CURRENT EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

CITY MANAGER'S ACTIVITIES

- Met with the City's Leadership Team and led a discussion on ethics. We cannot stress enough the importance of keeping the public's trust.
- Met with various direct reports for departmental updates.
- The extremely cold weather disrupted our week and city administrative offices were closed on Wednesday and Thursday until noon after Governor Evers declared a state of emergency. Regularly scheduled police and fire employees reported to work, as did some Public Works employees. Transit service was suspended, recreation programs cancelled, and garbage/recycling pick-up was delayed by a day. As we all get back on track and look forward to warmer weather, I want to thank our employees "who kept the lights on" as well as the public for their patience and awareness of the dangers associated with the cold snap.
- Due to the extreme weather conditions this past week, Beloit Transit bus service was cancelled Wednesday through noon Thursday for the safety of the community. The extreme temperatures that we were experiencing put our transit buses at risk of having the diesel fuel gel, which could have caused damage to the buses, leaving individuals stranded along the bus route in the unsafe environment.

- b. Resolution Authorizing a Third Amendment to Equipment Location Lease with New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC for Antenna Space on the Mill Street Water Tower. New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC requested to add additional equipment to the Mill Street Water Tower. The City retained cellular tower experts to assist with the technical review of requests for changes or additions to equipment on the tower and for negotiation and review of location leases.
- c. Resolution Authorizing a Third Amendment to Equipment Location Lease with New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC for Antenna Space on the I-90 Water Tower. The City of Beloit will allow New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC to reinstall equipment (up to 12 antennas) on the water tower at 2875 Cranston Road for no increase in rent. Additional equipment will require additional rent.
- d. Referral to Plan Commission: Master Plan for Turtle Creek Park. The Master Plan is a five phase plan which includes painting the existing bathhouse (future plans include demolition of the building), construction of a park facility, a new entrance road off of St. Paul Avenue, signage, addition of new equipment, additional parking, and an art installation to commemorate the history of the park. The City's 2018-2020 Strategic Plan includes a Key Initiative to revitalize Turtle Creek Park.
- e. Referral to Plan Commission: Phase 1 Improvements in Turtle Creek Park, specifically the construction of an open-air pavilion and new parking area. Phase one of the Master Plan for Turtle Creek Park Improvements includes painting the existing bathhouse, construction of a new open air shelter, a new entrance road off St. Paul Avenue, signage along St. Paul Avenue entrance, and additional parking. Wisconsin Statutes requires Plan Commission to make a recommendation to City Council for any new structures and parking areas on public lands.

- f. Referral to Plan Commission: Application for a Zoning Map Amendment from temporary R-1A, Single Family Residential District, to permanent R-1A, Single Family Residential for the property located at 2032 E. Ridge Road. The City Council adopted an Ordinance attaching the subject property to the City of Beloit on April 2, 2018. Planning staff has initiated a permanent zoning district classification for the property. The property was annexed/attached in order to connect their existing single-family home with a failing septic system to the City's sanitary sewer. The permanent zoning request will not affect the allowable uses of the property.
- g. Consideration of Resolution 2019-010 authorizing submission of an application for the National Criminal History Improvement Program (NCHIP) Livescan Grant 2018. The Beloit Police Department desires to upgrade its outdated fingerprint capture (Livescan) equipment and purchase an additional Livescan system for juvenile processing. The upgraded equipment will allow officers to capture mug shots and palm prints, and electronically submit them to the State of Wisconsin in compliance with arrest DNA procedures. The current scanner is 10 years old and nearing the end of its expected lifespan; it is unable to take palm prints. The City of Beloit is requesting \$27,575.50 in grant funds, with a 10% cost sharing by the City of Beloit which may be fulfilled in part by personnel costs related to set-up and testing of equipment.
