NEW HIRE CEREMONY FOR POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Beloit Police Department will welcome two new members in a ceremony on Wednesday, August 1, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. in the City Hall Forum. The public is welcome to attend this swearing in ceremony for police officers Logan M. Lange and Zachary M. Stec.

WATER TOWER PAINTING PROJECT

Contractors will soon be working to repaint the interior and exterior of the water tower off of I-90/39. The tower near Frito Lay is a critical piece of infrastructure that was last painted in 2004 and it is due for required preventative maintenance to extend the useful lifespan of the water tower and assure proper system operation.

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources requires that the utility perform routine maintenance to ensure proper operation of the public water system and the delivery of safe drinking water. A water tower provides benefits that include maintaining system water pressure and storage for firefighting needs.

The process will include the complete draining of the tower, pre-coating inspection, abrasive blasting, finish coating and final inspection. During the process you will notice the tower completely encased in a tent-like structure. This, as well as the use of paint rollers, is to prevent fine material and overspray from settling on nearby surfaces.

The project is expected to begin on Monday, July 30, 2018 with substantial completion slated for early November, 2018. During this time, the water system will rely on its other towers, booster stations and equipment to continue the uninterrupted supply of water to customers. The freshly painted water tower will also reflect the city's updated branding to reflect the city's collective efforts in providing outstanding public service to all residents.

PRAIRIE AVENUE (COUNTY G) ROADWAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT -Public Information Meeting - August 2, 2018

The public is invited to attend a public information meeting for the upcoming Prairie Avenue (County G) roadway improvement project in the City of Beloit and Town of Beloit. The project will begin at the Cranston Road intersection and continue north approximately 1.2 miles to the Huebbe Parkway intersection.

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The meeting will be held: **Thursday, August 2, 2018** 5 to 7 p.m. (summary presentation is at 5:30 p.m.) City of Beloit Utilities and Engineering Facility 2400 Springbrook Court

Proposed roadway improvements include concrete joint repair, spot replacement of existing concrete pavement/ concrete curb and gutter, milling the existing concrete pavement, and overlaying the remaining concrete pavement with asphalt. Additional proposed roadway improvements include raised median treatments, traffic signal upgrades, multi-use path construction (west side from Cranston Road to Hart Road) and new sidewalk/onstreet bike lanes (both sides from Hart Road to Huebbe Parkway). Construction is scheduled for 2019.

The undersigned understands that this Release discharges the Municipality from any liability or claim that the undersigned may have against the Municipality with respect to any bodily injury, personal injury, illness, death, or property damage that may result from undersigned's activities with the Municipality, <u>whether caused by the undersigned or by the negligence of the Municipality or its officers, directors, employees, agents, or otherwise. In accordance with Wisconsin law, nothing in this Release should be construed as releasing, discharging or waiving any claims the undersigned may have for reckless or intentional acts on the part of the Municipality.</u>

The undersigned understands that the Municipality does not assume any responsibility for or obligation to provide financial assistance or other assistance, including but not limited to medical, health, or disability insurance in the event of injury or illness to the undersigned.
