ROAD CLOSURE

The intersection of US Hwy. 51 (Riverside Drive) and Cranston Road has been under construction since April 11. The closure of Cranston at the intersection to all traffic will occur on May 10, 2016. DAVID B. ZIBOLSKI TO BE SWORN IN AS NEW CHIEF OF POLICE

Ceremony Scheduled for Monday, April 25, 2016 at 7:00 p.m.

Beloit, WI – David B. Zibolski will be sworn-in as the City of Beloit Chief of Police on Monday, April 25, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. in the Beloit City Hall Forum, 100 State Street.

Following opening comments by City Manager Lori Curtis Luther, the Oath of Office will be administered by Wisconsin Attorney General Brad Schimel. Chief Zibolski's badge will be pinned on by his wife, Sue Zibolski.

Chief Zibolski is a 31-year law enforcement veteran, having enjoyed a 27-year career with the Milwaukee Police Department, retiring in 2011 at the rank of Captain.

Following his retirement from the Milwaukee Police Department, Chief Zibolski worked as Deputy Administrator for Wisconsin Department of Justice Division of Law Enforcement Services. He had operational responsibility of a statewide division that served law enforcement and the public, consisting of four bureaus and 280 personnel. Zibolski has served as the City of Beloit's Interim Police Chief since June, 2015.

Chief Zibolski is a graduate of Northwestern University Center for Public Safety, School of Police Staff and Command, and is a nationally certified "Leadership in Police Organizations" Instructor through the International Association of Chiefs of Police. He holds a Master of Science in Organizational Management and Leadership from Springfield College, Springfield, MA.

City Manager Curtis Luther stated, "Under the leadership of Chief Zibolski, we are a community united; committed to working together to reduce crime, fear and disorder in our neighborhoods."
