How to Vote Absentee

Registered Wisconsin voters may request an absentee ballot at MyVote Wisconsin. Through that website, you can also view what's on the ballot, update your name or address, find your polling place and more.

The first wave of ballots were mailed out late this week and if you requested one, it should arrive Saturday or Monday. Residents can return their ballot via US Postal Service or by depositing it in one of the newly installed, secure drop boxes at City Hall (one on the circular drive off of State Street and one inside the main entrance to City Hall).

Voter Registration Groups Mean Citizens Should Use Caution

Community members should use caution when registering to vote in public or at public events

There may be groups or individuals who set up in the community to register voters and promote voter participation. Many of those groups, such as the League of Women Voters and NAACP, send information about their outreach to the City Clerk-Treasurer. The Clerk-Treasurer has recently heard of people in and around local gas stations offering to register voters.

The City of Beloit has no knowledge of the identity of these individuals. That said, we want to caution voters

that a voter registration contains personal and vital ID information such as your legal name, DOB, address, ID# and Expiration Date. Proof of residence often includes account numbers and other personal information. There is no law prohibiting this practice and three years ago, the legislature eliminated the requirement for Special Registration Deputies. Thus, the only thing we can offer for protection from fraud and misuse of your personal information is this message of caution.

The City Clerk-Treasurer recommends that you only register with bona fide organizations, or with your local Clerk-Treasurer's office.

You may also conveniently register to vote and request an absentee ballot, among other things, online at www.myvote.wi.gov.



City of Beloit Not Scheduling 2020 Trick or Treat Hours

After careful consideration and review of the recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control and the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, the City of Beloit will not schedule Trick or Treat hours for 2020.

The CDC and Wisconsin DHS both recommend avoiding traditional neighborhood Trick or Treat events this year due to COVID-19. The CDC has identified Trick or Treat as a higher risk activity.

Additionally, there will be no downtown Halloween events run by the Downtown Beloit Association in 2020.

City of Beloit November 3, 2020 Election Polling Locations

The City of Beloit will operate eight polling locations on Tuesday, November 3, 2020. Ward 16, which typically votes at First Congregational Church, will vote at Todd Elementary School with wards 17 & 18.

Due to an unprecedented number of absentee ballots that will need to be processed on Election Day, the

City needs additional equipment for the Municipal Board of Absentee Canvassers at City Hall. Due to COVID-19, the City of Beloit could also be facing a staffing shortage. The consolidation of the polling location was completed for those two reasons.
