#### 2020 BELOIT CITY COUNCIL NOMINATION PACKETS AVAILABLE NOVEMBER 1

Candidates interested in running for a two-year Beloit City Council term may begin circulating nomination paperwork on Sunday, Dec. 1, 2019.

Beginning Friday, Nov. 1, 2019, anyone interested in running for City Council may pick up an information packet, including nomination papers. Packets are available in the office of the City Clerk-Treasurer on the second floor of City Hall during normal business hours: Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Nomination papers and forms will also be available on the City's website <a href="https://www.beloitwi.gov">https://www.beloitwi.gov</a> in the <a href="Document Center">Document Center</a> in the City Council folder titled, "Information for City Council Candidates" starting on Nov. 1, 2019.

#### **Beloit City Council Election Info:**

- There are seven members on City Council and four seats will be on the ballot.
- The first day to circulate nomination papers is Sunday, Dec. 1, 2019.
- A minimum of 100 valid signatures of City of Beloit residents must be submitted. Staff recommends that between 100 and 200 signatures be submitted to ensure ballot access.
- Nomination papers and all forms must be completed and filed with the City Clerk-Treasurer by 5 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 7, 2020.
- The spring election will be held on Tuesday, April 7, 2020.
- Candidates must file required forms with the City Clerk before forming a committee and/or raising any funds.
- An informational session may be held in January for candidates who have gained ballot access
- Newly-elected City Council members will take office on Tuesday, April 21, 2020.

#### 2019 TRICK OR TREAT HOURS AND HALLOWEEN SAFETY REMINDERS

City of Beloit trick or treat hours have been set for 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. on Thursday, October 31, 2019. The Beloit Police Department offers the following safety reminders:

- Wear light colored clothing, short enough to prevent tripping, and add reflectors.
- Give children flashlights and glow sticks to help them see and be seen by drivers.
- Make sure costumes are flame retardant.
- Make sure children can see well through face masks or head coverings.

- Accompany your children and go only to homes with outside lights on.
- Stay within the neighborhood and only visit homes where you know the residents.
- Walk on the sidewalk. Children should not take shortcuts through backyards or alleys.
- Only give or accept wrapped or packaged candy and treats. Examine candy before allowing children to eat it.
- Watch for traffic. Cross only at corners and never dart out between parked cars.
- Drive slowly, yield to young pedestrians, and watch out for trick or treaters darting into the street.

#### City to Hold Curbside Yard Waste Collection in November

Oct. 23, 2019 - City of Beloit's Public Works Department will soon start its fall yard waste collection, including the free yard waste collection and the leaf vacuuming subscription service.

#### Free collection

The free yard waste collection will be held Nov. 4-21, 2019, on your regularly scheduled trash day.

- Included: Contained leaves, grass clippings and garden debris.
- Not included: Brush and shrubbery; leaf vacuuming.
- **How:** Use paper yard waste bags, or clean trash containers (<39 gallons and <60 pounds). Plastic bags of any type will not be collected.
- Where: Set yard waste 3 feet away from your regular trash on the curb.

"Please keep all leaves and grass clippings away from the street to keep them from going into storm drains, which can lead to clogged drains and harmful debris going into our waterways," said Tim Drager, Solid Waste and Safety Supervisor for the Operations Division. "When you are out raking or using a leaf blower, make sure you're directing the leaves away from the street."

#### **Brush & Shrubbery**

Brush and shrubbery will also be collected during Nov. 4-21, 2019, on your regularly scheduled trash day. Each bundle must include a \$1.50 sticker.

- What: All brush and shrubbery should be no larger than 4' long by 4" in diameter and bundled to 4'x2'.
- Cost: Each bundle must include a \$1.50 sticker.
- Where: Set bundles 3' away from your regular trash on the curb.
- When: November 4-21, 2019, on your regularly scheduled trash day.
- **Stickers:** Stickers can be purchased at City of Beloit Department of Public Works (address below), the City Hall Treasurer's Department, (100 State St., 8am to 5pm), Grinnell Hall (631 Bluff St., 7:30am to 4pm).

#### Leaf Vacuuming Service

Don't want the hassle of putting your leaves into containers? Blow or rake the leaves into the terrace. We will take care of the rest!

- When: November 4-22, 2019, visit <a href="www.beloitsolidwaste.com/leaf-vacuum-service">www.beloitsolidwaste.com/leaf-vacuum-service</a> for the schedule, which includes various pick-ups.
- **Cost:** (one subscription per address): \$100 for the 2019 season.

• Sign-up: Complete the subscription form (available at <a href="https://beloitsolidwaste.com/leaf-vacuum-service/">https://beloitsolidwaste.com/leaf-vacuum-service/</a>). Enclose a check or money order in the amount of \$100.00 made payable to the City of Beloit and mail or sign-up in person at City of Beloit Department of Public Works Facility (address below).

The City of Beloit is not responsible for the timeliness in which leaves fall from the trees or weather related cancellation of the Leaf Vacuum Program. No refunds will be issued on this program, no spring service will be offered.
