CITY MANAGER ACTIVITIES

Meetings:

FIREWORKS SAFETY

Please note that due to an abundance of illegal fireworks being used on a citywide basis and the danger that poses to public health, safety and welfare, street closure permits the weekend prior to and up to July 4th have a special condition. That is, the street closure is contingent upon no illegal fireworks possession or usage. If illegal fireworks are used or possessed at the location holding the street closure permit, any future requests for street closures at that location will be denied. CITY COUNCIL MEETING-MONDAY, JULY 3, 2017

At 6:30 p.m., the City Council will hold a <u>workshop</u> in the City Manager's Conference Room, 100 State Street, 4th Floor to review the agenda of the 7:00 p.m. City Council Meeting. The entire City Council Agenda Packet is available on the City's website (<u>click here</u>).

4. PUBLIC HEARINGS

- a. Resolution authorizing a Conditional Use Permit to allow a Multifamily dwelling in a C-1, Office District for the property located at 640 Bluff Street. The applicant has proposed the rehabilitation and reuse of the vacant, blighted, historic apartment building located at 640 Bluff Street. This building is a contributing structure in the bluff Street Historic District, constructed around 1907 and notable for its architecture. It has been vacant since May, 2015 due to major violations. The applicant's architect has submitted plans to reconfigure all of the units and to remedy the outstanding code violations. The Plan Commission voted unanimously (5-0) to recommend approval of the Conditional Use Permit.
- b. Resolution approving 2018 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Local Funding Priorities. A public hearing will be held to allow public input on the housing, homeless, and community development needs in the community. Staff has made recommendations for certain local funding priorities.

The DOT seeks to squire 0.531 acres of land from the City of Beloit for right-of-way purposes along with a Temporary Limited Easement over 0.247 acres. This is specifically related to the extension of Milwaukee Road/Hwy. 31 to the east side of I-39/90 and the reconstruction of its intersection with Gateway Blvd. This item will be referred to Plan Commission for review and recommendation.
- c. Application for Exception to Architectural Review and Landscape Code for property located at 1344 E. Grand Avenue to allow metal siding. The proposed steel siding would not be visible from East Grand Avenue and would replace old,

loose siding that has been pieced together over the years. This item will be referred to Plan Commission for review and recommendation.

Proposed Ordinance to create section 18.02 (15)(i) of the Code of General Ordinances of the City of Beloit authorizing Outdoor Vending (other than alcohol) for "Peace in the Street" event in Riverside Park planned for August 20, 2017. No alcohol will be allowed at the event and there will be no charge for the public to access music or other entertainment.

FIREWORKS SAFETY MESSAGE

Fire Chief Brad Liggett and the City of Beloit Fire Department personnel want to urge all residents celebrating Independence Day on July 4th to remain safe and away from harm – while we love to meet and greet the citizens we serve, we do not want to meet you – "by accident"!

Fire Chief Liggett reminds people to keep the 4th of July a fun time for sharing with family and friends and taking time to enjoy the beautiful fireworks the City of Beloit provides to the citizens of our community.

Several safety factors to keep in mind are:

- Never allow children to play with fireworks, they are simply too dangerous. Severe burns and/or loss of limb can occur in the blink of an eve.
- Always practice good fire safety habits when using fireworks have an adult present, have a safety zone for the firework to perform it's "show", never try to relight a firework "dud" they can quickly reignite on their own.
- Dispose of spent sparklers in a bucket full of water or sand, the metal in a sparkler will remain very hot for quite a while after their sparkle has completed, which can cause severe burns or injury. Did you know - a burning sparkler can reach 1800 degrees – hot enough to melt gold!
- Buy only legal fireworks for your area, know your local ordinance in regards to fireworks, this varies from state to state or city to city. In the City of Beloit, if it "goes up" or "blows up" it is illegal.
- NEVER throw fireworks at another human, animal or a pile of dry brush or wood pile.
- ❖ Be a good neighbor, if you know that your neighbor is a war veteran, elderly person, someone disabled lives in the home; practice being neighborly and either do not use fireworks or use them in the back yard away from their home or on the other side of your home to keep the sound down. Or, a polite phone call to give them a heads up.
- Remember, many, many people and animals are terrified of the "bang" sound made by fireworks – be polite, do not use fireworks after 10:00 at night, do not throw them at animals, people, homes, vehicles or passersby, this could result in an arrest.
- Fireworks are not a toy they are an explosive device, you never know exactly what will happen after it is lit, use a safety circle around the person lighting the display if you have one. Keep children and pets away from the immediate area.

Chief Liggett and the City of Beloit Fire Department urge everyone to get out and enjoy a family and neighborhood friendly 4th of July in Beloit – be safe – be aware – have fun!
