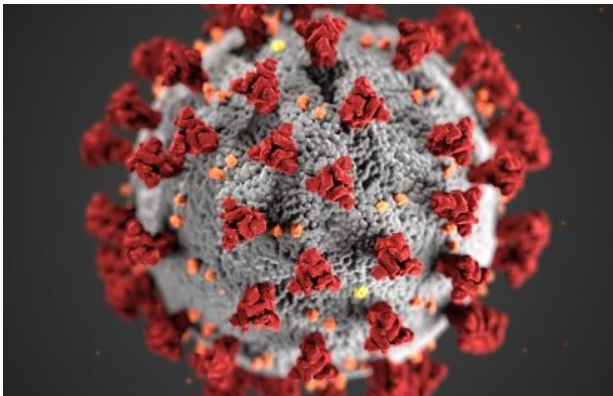
Beloit City Council Meeting - April 6, 2020

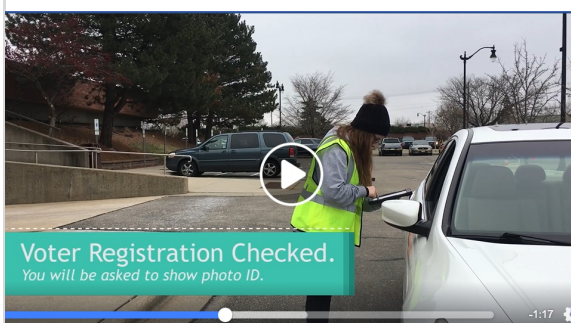

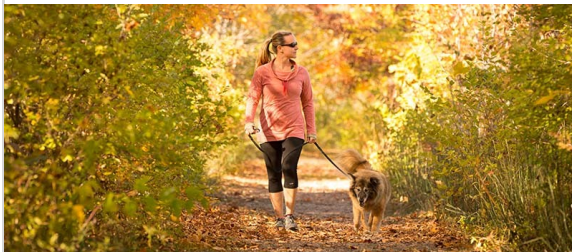
