WATER METER TRANSMITTER PROJECT

The City of Beloit Water Resources Division will be replacing outdated water meter transmitters to current technology in 2018 and 2019.

Affected homes will be notified in the utility bill being mailed this month. Immediate action is not necessary - the City of Beloit will contact the homeowner and/or occupants when we are ready to complete the replacement.

If the water meter transmitter is outside the residence, the homeowner or occupants will not need to be home. However, if the water meter transmitter is inside a residence, we will need to access the water meter transmitter while a keyholder is home

All of our water utility representatives will drive marked City of Beloit Water Utility vehicles and carry identification. If you are uncertain if someone is a member of our division, you can call us at 608-364-2888. 2019 CITY COUNCIL NOMINATION PACKETS AVAILABLE NOVEMBER 26, 2018

Candidates interested in running for a two-year Beloit City Council term may begin circulating nomination paperwork on Saturday, Dec. 1, 2018.

Informational packets with nomination papers for those interested in running for a two-year Beloit City Council term will be available in the City Clerk-Treasurer's Office starting Nov. 26, 2018, during normal business hours (8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Mondays through Fridays). The packets will also be available online at www.beloitwi.gov in the Document Center.

Things to know about the 2019 spring election:

- There are seven members on City Council and three seats will be up for election.
- The first day to circulate nomination papers is Saturday, Dec. 1, 2018.
- A minimum of 100 valid signatures of City of Beloit residents must be submitted. Staff recommends that between 100 and 200 signatures be submitted to ensure ballot access.
- Nomination papers and all forms must be completed and filed with the City Clerk-Treasurer by 5 p.m. on Wednesday, Jan. 2, 2019.
- The spring election will be held on Tuesday, April 2, 2019.
- Candidates must file required forms with the City Clerk-Treasurer before forming a committee and/or raising any funds.
- An informational session may be held in January for candidates who have gained ballot access.
- Newly-elected City Council members will take office on Tuesday, April 16, 2019.
