

The City of Beloit is working with its partners at the city, county, state and federal levels to monitor the worldwide outbreak of the novel or new coronavirus known as COVID-19.






Park Playgrounds Closed

Construction on IL-251

IL-251 construction will begin on March 30, 2020 and is expected to be completed in October, 2020.

From Elevator Road to the Wisconsin State line, Hwy. 251 will be limited to a single lane of traffic for Northbound lanes and a single lane of traffic for Southbound lanes. This area is designated as normal daytime work; please expect delays in traffic during peak daytime hours.

From Forest Hills Road to Elevator Road, the section is designated as night-time work; both lanes will be open during daytime hours.

IL-251 will be accessible at all times. There will always be at least one lane open in each direction for traffic and there will be no full road closures taking place for this project.


