UPDATE

Over the past week, our detectives gathered significant evidence, which has led to the arrest of a 15-year-old juvenile on Monday, September 13 at Beloit Memorial High School, for first-degree intentional homicide and possession of a dangerous weapon by a person under 18.

Because the suspect is a juvenile, we are not naming the suspect at this time. The Rock County District Attorney's Office will make the decision whether or not to seek a waiver to prosecute the juvenile in adult court.

Upon arresting the suspect, Beloit Police located a firearm in the suspect's possession. The School District of Beloit is fully cooperating with our department in regard to this investigation.

"It is evident when we work together; we are able to foster a community of trust and unity," said Chief Andre Sayles. "It is because of the dedicated men and women within our department and our courageous community members working together as one we are able to hold individuals accountable to help seek closure for these senseless acts of violence.

"I encourage those who have valuable information related to other unsolved homicides and critical incidents to come forward to assist us in holding others accountable for their actions and taking back our streets.

"The City of Beloit Police Department offers its condolences to those affected by these senseless acts of violence."

UPDATE

The Rock County Medical Examiner's Office completed the autopsy of the 19-year-old homicide victim on Tuesday. An official time of death is not yet available and could take several weeks. However, our preliminary investigation shows that the victim was likely shot Friday evening.

Beloit police officers responded to a report of shots fired near Bluff Street and Portland Avenue around 9:30 p.m. Friday, September 3. Officers completed a neighborhood survey and recovered shell casings. During the neighborhood survey, it was reported the individuals involved in this incident fled on foot heading west towards Vine. However, there was no blood evidence found in the neighborhood canvassing and no reports of an individual being shot at that time.

After reviewing hours of body camera footage and evidence, Chief Sayles has determined that the victim's body was not visible that evening due to its location and the time of day. We are sharing this information with the community to maintain transparency.

Our detectives are diligently investigating this homicide and pursuing leads so that we can bring the individual(s) responsible for violent crime to justice. On Sunday, September 5, 2021, at approximately 7:53 a.m., officers were dispatched to the 300 block of Portland in the City of Beloit for a man down.

Upon arrival, officers located a male victim lying between two houses. Officers determined the male to be deceased and contacted the medical examiner. Beloit Police Department Detectives are actively investigating this death as a homicide with evidence showing the individual was shot by gunfire.

Our investigation has led us to identify the victim as 19-year-old male with ties to Beloit. We are not identifying the victim.

We send our sincerest condolences to the victim's loved ones.
