Lane Closures

There will be some lane closures at Park Avenue and East Grand Avenue for utility work from July 15 - 23. The streets will remain open for traffic. Please pay attention and watch for workers while you are in the area.

Traffic Alert - I-39/90 and I-43

From the Wisconsin DOT:

- Sections of I-39/90 and I-43 near the Beloit interchange will be CLOSED and detoured:
 - 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday night (July 19)
 - Follow the signed detour routes during the overnight closures. Crews will set the remaining steel girders for the I-43 southbound



flyover ramp to I-39/90 southbound.

- Short-Term Ramp Closure:
 - The I-43/WIS 81 ramp to I-39/90 northbound will be CLOSED starting Sunday night (July 18) until early August.
 - Drivers must use alternate routes, such as I-43 to Hart Road then Shopiere Road to the northbound Interstate.
 - Crews will pave concrete connections for the new configuration of WIS 81 through the Diverging Diamond Interchange.
