2017 CURBSIDE COLLECTION OF YARD WASTE

Yard waste will be collected for two weeks in Spring, April 3 - 13 on your regular trash day. A yard waste sticker will be required on all bags, bundles and/or containers. Yard Waste Stickers can be purchased at Walgreens, ACE Hardware, Public Works Operations Facility, City Hall Treasury, Grinnell Hall, and Leisure Services Office.

- Stickers are sold 5 to a sheet for \$7.50.
- Use only paper yard waste bags, Back-to-Nature Biodegradable bags or clean trash containers 39 gallons or less (no plastic bags).
- Yard waste containers must weigh no more than 60 pounds.
- All brush and shrubbery must be bundled, tied or contained and tagged.
- Place yard waste curbside on your regular trash day during the collection dates.
- Place yard waste a few feet away from your regular trash.

ANNUAL PRESCRIBED BURNS IN BELOIT PARKS April 1 – 22, 2017

March 30, 2017 – The City of Beloit Parks & Leisure Services Division will conduct their annual Prescribed Burn program in designated park sites during a three (3) week period of April 1-22, 2017, depending upon weather conditions.

Historically, natural wildfires played a very important role in shaping the natural prairie grassland that once covered over two million acres of Wisconsin. Today, less than 12,000 scattered acres still exist, and the use of Prescribed Burning Programs helps protect and maintain these natural prairie grassland areas.

The purpose of prescribed burns is multi-faceted and provides the following benefits:

- Reduces the amount of dead and dying plant material that hinders new plant growth in the spring.
- Recycles nutrients from old plant growth for use by growing plants.
- Promotes germination, growth, and flowering of native plants.
- Increases the diversity of native plant life.
- Controls encroachment of woody brush and trees into grasslands, including invasive species such as garlic mustard.

Prescribed Burn areas are generally conducted in the spring after snow melt and/or in the fall after leaf fall has concluded. These designated sites are typically burned on a 2-5 year interval, and in some cases annually to prevent overgrowth of a defined area.

This year, the Parks Division will only conduct prescribed burns in the following designated locations:

- Harper's Prairie (aka West Side Detention Pond), located at 2201 Whipple Street
- Stateline Restoration Prairie, located at 540 Colby Street
- Big Hill Park, located at 1101 Big Hill Road
- Various areas at the Krueger Haskell Golf Course, located at 1611 Hackett Street
- Various areas in Riverside Park, located at 1160 Riverside Drive
- NE corner of Riverside Drive & Eclipse Drive near the Beloit Library
- Water Tower Park, located at 1002 White Avenue

Consistent with practices as developed and conducted by the Wisconsin DNR and the US Fish and Wildlife Service, each park site is appropriately supervised and monitored by trained staff or volunteers from the City's Parks Division. These prescribed burns will only be conducted under the appropriate weather conditions, as safety is the top concern in implementation of this practiced program. If weather conditions are not appropriate for these prescribed burns, they will be postponed until a later date when the weather conditions are considered acceptable for this practice.

PUBLIC NOTICE TO ALL CUSTOMERS OF BELOIT WATER UTILITY

Beloit Water Utility has filed an application with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSCW) to increase water rates. The increase is necessary due to an estimated \$5 million increase in plant in service, an estimated \$300,000 increase in operation and maintenance expenses, and an estimated \$180,000 increase in depreciation expense since the last water rate case in 2010.

The total increase in water revenues requested is \$326,330 which will result in an estimated overall rate increase of 7% over the water utility's present revenues. If the request is granted, the water bill for general service for an average residential customer with a \(^{1}\)8-inch or \(^{3}\)4-inch meter who uses 500 cubic feet (3,750 gallons) of water per month will increase from \$14.40 to \$14.60, or 3%.

When the public fire protection charge is included, the total water bill for an average residential customer with a %-inch or %-inch meter who uses 500 cubic feet (3,750 gallons) of water per month will increase from \$18.58 to \$19.10, or 3% overall.

A telephonic public hearing on the application has been scheduled for Thursday, April 20, 2017, at 10:00 a.m. in the Large Conference Room at the Beloit Utilities and Engineering Facility, 2400 Springbrook Court, Beloit, Wisconsin. Scheduling questions regarding this hearing may be directed to the PSCW at (608) 266-3766.

A person may testify in this proceeding without becoming a party and without attorney representation. A person may submit this testimony in one of the following ways:

- **Web Comment.** Go to the PSCW's web site at http://psc.wi.gov, click on the "Public Comments" button on the side menu bar. On the next page select the "File a comment" link that appears for docket number 455-WR-103. Web comments shall be received no later than the day before the hearing.
- Oral Comment. Spoken testimony at the public hearing session.
- Written Comment. Instead of speaking at the hearing, write out a comment and submit it at the public hearing session.
- Mail Comment. All comments submitted by U.S. mail shall be received no later than the day before the hearing and shall be addressed to: Docket 455-WR-103 Comments, Public Service Commission, P.O. Box 7854, Madison, WI 53707-7854.

The PSCW intends to webcast this hearing live on the PSCW's web site at http://psc.wi.gov under the "PSC Live Broadcast" button.
