#### **HWY. 81 CONSTRUCTION**

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation announced that construction on two sections of Wisconsin 81 in Green County and Rock County has started. From the 511wi.gov website: "The 3-mile western section of WIS 81 construction will occur between WIS 11 to just east of Willow Creek near the Green/Rock County line. The 16-mile eastern section is located between Paddock Road and the Beloit City limit in Rock County. Construction will entail new highway pavement and bridge rehabilitation."

The two sections of WIS 81 will be closed to through traffic during construction. Local access will be maintained. The posted detour routes for through traffic are as follows:

- Eastbound WIS 81: WIS 11 to WIS 213
- Westbound WIS 81: WIS 213 to WIS 11

Construction is scheduled for completion in early November.




