Yes! The City of Beloit has a flag and it is available for purchase at the Treasurer's office, 2nd floor City Hall for \$64.95 each.

The Beloit Flag was designed for the Beloit Pageant in 1916. To quote an article from the January 21, 1957 "Beloit Daily News:" "The Pageant Flag is banded bright and broad, with prairie colors of the grass and grain." The blue band signifies that "the river unifies-and not divides." The central shape suggests the flaming wheel of progress.
