Beloit City Council Ends Social Distancing, City-Wide Face Covering Requirements

Residents urged to continue following CDC's guidance, receive COVID-19 vaccine.

May 17, 2021 - The Beloit City Council has removed its social distancing and face covering requirements based on updated guidance from the Centers for Disease Control.

The CDC recent stated that fully vaccinated individuals no longer need to wear face coverings while in public spaces. The City of Beloit is following the recommendations of the CDC and is removing the requirement.

Individuals are highly encouraged to receive the COVID-19 vaccine to protect themselves and others around them. Individuals who have not yet been vaccinated are highly encouraged to follow CDC and Rock County Public Health guidance and requirements.

While the City of Beloit no longer has a citywide requirement in public spaces, at this time face coverings are still required inside city-owned facilities. Face coverings may be required at other city-sponsored activities. We will communicate any changes to city facilities to the Beloit community when those changes are implemented.

Private businesses may also impose face covering requirements.

We have made significant progress throughout this pandemic, and will continue to work hard to provide vaccines to underserved neighborhoods and provide a safe and healthy environment for employees and city residents.
