BELOIT CITY COUNCIL WORKSHOP MONDAY, MAY 8, 2017

The Beloit City Council will hold a <u>workshop</u> on **Monday, May 8, 2017 at 6:30 p.m.** at the Engineering and Utilities Building, 2400 Springbrook Court. The purpose of the workshop is to discuss the City of Beloit Logo. There will be a quorum of City Councilors present and the workshop is open to the public.

TREES SCHEDULED FOR REMOVAL IN RIVERSIDE PARK

The presence of the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) has created the need for ash tree removal throughout the City. While the Forestry Division has treated many of the Ash trees, it is cost prohibitive to treat them all, and while treatment may slow the EAB, it doesn't stop the progression. A contractor is currently removing ash trees on the City's near East Side. Beginning the week of May 8th, the contractor will begin removing approximately 50 trees in Riverside Park. Mike Ferger, Operations Forestry Supervisor, assures the public that the reforestation of Riverside Park is a priority and, through careful planning, trees will be restocked over a period of time.

SPRING TREE PLANTING

The City of Beloit's Department of Public Works is now accepting requests from residents for terrace trees to be planted this spring. The terrace tree species selection will be determined by the City Forestry Supervisor while taking into account the size of the terrace, presence of utilities and exotic invasive insects. Trees will be planted on a first-come, first-served basis, limited supply available. Public Works will accept requests through Tuesday, May 15, 2017. DOWNTOWN BELOIT EVENTS

The <u>Farmers' Market</u> begins Saturday, May 6th and runs every Saturday through the end of October, rain or shine. More than 100 vendors will be set up on West Grand and State Streets, selling everything from produce, meat, baked goods and more. SNAP Benefits are accepted.

The <u>15th Annual ArtWalk</u> Handmade Market is scheduled for Friday, May 12 from 5:00—9:00 p.m. More than 30 artists and 25 venues will be open late for this exciting annual event. CITY HALL SIDEWALK REPAIR

The deteriorating brick sidewalk on the north side of City Hall is scheduled to be replaced. Work will begin on Friday, May 12th. Once the work begins, the doors on the north side of City Hall will be locked and not accessible. As this is the door closest to the public elevator, signs will be posted at that entrance to notify the public that access is temporarily closed. The south entry to City Hall (near the Police Department) will remain open.

2017 CURBSIDE COLLECTION OF YARD WASTE

Yard waste will be collected from May 15 through 18 on your regular trash day. A yard waste sticker will be required on all bags, bundles and/or containers. Yard Waste Stickers can be purchased at Walgreens, ACE Hardware, Public Works Operations Facility, City Hall Treasury, Grinnell Hall, and Leisure Services Office.

- Stickers are sold 5 to a sheet for \$7.50.
- Use only paper yard waste bags, Back-to-Nature Biodegradable bags or clean trash containers 39 gallons or less (no plastic bags).
- Yard waste containers must weigh no more than 60 pounds.
- All brush and shrubbery must be bundled, tied or contained and tagged.
- Place yard waste curbside on your regular trash day during the collection dates.
- Place yard waste a few feet away from your regular trash.

In conjunction with the Rock River Trail celebration, the City has been notified that on Saturday, June 3 a group of bicyclists will be traveling from the Beloit Airport on Stateline Road to the Beloit Rotary River Center on Riverside Drive. It is anticipated that there will be approximately 30-40 bicyclists that plan to leave the Airport about 8:30 a.m. The riders will participate in the festivities and grand opening of The Rock River Trail. We are asking drivers to be alert and aware of the bicyclists. Volunteers will be stationed at key intersections to ensure safe travel. Cyclists will be going at a modest pace, since this is a "ceremonial ride" and not a race.

- Kayak (1 person): \$3 for ½ hour or \$5 per hour
- Tandem Bike: \$5 for ½ hour or \$8 per hour
- Fishing Poles: \$5 for day (during open hours)
- Included in the costs are life jackets (required) and bike helmets
- Must be at least 18 years old to rent with valid ID
- Concessions available (ice cream, drinks, candy, etc.)
- Group rates and accommodations available
