MEMORIAL DAY PARADE

"Memorial Day is a day for remembering and honoring military personnel who died in the service of their country, particularly those who died in battle or as a result of wounds sustained in battle." The annual Memorial Day Parade to honor and remember our Veterans will step off on Monday, May 28, 2018 at 9:00 a.m. in South Beloit and travel into Beloit, ending at Horace White Park. Our thanks to the United Veterans Memorial Day Parade Committee for their hard work in planning this memorable event.

REMINDER - NO PARKING ALONG PARADE ROUTE

The Memorial Day parade route begins in South Beloit and continues into the City of Beloit north on State Street, eastbound on East Grand Avenue until it reaches Horace White Park at the intersection of Park and East Grand Avenues. Temporary signage will be placed along the parade route to warn that vehicles could be towed if they are parked along the parade route. Vehicles that are parked along the route will be towed starting at 3 a.m. on Monday, May 28th. Parking is also prohibited in the parking stalls on Bushnell Street adjacent to Horace White Park as those stalls are reserved for buses that will be picking up band members at the end of the parade.

"CLICK IT OR TICKET" CAMPAIGN

The City of Beloit Police Department reminds motorists to "Click It or Ticket." The national seat belt campaign will take place now through June 3rd. Participating law enforcement agencies will take a no-excuses approach to seat belt law enforcement. In the City of Beloit, the maximum penalty for a seat belt violation is \$10 for adults and \$98.80 for a child restraint violation. The Wisconsin's state fine for a child restraint violation is \$175.30. Seat belts save lives, please buckle up. Attached is a press release with more information.

SHORE DRIVE WATER MAIN PROJECT BEGINS JUNE 4, 2018

Water main replacement and street reconstruction work along Shore Drive begins on June 4th. Shore Drive will be closed to through traffic during the duration of the project, which is expected to be completed by August 31, weather permitting. In addition to updating the existing water main, the project will also include road resurfacing with curbs and terraces, storm sewer placement, and the installation of a detention pond and sod restoration. No detour route will be posted, and no parking will be allowed at U.S. Pride Park during the project. Beloit Transit will temporarily remove the two blue route bus stops on Shore Drive during the project; a temporary stop will be located on Poole Court south of Carpenter Street.

MILWAUKEE ROAD PROJECT UPDATE

Jason Dupuis, Traffic Engineer, sent out updates on the Milwaukee Road project:

- Travel lanes are limited to one lane for each direction; however, the corridor is open and access to businesses remains throughout the project.
- Hydrant relocation has been completed, work on concrete pavement and joint repairs continues, removals and grading for new sidewalks has begun and work related to storm pipes and structures is on-going.

Work scheduled for the upcoming week will include:

- Storm sewer pipe work a storm sewer relay across Milwaukee Road is scheduled to begin May 29th and may
 necessitate a slight detour to the frontage road for the duration of the work. (See <u>attached</u> map.) It is anticipated the
 work will last between 2-4 days.
- Continued work related to the sidewalks.
- Continued repairs to the concrete pavement.

Drivers are urged to use caution and have patience while driving through the construction zone.

I-39/90 EXPANSION PROJECT UPDATE FROM WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

Construction work on most major highway projects throughout the state will be suspended during the three-day Memorial Day weekend to help travelers reach their destinations safely and efficiently. Construction in highway work zones, including most operations related to the I-39/90 project, stopped by noon today (May 25) and will not resume until 6 a.m. on Tuesday, May 29.

Heavy traffic volumes are anticipated throughout the holiday weekend, which may cause delays on I-39/90 between Beloit and Madison. Please plan ahead, consider alternate routes and allow extra time to safely reach your destination. For everyone's safety, please eliminate distractions and focus on the road ahead.

BELOIT POLICE PARTICIPATE IN ROCK COUNTY IMPAIRED DRIVING ENFORCEMENT TASK FORCE

During this additional enforcement, the Beloit Police Department will have more officers on patrol to discourage people from driving while impaired.

PROTECT WISCONSIN WATERWAYS

The Rock River Stormwater Group is a consortium of communities across the Rock River basin working together to keep pollutants out of local waterways. One way you can help out is by keeping grass clippings off of the street. Grass clippings can clog storm drains and put harmful nutrients into our waterways. Blow clippings back onto the grass if they do land on the street. Beloit's City Ordinance reads (in part): "No person shall place any solid waste, yard waste, liquid waste, hazardous waste, human waste, animal waste or litter upon the streets, alleys, highways, public parks or other property of the City or upon any private property not owned by him or upon the surface of any body of water within the City. In this subsection, the phrases "solid waste," "hazardous waste," and "yard" waste in any park waste receptacle except waste generated by picnic or other park activities." (Location: Ch 15.20)

Beloit Police Department Participating in "Click it or Ticket" Campaign

May 23, 2018 - As the unofficial start of summer, the Memorial Day holiday weekend is a busy time for Americans. Each year, the highways fill with families in vehicles, on their way to start their summer vacations.

To help keep drivers and passengers stay safe, the City of Beloit Police Department is reminding motorists to *Click It or Ticket*. Aimed at enforcing seat belt use to help keep families safe, the national seat belt campaign will take place now through June 3, concurrent with the busy travel season.

"Buckling up is such a simple task that can keep you and your family safe in the car," said Sgt. Matthew Donovan "But it's more than that. Buckling up is the law. Our law enforcement personnel see the consequences of not buckling up. We see the loss of life. Often, it could have been prevented with the simple click of a seat belt. This should be automatic."

"As the Memorial Day weekend approaches and the summer vacation season ramps up, we want to keep our community members safe, and make sure people are doing the one thing that can save them in a crash: buckling up," said Donovan. "If the enforcement crackdown wakes people up to the dangers of unrestrained driving, we'll consider it a success."

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, nearly half (48%) of the passenger vehicle occupants killed in crashes in 2016 were unrestrained. At night from 6 p.m. to 5:59 a.m., that number soared to 56 percent of those killed. That's why one focus of the *Click It or Ticket* campaign is nighttime enforcement. Participating law enforcement agencies will be taking a no-excuses approach to seat belt law enforcement, writing citations day and night. In City of Beloit the maximum penalty for a seat belt violation is \$10 for adults and \$98.80 for a child restraint violation. The Wisconsin's state fine for a child restraint violation is \$175.30.

"If you know a friend or a family member who does not buckle up when they drive, please ask them to consider changing their habits," said Donovan. "Help us spread this life-saving message before one more friend or family member is killed as a result of this senseless inaction. Seat belts save lives, and everyone—front seat and back, child and adult—needs to remember to buckle up—every trip, every time."


