Extension of Social Distancing Requirements & PPE

The Beloit City Council unanimously approved a resolution on Monday, June 2, 2020 to extend the city's requirements for physical distancing and personal protective equipment in Beloit. These requirements allow the economy to reopen while protecting vulnerable residents and helping to keep the health care system from being overwhelmed.

Based on the ongoing health risks to those in our community that include fatalities and a lack of a vaccine or herd immunity, the City Council will review the restrictions at every regularly scheduled Council meeting until it is safe to remove them. It is likely that the minimum safety restrictions will be in place for a longer period of time with the recommendation for group sizes potentially being adjusted when it is safe to do so.
