Railroad Crossing Repairs & Road Closures - DELAYED

Due to emergency repairs following the storms in Iowa, Beloit's railroad crossing repairs have been delayed a few days.

Railroad crossings are the responsibility of the railroad to fix as the crossings are the property of the railroad; the City of Beloit is not allowed to fix the railroad crossings. The updated repair schedule is as follows:

- Milwaukee Road crossing: August 17 and 18. This will be a full road closure at the railroad crossing; please use Cranston Road as the detour route to Riverside Drive/Highway 51.
- Henry Avenue crossing: August 19. This is a full road closure, please use an alternate route.
- Cranston Road crossing: August 20. This will include alternate lane closures.




Beloit Transit System Proposed Route Changes

Census 2020

Starting in July, census takers will visit homes that haven't yet responded to the 2020 Census. Census takers will wear masks and follow local public health guidelines. If someone visits your home, make sure they have a valid ID badge with their photo, a US Dept. of Commerce watermark, and an expiration date. Census workers may also carry Census Bureau bags and other equipment with the Census Bureau logo.

The Beloit Public Library is now open for the use of computers. The Census questionnaire takes about 10 minutes to complete.
