This item will be referred to the Alcohol Beverage License Control Committee for their review and recommendation.
- e. Application for a renewal of a Class "B" Beer and "Class C" Wine License for Royal Enterprizes LLC, d/b/a Mama Loui's Shrimp & BBQ Smokehouse, located at 315 State Street, James H. Bennett, Jr., for license period July 1, 2016—June 30, 2017. This item will be referred to the Alcohol Beverage License Control Committee for their review and recommendation.
- f. Resolution approving **Renewal of Alcohol Beverage Licenses** for License Period July 1, 2016—June 30, 2017. All licenses expire on June 30 of each year and a renewal process is necessary to maintain operations. A list of renewals is included in the Council packet. The Alcohol Beverage License Control Committee recommended approval 5-0.
- g. Resolution approving the Renewal of an Annual Mobile Home Park License for the Property located at 2601 Colley Road. Inspections have been made and upon approval by the Council, the City Clerk will issue a license to operate effective July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017.
- h. Resolution approving Addendum No. 1 to **Kadlec Drive Condominium Plat** located at 2660 Kadlec Drive. The proposed condo Plat includes the construction of 42 additional units in five additional buildings to complete the Kadlec Drive Condominium project. Plan Commission has reviewed the proposed Condo Plat and voted unanimously (5-0) to recommend approval, subject to two conditions.
- Resolution awarding Public Works Contract C16-13, Stateline Road Sewer and Water Extension. Two bids were
  received for this project and the low bid was received from Maddrell Excavating LLC. This project will extend sanitary
  sewer and water main to serve 2401 Stateline Road.

- j. Resolution awarding Public Works Contract **C16-03**, **Rehab of City Owned Parking Lots**. This project will apply sealcoating to parking lots at the Jones Pavilion, fire Station Headquarters, Fire Station #2, the Library, and north lot of City Hall.
- k. Resolution awarding Public Works Contract **C15-10, Canterbury Crossover**. This project will add sanitary sewer to bypass an existing four barrel inverted siphon. Three bids were received for this project, with the low bed from E & N Hughes Co., Inc. This project will improve the reliability of our sanitary sewer system.
- Resolution authorizing Final Payment of Public Works Contract C15-24, Inman Sewer Extension. This project extended sanitary sewer along Inman Parkway. It has been completed satisfactorily and in conformance with the requirements of the contract; therefore, final payment is recommended.

Proposed Ordinance to amend Sections 7.06(2)(c)1, 7.065, 14.02(9), 14.06(1), (2), (3), (4), (6), and 25.04(4)(d) of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit pertaining to Rental Unit Inspection Program and Rental Registration Certificates. 2015 Wisconsin Act 176 was enacted in March 2016. The Act includes various provisions which affect the city's rental dwelling permit program. Due to the Act, several changes are recommended to be made to the Municipal Code. This is a first reading.

# Introducing Beloit's Automated Collection Program

The City of Beloit will be starting Automated Solid Waste Collection on June 6, 2016. This is a system where garbage and recycling carts are emptied utilizing a mechanical arm attached to the truck, instead of workers lifting and emptying containers and bags by hand.

# Why is this program being implemented in Beloit?

- . The carts are easy to wheel and will be more convenient for residents.
- There will be no increase in Solid Waste fees as this program gains efficiency.
- . We will utilize fewer trucks, and will reduce our carbon footprint.
- · It's safer for city workers and reduces workplace injuries.

### Automated Collection Program Details

- **COMING JUNE, 2016** Between May 23-June 3, 2016 each residence will be supplied with two 96-gallon wheeled carts. The garbage has a black lid,
- On your weekly collection day carts should be placed by the curb (on or off the street), no more than 3 feet from the curb or road edge. Placement of carts will vary by residence. Place carts at least 3 feet apart, with the open side of the lid facing the street and the handle facing your residence.
- New! Recycling will be collected every other week. You can co-mingle all your recycling in the cart, nothing needs to be separate.
- When your carts are delivered in May you'll receive a packet of information including a calendar and map with collection routes.
- Ensure access to the carts is not blocked by cars or mailboxes. Be sure you provide room for mail trucks to deliver mail.
- . New! Garbage and recycling that is not placed in the carts will not be picked up. Garbage must not be overflowing from the cart and the lid must be substantially closed or it won't be emptied by the truck. High volume charges are eliminated.
- Carts other than those provided by the City of Beloit will NOT be emptied once automated collection has begun.

and the recycling cart has a gray lid. You must start using the carts the week of June 6, 2016, not before.

- Extra trash carts are available for an additional \$14 monthly charge that will be added to your utility bill. You may receive one additional recycling cart at no charge.
- If you move, please leave the carts behind. Carts are the property of the City of Beloit and must remain at the property or address to which they are assigned. Do not write house numbers or other markings on the carts.
- Department of Public Works will be responsible for repairs to carts. Residents are responsible for taking good care of them. Please keep them clean and properly store them on the side or back of your residence, or in your garage.
- New! As of June 6, 2016, bulky items & appliances must be prepaid and prescheduled for curbside pickup, fees remain the same.
- New! You may rent a dumpster from the city if you have excess items for disposal.
- New! As of January 1, 2016 televisions dropped off at the recycling center will cost \$5 per unit.
- New! As of June 6, 2016 the City of Beloit will no longer be participating in the sharps collection and disposal program.

Introduciendo el Programa Automatizado Para La Recolección De Desechos Sólidos de Beloit

La ciudad de Beloit estará implementando el Programa Automatizado Para La Recolección De Desechos Sólidos, el 6 de Junio del 2016. Este es un sistema en el cual, los botes de basura y reciclaje se vacían utilizando un brazo mecánico unido al camión, en lugar de que los trabajadores levanten y vacíen los botes de basura y las bolsas a mano.

# ¿Por qué está siendo implementado este programa en Beloit?

- Los botes son fáciles de rodar y será más conveniente para los residentes.
- No habrá aumento en las tarifas de pago de desechos sólidos mientras este programa gana eficiencia.
   BOTES DE BASURA
- Utilizaremos menos camiones, y reduciremos nuestra huella de carbono y contaminación.
- Es más seguro para los trabajadores de la ciudad y reduce los accidentes de trabajo.

### Detalles del Programa De Recolección Automatizado

- A finales de mayo, a cada residencia se le otorgarán 2 botes con ruedas, de 96 galones: El de la basura con tapa negra y el de reciclaje con tapa gris.
- En nuestros días de recolección semanal, los botes de basura deberán ser colocados en la curva (en la calle o sobre ella), a no más de 3 pies de la curva o el borde de la calle. La colocación de los botes puede variar de acuerdo a las residencias. Coloque los botes a por lo menos 3 pies de distancia, con el lado abierto de la tapa viendo hacia la calle y el mango viendo hacia su residencia.
- Nuevo! El reciclaje se recolectará una semana si, y una no. Usted ya no necesitará separar el cartón y el papel.
- Cuando sus botes le sean entregados en mayo, recibirá un libro con información, incluyendo un calendario y un mapa con las rutas de recolección.
- Asegúrese de que el acceso a los botes de basura y reciclaje no sea bloqueado por automóviles o buzones de correo. Asegúrese de proveer suficiente
  espacio para que el camión del correo pueda entregar el correo.
- Nuevo! La basura y el reciclaje que no estén dentro de los botes, no se recogerá. La basura no deberá sobresalir del bote y la tapa deberá estar
  completamente cerrada o no será vaciado por el camión. Las cargas de gran volumen serán eliminadas.
- Los botes que no sean los otorgados por la ciudad de Beloit, no se vaciarán una vez que la recolección automatizada haya comenzado.
- Los botes de basura adicionales están disponibles por un cargo mensual adicional que se añadirá a su factura de servicios públicos. Puede recibir un bote de reciclado adicional sin cargo.
- Si usted se muda, por favor deje los botes de basura y reciclaje en el lugar. Los botes son propiedad de la Ciudad de Beloit y deben permanecer en la propiedad o el domicilio al que fueron asignados. No escriba números de residencia u otras marcas en los botes.
- El Departamento de Obras Públicas se encargará de la reparación de los botes. Los residentes son los responsables del buen manejo y cuidado de ellos. Favor de mantenerlos limpios y adecuadamente almacenados en el lado o la parte posterior de su residencia o en su garaje.
- Nuevo! A partir del 6 de Junio del 2016, se deberá agendar la recolección de artículos voluminosos y aparatos para que puedan ser levantados. Los
  cargos se mantienen.
- Nuevo! Usted puede alquilar un contenedor de basura de la ciudad, si tiene artículos en exceso para su eliminación.
- Nuevo! A partir del 1 de enero de 2016 los televisores que se entreguen en el centro de reciclaje tendrán un costo de \$5 por unidad.
- Nuevo! A partir del 06 de junio 2016 la Ciudad de Beloit ya no participará en el programa de recolección y desecho de objetos punzo-cortantes.

Yard waste consists of leaves, grass clippings, garden debris, brush and shrubbery, no larger than 4 feet long and/or 4 inches in diameter.

### **Monthly Curbside Collection**

Curbside collection of yard waste will take place the 2nd full week of each month, May through October, on your regular trash day. A yard waste sticker will be required on all bags, bundles and/or containers.

May 9 through 13 June 13 through 16 July 11 through 14 August 15 through 18 September 12 through 15 October 10 through 13

Please Note: Yard waste stickers remaining from your previous purchases will be honored in 2016.

- · Residents must purchase yard waste stickers to place on bags, bundles and/or containers. See locations above.
- Stickers are sold 5 to a sheet for \$7.50
- · Use only paper yard waste bags, Back-to-Nature Biodegradable bags or clean trash containers 39 gallons or less.
- · Yard waste containers must weigh no more than 60 pounds.
- All brush and shrubbery must be bundled, tied or contained and tagged. Maximun of 4 ft long and/or 4 inches in diameter.
- · Plastic bags CANNOT be used for yard waste.
- · Place yard waste curbside on your regular trash day during the collection dates.
- · Place yard waste 3 feet away from your regular trash.

- · All brush and shrubbery must be bundled tied or contained and tagged with a yard waste sticker placed on it.
- Stickers are sold 5 to a sheet for \$7.50 and are available at Walgreens, ACE Hardware, Public Works Operations Facility, City Hall Treasury, Grinnell Hall, Leisure Services Office.
- Use only paper yard waste bags Back-to-Nature Biodegradable bags or clean trash containers 39 gallon or less. No plastic bags!
- Yard waste containers must weigh no more than 60 pounds.

### **Automated Collection Tips**

- · All trash and recyclables must be in the carts provided by the City of Beloit.
- Place carts no more than 3 feet from the curb or road edge and place 3 feet apart.
- Trash and Recycling carts are the property of the City of Beloit and no markings are permitted on the carts.
- Place carts with lid opening facing the street.
  Cart lids must be substantionally closed with no material sticking out, and no material may be placed on top of the cart lid.
- Changes or delays in your trash/recycling pick-up are posted on the City of Beloit webpage.

Springbrook Court (at the back of the building). Directions: Head East on Highway 81 (Milwaukee Road), turn right on Willowbrook Road (next to Central Christian Church). Turn right on Springbrook Court. The site is located on the right at the back of the blue Public Works Operations Facility. Hours of Operation: Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

### Sharps Disposal Has Been Eliminated

Effective June 6, 2016 the City of Beloit will no longer be participating in the city sharps collection and disposal program. The program has been successful in that we were able to keep our solid waste haulers who were collecting manually from getting stuck. For alternative disposal of sharps, check with your local pharmacy, health care provider, veterinarian, drug company, or search the internet for safe sharps disposal methods.

### Introducing Beloit's Automated Collection Program

The City of Beloit will be starting Automated Solid Waste Collection on June 6, 2016. This is a system where garbage and recycling carts are emptied utilizing a mechanical arm attached to the truck, instead of workers lifting and emptying containers and bags by hand.

### What is Automated Collection?

Automation is a faster and more efficient way to collect trash and recycling. In addition to being more efficient, fully automated collection has many other advantages: neater, cleaner appearance of roadways, reduced roadside litter, safer traffic conditions for residents and collectors. Carts are durable and easy to maneuver for residents.

### How will it work?

Each residence will be supplied with two 96 gal easy-to-use wheeled carts: one for garbage and one for recycling.

Garbage: place garbage into the cart with black lid and roll it to the curb or the edge of the road on your regular

collection day.

Recycling: place all recyclables into the cart with grey lid and set out every other week on your regular recycling day.

# When does automated collection begin?

June 6, 2016. When the carts are delivered to your home, you will NOT be able to start using them until the week of June 6, 2016.

# How often can I set out my carts?

Garbage Cart (black lid) will be collected on a weekly basis. Recycling Cart (gray lid) will be collected on a bi-weekly basis.

# Can I have more than one trash cart?

One additional trash cart can be requested for a monthly \$14 fee that will be on your sewer bill.

### Where should I place my carts on my collection day for pick up?

Place one cart on each side of the driveway or 3 feet apart. Place carts no more than 3 feet from the curb or road edge. The lids must face the roadway.

# Will my collection day change? It may, see the map in this brochure to find your collection day or visit the website www automatebeloit.com to type

find your collection day or visit the website www.automatebeloit.com to type in your address for your collection schedule. You may also sign up on the website to receive collection reminders via phone, text, Twitter and email.

# What do I do with my extra trash/recycling?

Keep your items for the following week or bring the items to the Recycling Drop Off at 2351 Springbrook CL, Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. Residents may also take their trash to the Janesville Landfill, 545 Black Bridge Road, Janesville, WI 53545 or hire a private hauler. Residents may call the Operations Facility at (608) 364-2929 for information on a dumpster rental.

### I already have a rolling cart at home, can I use that one? No, carts other than those provided by

the City of Beloit will NOT be collected once automated collection has begun.

# What if I have a bulky or appliance for disposal?

These items will need to be pre-paid and pre-scheduled for pick up by appointment only. Call the City of Beloit Department of Public Works Operations Facility for more information (608) 364-2929.

# If I move, do I take the carts with me?

No, the carts are the property of the City of Beloit and must remain at the property/address to which they are assigned. Do not write house numbers or any other markings on the city carts. Each cart has it's own unique ID tag.

# Won't the new carts be more difficult in snow and ice?

No, they should be easier to maneuver than traditional trash and recycling containers.

### How do I dispose of paint?

Latex paint can be dried out by adding oil dry or kitty litter. Once paint has solidified it can be placed in your trash cart. Oil based paint can be taken to one of the Household Hazardous Clean Sweep locations. Please call Rock County Land Conservation for the nearest collection location and date at (608) 754-6617.

# I have a long driveway. How will I get my carts to the curb?

The new carts are extremely easy to wheel to and from the curb. Carts must be stored on the resident's property and cannot be left curbside for more than 24 bours.

#### What can I recycle?

You will find the list imprinted on the recycle cart (gray lid).

# What do I do with my old recycle bins and garbage containers when the program starts?

Your existing containers can be used for other home projects or extra storage. They can be placed in your recycle cart, or brought to the City of Beloit Recycling Drop Off at 2351 Springbrook Ct., Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. Or you can place a "Take Me" sign on them before the automated program begins on your collection day.

# What if my cart is lost, stolen or damaged?

Contact the Police Department (608) 757-2244 to file a report and then call the Department of Public Works Operation Facility at (608) 364-2929.

#### Who will maintain my carts?

Residents are responsible for regular periodic cleaning and disinfecting the carts, properly storing the carts each week and during extended absences. Department of Public Works will be responsible for repairs including, but not limited to wheels, axels, lids, hinge pins, and replacement of carts damaged by city plows.


