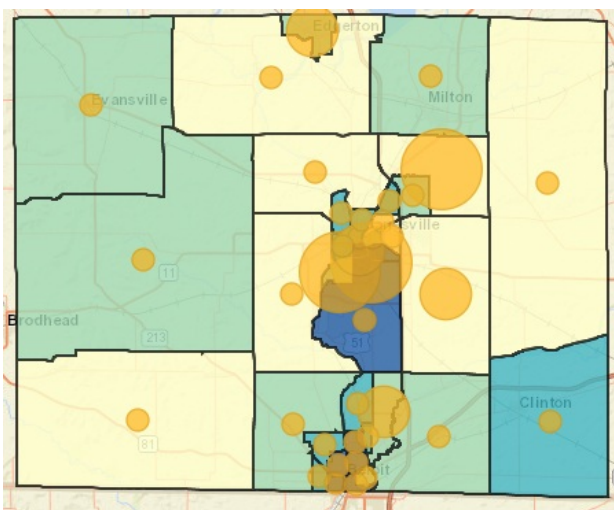
Beloit Farmers' Market Postpones Opening Date

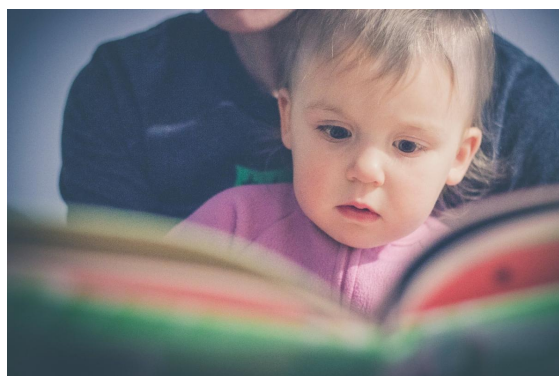


Rock County Releases Map of Confirmed COVID-19 Cases
