *Comprehensive Plan* designates the property located at 1312 E Grand Avenue as appropriate for Parks and Open Space uses.





- I will be present for all Snappers games where alcohol sales are made by the Beloit Snappers Organization. I also intend to be present for any other events involving alcohol sales at our stadium. I plan to train and supervise all employees selling alcoholic beverages so that they are within compliance with all federal and state regulations. Using my experience over the 2015 season, as well as my knowledge gained through the "learn 2 serve training program, I will be able to instruct anyone involved on how to protect our customers and members of the organization by maintaining proper guidelines.
- 2.) Alcoholic practices from our catering company in New Orleans with the New Orleans Zephyrs were similar to our practices here in Beloit. I was able to gain knowledge of the operations through closely working with them at their concessions for all games and concerts held on the premises. Through my first season with the Snappers in 2015, I was able to oversee the entire operation, and learn the proper steps in save serving alcoholic beverage. I was able to recognize signs of impairment and understand the importance of requesting proper forms of age identification.
- 3.) On a given game night, I would have between 3 to 6 staff members serving alcoholic beverages. Alternate events would include 1-2 other servers operating under my supervision.
- 4.) Training will include, but is not limited to: Proper identification of any customer consuming alcoholic beverages. How to handle any customers with ID's that are deemed faulty or tampered in any way. They will be instructed on how to recognize the signs and indications of customers who are too intoxicated to continue serving at our events; which will include understanding how to handle these customers properly. Training will also include how to take the proper steps on how to handle these intoxicated customers if corrective action is necessary.
- 5.) Not only will staff members be instructed to ask for identification of anyone who appears to be 35 years of age or younger, but to also be aware of any situations that occur where it appears that the customer purchasing the alcoholic beverage is providing to anyone who maybe a minor. The proper way to handle such a situation is something that will be discussed in training as well.
- 6.) Currently there are 2 employees with serving license for the 2016 season; Angela Branz and myself. Prior to opening day, two more staff members will be licensed prior to opening day: Crystal Bowen and Mitchell Hooten.
- 7.) I am a full time employee with the Beloit Snappers, and the Snappers are my only employer.
- 8.) I hold a 9-5 office schedule during the off season and while the team is on the road during the season. My schedule on game day and event days vary and could run from 9 AM to as late as midnight.
- 9.) As the licensed alcohol agent of the Beloit Snappers, I understand that I will be held accountable and will be subject to any citations given for violations on our premises.
- 10.)I have zero violations related to alcohol.

Overview/Background Information:

On February 7, 2016, 2015 Wisconsin Act 149 became law. The Act strictly limits the authority for local governments to regulate knives. The proposed ordinance removes sections of the Code of General Ordinances for the City of Beloit that are no longer permissible under the new law.

Key Issues:

- 1. Switchblade knives are no longer illegal in Wisconsin, therefore the adoption of the state law and local ordinance related to switchblades are repealed by the proposed ordinance.
- 2. Local governments may not regulate knives in a stricter fashion that state law. Therefore, the section of the Code of General Ordinances for the City of Beloit that regulated the sale of knives to minors is repealed by the proposed ordinance. There are state laws that regulate in this area and enforcement may be taken in criminal court.
- 3. Local governments will still be able to regulate the possession of knives in buildings owned, occupied or controlled by the local government. Therefore the city's current prohibition for possession of a dangerous weapon on city property would remain intact.

Topic: Intercept Agreement with Clinton Fire Protection District

Date: March 7, 2016

Presenter(s): Fire Chief Brad Liggett and Deputy Chief Joseph Murray Department: Fire

Overview/Background Information: The Beloit Fire Department has been providing Advanced Life Support intercept services to the Clinton Fire Protection District for over 25 years. These services are meant to augment the EMT-Basic level of care provided to the citizens and visitors of Clinton when the patient is in critical condition. There is no doubt that countless lives have been saved because of the intercept services provided. In 2015 the Beloit Fire Department ambulances responded to 10 requests for paramedic intercepts.

Intercept Procedure- When an intercept occurs the Clinton Fire Protection District will respond with an EMT-Basic level crew. If the patient needs advanced care then they will request an ambulance from either the City of Beloit or the City of Janesville dependent on the location of the call and patient request. The paramedics who respond will normally use the Clinton ambulance to transport the patient and will take all of the necessary equipment in to their ambulance. The patient is then transported to the appropriate facility.

Billing - Normally the Beloit Fire Department would bill for transport services but because the patient is being transported in a different agencies ambulance only they can bill for the call. The fire department has no ability to be reimbursed for the Advanced Life Support services because there is no written agreement between the City of Beloit and Clinton Fire Protection District. This applicable language in Medicare rule is as follows;

CMS IOM Publication 100-02, Chapter 10, Section 10.5 defines the following.

A. BLS/ALS Joint Response

In situations where a BLS entity provides the transport of the beneficiary and an ALS entity provides a service that meets the fee schedule definition of an ALS intervention (e.g., ALS assessment, Paramedic Intercept services, etc.), the BLS supplier may bill Medicare the ALS rate provided that a written agreement between the BLS and ALS entities exists prior to submitting the Medicare claim. Providers/suppliers must provide a copy of the agreement or other such evidence (e.g., signed attestation) as determined by their intermediary or carrier upon request. Contractors must refer any issues that cannot be resolved to the regional office.

Medicare does not regulate the compensation between the BLS entity and the ALS entity. If there is no agreement between the BLS ambulance supplier and the ALS entity furnishing the service, then only the BLS level of payment may be made. In this situation, the ALS entity's services are not covered, and the beneficiary is liable for the expense of the ALS services to the extent that these services are beyond the scope of the BLS level of payment.

Key Issues (maximum of 5):

- This agreement will solidify the fire department's ability to continue of Advanced Life Support Services.
- This agreement will allow the department to be reimbursed for its services in a manner consistent with current Medicare rules and regulations.
- This agreement will also allow the Clinton Fire Protection District to be reimbursed for their services provided.

3. Proactively partner with individuals and businesses to promote a safe and healthy community, minimize personal injury, prevent loss of life and protect property and natural resources.

The Beloit Fire Department provides paramedic level care to all citizens of the Stateline Area through the paramedic intercept program. Providing this service to our surrounding communities fosters good stewardship between organizations and is responsible for saving numerous lives.

4. Collaborate with other jurisdictions and organizations to foster effective and efficient service delivery, reducing cost for taxpayers and stimulating regional prosperity.

This agreement is a collaborative effort between two government entities that will allow the fire department ambulance budget to be reimbursed for the Advanced Life Support Services provided on intercepts.

ADVANCED LIFE SUPPORT BILLING AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF BELOIT, WISCONSIN AND THE VILLAGE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT OF CLINTON, WISCONSIN RELATED TO PARAMEDIC INTERCEPTS

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this _____ day of ______, 2016, by and between the **City of Beloit**, a Wisconsin municipal corporation, (hereinafter referred to as "**City**") and the **Clinton Fire Protection District**, a Wisconsin association, whose membership consists of the Village of Clinton, Town of Clinton and Town of Bradford, located in Rock County, Wisconsin (hereinafter referred to as "**District**").

WHEREAS, the District and the City desire to demonstrate their commitment to providing the best possible care to their patients by entering into this Advanced Life Support Billing Agreement related to Paramedic Intercepts; and

WHEREAS, the City agrees to provide the District with Advanced Life Support (hereinafter "ALS") intercept service when the District requests such service.

WHEREAS, the City and the District are authorized, pursuant to section 66.0301 of the Wisconsin Statutes, to enter into this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the **City** and the **District** (collectively the "Parties") agree as follows:

- The City shall provide the District with ALS intercept service when requested by the Village if the City is able and available to provide such service. The City shall immediately notify the District if the requested aid cannot be provided for any reason. When ALS intercept service is provided, the procedures outlined herein shall be followed.
- When the City provides ALS care, but the District transports the patient in the District's vehicle, the following procedures outlined in this paragraph shall be followed:

- a. The District shall be responsible for the billing and collection associated with the ALS service provided by the City as required by Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA) regulations.
- b. The District shall pay the City \$400.00 for such service and care no later than 60 days following the provision of such service and care.
- c. It is agreed that the **District** Medicare provider number **000081011** shall only be used when the **District** is involved in an ALS transport. The **District** has the sole responsibility to accurately track reimbursement for ALS intercepts in which the **District** provides transportation so as to adhere to the provisions of this Agreement.
- 3. When the **City** provides ALS care and transportation to the patient in a **City** vehicle, the following procedures outlined in this paragraph shall be followed:
 - a. The **City** shall be responsible for the billing and collection associated with the services provided pursuant to the terms of this paragraph.
 - b. The **City** shall provide no compensation to the **District** in regard to the transports made pursuant to this paragraph.
 - c. The **City** has the sole responsibility to accurately track reimbursement for ALS intercepts in which the **City** provides transportation so as to adhere to the provisions of this Agreement.
- 4. The **District** shall indemnify and hold the **City**, its officers, employees and agents, harmless from any liability for claims arising out of the acts or omissions of the District, its officers, employees and agents. Likewise, the **City** shall indemnify and hold the **District**, its officers, employees and agents, harmless from any liability for claims arising out of the acts or omissions of the **City**, its officers, employees and agents. Each party agrees to maintain general liability insurance to cover liability for its acts and omissions, including the acts and omissions of its officers, employees and agents
- 5. This Agreement may be amended at any time by mutual written agreement of the Parties.
- 6. This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party.

7. Any notice required by this Agreement shall be made in writing and shall be mailed to the other party as follows:

Topic: Consideration of a First Amendment to the Clubhouse and Beverage Operating Agreement for Krueger-Haskell Municipal Golf Course

Date: March 7, 2016

Overview/Background Information:

Over the past seven years (2008-2015) the City of Beloit has previously contracted with three separate business partners in order to operate the Clubhouse Food & Beverage Concessions at the Golf Course. Unfortunately, 2 of the 3 contractors had challenges in operating their business within profitable margins, and declined to renew their agreements at the end of their terms. Currently, due the contractual arrangement with our current concessionaire, D&D Buck, LLC (aka Bucky's Bunker) their lease requires an increase in payment in 2016 which they believe would create financial hardship for their business. Therefore, unless they can renegotiate their payment, they have indicated that they will not be returning to operate concessions at the Golf Course in 2016. Therefore, we are proposing an amendment to their agreement which would lower their lease payment to the same level as previously acceptable and paid in 2014.

Key Issues (maximum of 5):

- 1.) As indicated through our customer surveys at the Golf Course, D&D Buck, LLC has done an outstanding job in providing high quality customer services, and in the opinion of our Golf staff, they are an excellent partner for our Food & Beverage Operations at the Golf Course and have assisted in bring in new customers and Golf Outing events.
- 2.) D&D Buck, LLC has provided the City with a copy of their Loss/Profit Reports which indicates their ability to make a profit in 2014, but not in 2015. In their opinion, their losses were compounded by two major criteria:
 a.) Sales decrease was a direct reflection of the sudden increases of Green Fees in May of 2016, and
 b.) Increases of their lease payment by \$2,100 annually.
- 3.) In 2013, after appropriately advertising locally and regional three (3) separate times, there were no responses to the City's Advertisement for a new Concessionaire at the Golf Course. In February, 2014, D&D Buck, LLC contacted the City only after hearing through the word of mouth, of the opportunity to operate the Golf Course Concession.
- 4.) By not accepting the amendment to this contract, D&D Buck, LLC (aka Bucky's Bunker) will not be returning to the Golf Course in 2016, and it's anticipated that the City would be without food & beverage services at the start of the golf season, and perhaps longer.
- 5.) Without a Food & Beverage Services at the Golf Course would have a devastating effect to the overall operations of the course, as it's anticipated the numerous players would choose to play elsewhere, and we would no longer have the ability to provide Golf Outing events as well.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE CLUBHOUSE FOOD AND BEVERAGE OPERATING AGREEMENT FOR KRUEGER-HASKELL MUNICIPAL GOLF COURSE

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT is made this _____ day of _____, 2016, by and between the City of Beloit, a Wisconsin municipal corporation, with its principal offices located at 100 State Street, Beloit, Wisconsin (hereinafter referred to as the "City") and D&D Buck, LLC, 3430 S. Prairie Avenue, Beloit, Wisconsin (hereinafter referred to as the "Operator").

WHEREAS, City and Operator entered into an Operating Agreement dated February 18, 2014 ("Agreement") whereby **Operator** is the concessionaire and provides food and beverage service at the Krueger Haskell Municipal Golf Course; and

WHEREAS, on July 31, 2015, the **Operator** submitted its request to terminate the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, in lieu of termination of the Agreement, the parties have agreed to reduce the franchise fees payment for the year 2016.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, **City** and **Operator** agree as follows:

- 1. Section 8.1(A) of the Operating Agreement is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - "8.1 **Annual Fee: Operator** agrees to pay the **City** an annual franchise fee.
 - (A) 2014 2016 Golf Season. For the 2014 2016 golf season, and any subsequent renewals, said base annual franchise fee shall be paid in seven (7) equal installments on the first day of each month starting on April 1, 2014 and ending on October 1, 2016 as indicated in the following matrix (below) and subject to the provisions in Paragraph 1.1 herein:

<u>Year</u>	Wonthly Payment (1-7)	Base Lotal
2014	\$1,200 (April – October)	\$8,400
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2015	\$1,500 (April – October)	\$10,500
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2016 \$1,200 (April – October) \$8,400"

2. **Operator** agrees to withdraw its July 31, 2015 letter to the City requesting termination of the Agreement.

3. **Other Terms and Conditions Remain**. In the event of any inconsistencies between the Operating Agreement and this First Amendment, the terms of this First Amendment shall control. Except as expressly set forth in this First Amendment, the Parties agree that the Lease is otherwise unmodified and remains in full force and effect. Each reference in the Lease to itself shall be deemed also to refer to the First Amendment.
