## Minor Changes Proposed to Fixed Route Transit Service

## Riverside Park Lagoon Treatment Plan

City of Beloit staff will be treating the Riverside Park lagoon to control an invasive aquatic plant called Eurasian Watermilfoil. The treatment plan will utilize an aquatic herbicide approved by the DNR and applied by a State licensed contractor. The rates of herbicide that will be used for the application will pose no danger to fish, wildlife, pets, or humans. The proposed treatment will occur between September 13 and October 1, 2021.
